Pastor's Desk

The Arrival of the Wise Men

Every year we celebrate the feast of the Epiphany signifying the arrival of the three Wise Men. Of the four canonical gospels, Mathew gives us the vivid description of their arrival by following the star rise in the East to the place Jesus was born. How many were they? From where did they come? All that we know is that they offered three gifts and so by tradition it is believed they could have been three. They travelled the parts of the desert in their caravans for safety reasons and seeing an unusual star came in search of baby Jesus who was born in Bethlehem.

The text specifies no interval between the birth and the visit, and artistic depictions and the closeness of the traditional dates of December 25 and January 6 encourage the popular assumption that the visit took place the same winter as the birth, but later traditions varied, with the visit taken up to two winters later. This maximum interval explained Herod's command in Mt 2:16-18 that the Massacre of the Innocents included boys up to two years old. More recent commentators, not tied to the traditional feast days, may suggest a variety of intervals. The wise men are mentioned twice shortly thereafter in verse 16, in reference to their avoidance of Herod after seeing Jesus, and what Herod had learned from their earlier meeting. The star which they followed has traditionally become known as the Star of Bethlehem.

The Epiphany Concert

In early January, the St. Isaac Jogues Music Ministry presents a concert to cap off the Christmas season. A reception follows immediately after. The 2018 Epiphany Concert is scheduled for Sunday, January 7th, at 3:00 pm in the Church. Your participation in the event promotes a culture of recognition of the young & the old artist alike, who have an opportunity to display their talents. Many such ministries are offered in the parish. Such opportunities help people to display their God given talent. When efforts are made to gain mastery over the concert, the people involved in it can be discouraged not to find sufficient people to enjoy the hard labor they have put in. We hope you will make it a point to be there to show you support for our musicians.

To conclude, I want you to know that I will be away on vacation from this weekend, visiting my loved ones at home. I know you might be looking for me but rest assured, I leave you in safe hands under the care of my Staff & Associate Pastor. They will take care of the Parish and your spiritual needs till I return. Let us hope for the best in the New Year 2018 and with God's blessings, we will be able to achieve our goals.

In preparing for a Parish Pledge Campaign in 2018, we reviewed and discussed the situation with "too many envelopes." You will notice throughout the year, that several changes were made for 2018. The Archdiocese has eliminated 3 collections. The Parish has removed 6 - Flower Collections, Heat & Fuel, Air Conditioning, Snow plowing and Lawn Service. We hope the elimination of specific envelopes will allow YOU time to consider how to best serve YOUR parish. The expenses are not going away, and we must continue to meet our financial obligations when due. Your help is needed to complete the major projects still on the horizon. The month of December was very busy for your SIJ Outreach Ministry team

We helped **18 families** with the following assistance:

- 10 bags of groceries
- A \$24.42 electric bill payment - avoiding disconnection
- 3 nights in a hotel for a man and his son while they were waiting for temporary housing
- \$440 in Walmart & Aldi cards to provide meat, dairy and other items we do not stock, along with medication and bus passes for those in need
- \$40 in gas cards for some clients who are living in their cars

In collaboration with the Morton Grove Fire Department, we also helped to distribute food bags and Christmas gifts to an additional **13 families**.

Many also joined in providing music, smiles and the gift of time to residents of Niles & Glenbridge Nursing Homes.

We can't do all of this work without YOU! Your heartwarming generosity keeps us going. Please continue to keep SIJ Outreach Ministry in your prayers in 2018. If you have any questions or would like to lend a hand please contact Alex Gairabetoff.

Parishioners are invited to decorate the altar with flowers in honor or memory of a loved one.


There can be two arrangements each week until Ash Wednesday and again after Easter until Thanksgiving. Your name and intention is listed in the Bulletin.
