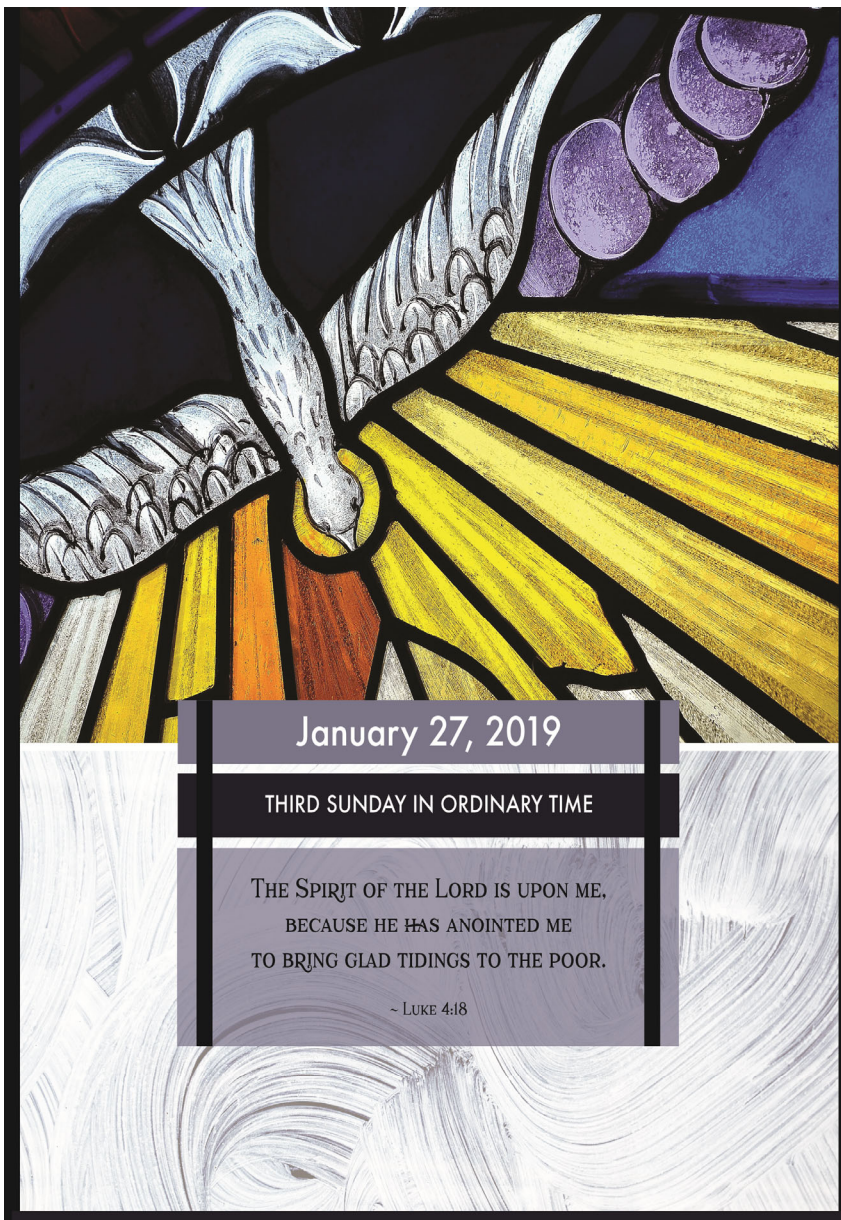

FROM THE
Pastor's Desk

He has anointed me to bring....
Glad tidings to the poor

This Scripture text from the gospel of Luke reminds me of my younger days as a priest; how the eyes of everyone would be focused on me as to what reflection I would come up with after the readings were proclaimed at mass. Similarly, has been the story of Jesus' early ministry on a Sabbath in his hometown synagogue. Jesus, as he was growing up in his younger days was familiar with going to the synagogue. Now when he comes to his hometown as a Rabbi, he proclaimed a familiar reading from Isaiah and stated that it has been fulfilled in your hearing.

We come across two different types of responses from people's reaction after hearing Jesus say, it has been fulfilled in your hearing. The first reaction being that the eyes of everyone in the synagogue looked intently at him. The second reaction being one of incredulity and as a result of it, their incredulity turned into hostility and fury.

Every one of us was anointed at our baptism like Jesus as Priest, Prophet and King. All of us in our baptism share in the priesthood of Jesus. That means when we come to the Eucharist, it isn't the priest who is offering the Mass, it's all of us together. As Bishop Barron would say *"If baptized priests stop praying, stop going to Mass, stop frequenting the sacraments, they will become, in short order, like salt that has lost its savor."* As we have been created in God's image and likeness, it is customary that we maintain the harmony between our creator and self by taking part in prayer, Sacraments and Mass. Similarly, as baptized Prophets, Bishop Barron would say, if we stop studying and stop speaking, then we are like lamps over which a bushel basket has been placed and also baptized kings who refuse to reign are like a hilltop city covered in clouds.

Jesus came to proclaim the good news to the poor; to set people free, and recover sight to the blind. This is the mission now of every baptized Catholic. That is why it is very imperative that when we come for mass we read in advance the scripture text so that together we offer the Eucharist as a community and by being part of it through hymns & prayers. Besides, we need to carry out the priestly duties. But, what are these duties going to be? Prophet Micah said when someone asked him, *"What am I supposed to offer?"* Micah said, *"It's been explained to you very clearly what you're offering is when you come before God: To act justly, to love tenderly, to walk humbly with the Lord, your God."*

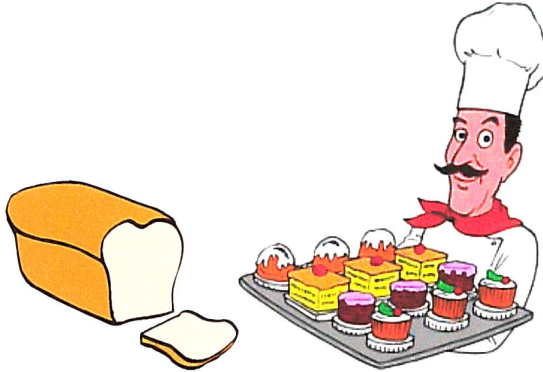


That's Entertainment!

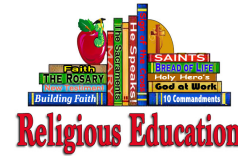


ALTAR FLOWERS CAN BE A BEAUTIFUL TRIBUTE


