
Sacrament of Reconciliation:

FROM THE
Associate Pastor's Desk

Presentation of the Lord

The Feast celebrates the Presentation of baby Jesus in the Temple in Jerusalem in obedience of the Mosaic Law. The Mosaic law after the redemption in Egypt notes that every first-born male belongs to God and must be dedicated to Him (Exodus 13.2). This ritual takes place forty days after the birth of the child. Among first century Jews the ritual was both for the purification of the mother and the dedication of the child. Our celebration emphasizes almost entirely the Presentation of Jesus. This feast also officially marks the end of the Christmas season. There is also on this day (suggested in the ritual for the Mass) the blessing of, and procession with candles. Therefore, the feast is called Candlemas too. The candles mark our belief that Christ is the light of the Nations. I hope we will light not just physical candles today but that our lives will also make the light of Jesus shine in our world.

One lesson this feast demonstrates is the example of the obedience of the Law by Mary and Joseph. They could have said Jesus is the Son of God, hence there is no need to observe this injunction. Moreover, there is no explicit vision by an angel instructing them to do so. Later in life, Jesus will grow up to be obedient to the Will of God even in the most difficult circumstances. This means that we who are older should always strive to set better examples for whoever is coming behind us. The difference between a good and a struggling child sometimes can be as simple as a good example. The fact that Mary and Jesus brought Jesus to the Temple also tasks parents and guardians that they should take religious education of their children seriously. We take children to many exciting places in life, they should never be deprived of the experience of the church. Every child born to a Christian parent has a right to be brought to the Church. It is true that nowadays many school games are scheduled for a Sunday, and it could be difficult but again nothing is ever easy. If we want to bring them to Church, we can always find a way.

The other lesson of this feast is that the Holy Family lived within their means in the Presentation of Jesus in the Temple. The Law in Leviticus says "These are the regulations for the woman who gives birth to a boy or a girl. But if she cannot afford a lamb, she is to bring two doves or two young pigeons, one for a burnt offering and the other for a sin offering." (Leviticus 12) Since Mary and Joseph are not able to afford a lamb, they offered the alternative which is within their means. There is no shame in living within your means in life. Children should not force their parents to borrow just to give them what they want. Also, parents should not borrow beyond what they can afford. Families should not rack up credit cards just to appear trendy or up to date. Whoever goes borrowing goes sorrowing as the saying goes.

Finally, today is also the Day of Consecrated Life to celebrate all religious who dedicate their lives to the Lord day and night like Simeon and Anna. May God bless all the good work that they do.

A CHRISTMAS REPRISE

The Church's celebration three weeks ago of the Baptism of the Lord signaled the "official" end of the Christmas season. Today's feast of the Presentation of the Lord seems to extend the Incarnation celebration a bit longer. In fact, some have called this feast a "second Epiphany."

The first reading recalls the anticipation of Advent, as Malachi writes, "Lo, I am sending my messenger to prepare the way before me." The reading from Hebrews reminds us of the Incarnation, proclaiming that Jesus had a "share" in our own "blood and flesh." The Gospel finds the infant Jesus on his first visit to Jerusalem and his human parents once again surprised and in awe over the events surround his birth.

In the simplicity of the manger, in the grandeur of the temple, in the domesticity of Nazareth, Jesus comes. May we come to know him and so be filled with "wisdom" and the "favor of God."

What is “Evangelization”


We hear the word. We all talk about evangelization, but exactly what is it and how do we do it? What does it mean? Following is a definition from the Archdiocese of Chicago website.

A parish with a culture of evangelization is a place where people feel a deep sense of welcome and belonging and are accompanied on their faith journey. The parish has in place resources that help a person encounter Jesus Christ, deepen their relationship with him, and are challenged to grow into well-formed Missionary Disciples. It is a community of deep prayer, where relationships are forged. And the community sends its Missionary Disciples outward to make a lasting impact in the greater community in which they live and work. They return to be nourished, challenged, and formed through the Sacraments. Many people interpret evangelization in different ways. We have come to define evangelization in this way:

Evangelization is a journey, a process. It is the sharing of one's experience of how Jesus transformed his/her life and giving witness to the Gospel — who Jesus was, what he did for us, and who he is in our lives today — to help a person come to their own encounter with Jesus. We evangelize by sharing our story as a witness to the Gospel and by the way in which we live our lives.

This is also a key factor to a culture of evangelization – people sharing their faith stories with one another. They share the good news of where God is working in their daily lives so that others can see how God is working in theirs. By creating an environment where people can easily share their faith with one another, this practice becomes natural in all areas of their life, evangelizing through their sharing.


