Pastor's Desk

Are you the salt of the Earth?

We Christians are called to be the salt of the earth. It may be an odd analogy, but Jesus compared believers to salt for a reason. Salt is a dietary mineral, used for flavoring and preservation, needed by all known living creatures. If abused, it can be harmful. However, it is also detrimental to have no salt intake because it regulates the water content in our bodies. Jesus used salt to describe how Christians are needed to bring balance and hope to an otherwise dying world. For a time, the Roman Empire gave its soldiers a ration of salt but eventually replaced it with a fixed sum of money for purchasing salt. This is where the word *salary* comes from (Latin for "salt money").

We know when salt comes in contact with the surface of food, the salt molecules try to achieve a balance between the number of salt molecules inside and outside the food. It does this by drawing water molecules out of the food and inserting salt molecules into the food through osmosis across semipermeable cell membranes. As a result, the number of free water molecules is reduced to a point where most bacteria cannot survive and most enzymes cannot operate because, basically, they get dehydrated.

We can be like salt to others when we work to bring about the best in others. Aging Cuban musicians whose talents had been virtually forgotten following Castro's takeover of Cuba, have been brought out of retirement by Ry Cooder. He travelled to Havana in order to bring the musicians together, resulting in triumphant performances of extraordinary music, and resurrecting the musicians' careers.

We have witnessed some of the major events of our recent history, international conflicts, starvation and exodus. Today more than 100 years later, diseases like typhoid fever and cholera have been virtually eliminated in developed countries thanks in large measure to the widespread chlorination of drinking water. Chlorine is one of the most abundant chemical elements literally obtained from the salt of the earth by a process of applying electrical energy to the sea salt.

In 2014, the deadly Ebola virus spread throughout West Africa country's borders in Sierra Leone. For countries impacted by Ebola, like Sierra Leone, bleach isn't something you necessarily find stocked in hospitals. It was because of the America Chemistry Council's Chlorine Chemistry Division and one of its members, Olin Corporation, and World vision who turned to its army of supporters to raise half a million dollars to charter a flight of supplies, including the bleach, to Sierra Leone. After proper dilution, nearly 500,000 gallons of bleach solution were made available to hospitals and other care facilities throughout Sierra Leone which saved the life of many.

The question asked however is, "What good is salt if it has lost its flavor?" In other words, if a Christian has lost his or her gusto and fervor, then what's the difference between the old grain of sand they once were and the so-called salt they are now? The answer is: very little. I have learned I can't always control the trials I face, but I am the keeper of my "salt." Will I be *bitter* or *better*? Less seasoned or more flavorful? Will I disappear into the background or stand out as an overcomer? Because in the end, what good am I if I've lost my flavoring?



It included a review of the survey parishioners completed last Easter and a discussion on the 7 Signs of Mission Vitality in a parish.
- Final parish groupings will be finalized and announced at the end of January.
- Reflection and discussion on the movie 'Silence' with Cardinal Cupich on Jan. 15 at the Music Box theater; more sessions to come throughout the archdiocese.

The **St. Joseph Table** is an old tradition from Sicily. Many centuries ago there was a famine and the people prayed to St. Joseph, their patron, and asked his intercession. Rains came, the famine ended and a special feast to thank and praise God and to honor St. Joseph was prepared. All were welcome to come and enjoy especially the sick and homeless.

Though Sicilian immigrants introduced the custom to America, the celebration and feast are open to all. The St. Joseph Table is a source of petition and thanksgiving. The foods presented on the Table are acquired through begging, asking the help of people and local businesses to represent what the poor of Sicily had to do. Traditional foods for the Table include pasta with marinara or sauce with sardines, frittatas (egg dishes), fish, roasted or fried vegetables and Italian sweets.

Everyone is invited to our parish St. Joseph Table on Sunday, March 19th, the Feast of St. Joseph. It will begin with the Noon Mass. The blessing of the Table and serving of food will follow and continue until 4 p.m. in the Holy Family Room. Per the tradition there is no charge to eat at the table but donations will be gratefully accepted. Be sure to bring your family, friends and neighbors for this wonderful event!



