

## RENEW MY CHURCH Remember the survey last year?



Launched by Cardinal Cupich, the goal was to gain a better understanding of the perspectives of Catholics in the Archdiocese and come to know what is important to them. He also wanted their input as to what we were doing well and what their challenges are today.

### Archdiocesan Overview:

- 35,000 responses received, 2/3 from women
- Older age groups were represented. Only 11% of the respondents were under age 35.
- 58% were born in the Chicagoland area
- The majority of respondents (63% went to Catholic elementary school, 50% to Catholic high school) were Catholic-school educated. This supports the connection between Catholic education and attachment to parish life.
- Respondents were mostly long-time members of their parishes
  - 43% were 20+ years parishioners
  - 24% were 10-19 year parishioners
- 93% of respondents were raised Catholic

### What are we looking for?

- Inspirational leadership of the pastor
- A feeling of warmth and welcoming
- Engaging homilies
- Location and long term ties often drive parish choice
- Many parishioners now travel to go their parish of choice. Approximately a third of respondents attend parishes not closest to where they live.

### How do we feel about the Catholic Church, their parish and their personal journey?

- 84% very much agree that the parish inspires them to be better Catholics and to share Christ with others
- 74% said their parish is a role model others could learn from
- 83% would recommend their parish to others

### When asked about “vibrancy”

- 46% felt their parishes were thriving and continue to grow
- 21% felt their parish was on the right track, but not quite “vibrant”
- 23% responded that their parish is facing challenges
- Over half of the respondents agree that the Archdiocese is facing challenges, but only 20-30% see those challenges at their individual parishes

### Define “challenge”

- Engage youth
- Provide a means to help people address faith questions
- Sound financial management
- Help people develop a personal relationship with Christ

St. Isaac Jogues results were similar to the Archdiocesan results overall. 61 responses were received. 71% were over age 55. 77% married or widowed. 62% attended Catholic elementary school and 41% attended Catholic high school. 76% have been parishioners for more than 10 years. 83% attend Mass every week. 93% were raised Catholic. Some said they “would not recommend their parish to others. Some said we could be more welcoming and create a stronger sense of community. 65% were “worried about finances and 60% are concerned about church facilities.” Over the next weeks and months, we ask for your help.



### ***OUR LENTEN JOURNEY: BECOMING INSTRUMENTS OF PEACE***

St. Isaac Jogues and St. Martha of Bethany Parishes invite you to our joint Lenten Mission Sunday – Tuesday, March 5 – 7, 7:00-8:30 p.m. at St. Martha Church on Georgiana Avenue in Morton Grove. Hospitality will follow each session.

Friar Johnpaul Cafiero, OFM, our Mission Presenter, will lead us in reflections on the popular and well-loved Peace Prayer. His storytelling and humor will bring to life the message of Jesus' words to us, his disciples, in the context of Evening Prayer. On Sunday, Mar. 5 he will focus on the first part of the Peace Prayer and the Beatitudes; Monday, Mar. 6 – "O Divine Master" and the Holy Trinity; and on Tuesday, March 7 he will consider the rest of the Peace Prayer and how God's Ways Are Not Our Ways. Each evening there will be a collection taken up for the Franciscan Ministries (soup kitchen, scholarships, shelters, etc.). Come, bring family members or friends (Gr. 5 through senior citizens) for an enjoyable and faith strengthening experience they will not soon forget!



Friar Johnpaul is a Franciscan priest of the Sacred Heart Province of Chicago/St. Louis. He was born and raised in the New York Metro area and is the oldest of an Italian/Polish Catholic family. He is a former police officer and has worked as a counselor and therapist and has many speaking and preaching engagements. Friar Johnpaul is Pastoral Associate and preacher at Holy Family Church in Inverness and serves as chaplain for the Illinois State Police. He was so well received at St. Martha's Lent Mission last year that parishioners asked Fr. Dennis to invite him to return!

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

It is with some urgency that I write to you today, about a bill in our Illinois legislature, HB 40. The bill in question, if passed, would use tax dollars to pay for taking the life of a child in the womb through an abortion. There are strong indications that HB 40 could be enacted into law if we fail to act.

In addition to mandating state funding of abortion through the Medicaid program, HB 40 also calls for abortion coverage in state employees' health care plans. It also allows for the use of tax dollars to fund grants to organizations that refer, counsel for and perform abortions, e.g., Planned Parenthood. All of these state-funded mandates are currently prohibited by Illinois law.

We have raised our voices in the past for those who have no voice, whether they be the immigrant or the refugee, the poor, or the unemployed. We now need to speak for the children in the womb, who are the weakest among us.

We need to let our elected officials know that taxpayers should not be forced to fund the taking of human life. In fact, tax money should be used to fund prenatal services for the poor and child care for working mothers, as well as expand health-care options for those in need. Please join me in advocating for all life by urging your state representative to reject HB 40 and work instead to pass a budget that funds all essential services.

The Season of Lent begins soon. Lent is a word that means "springtime," the time of new life. Let us make this Lent a celebration of life by protecting the new life and hope the birth of a child brings to the world.
