Reflections from Fr. Dennis

Dear Friends and Fellow Parishioners:

Imagine going to a foreign country, not knowing the language or anyone there. You have no translator or map and know little about that culture or its laws. That very thing happened to me one day when I found myself on a side street in Vienna, with no knowledge of German, no map, and no sense of direction. How lost, confused, and frightened you would be! Then you meet someone from your home country, someone who has lived here for many years and learned the language, customs, and geography. How happy you would be!

Now you have someone to guide you because they have already been in your position, but have learned how to get around there. Naturally, their experience and insight will prove your greatest aid and instruction. Christian leaders must first encounter Jesus in this same way. He knows the way, and we must spend time learning from him. We must be transformed by walking beside him. Only then can we begin to bring others to him.

"Can a blind person guide a blind person?" If knowing the best way to live were possible on one's own, wouldn't that be grand? Yet all we need to do is to look at the state of the world to know things aren't so simple. Discord and dissension surround us. People often project their own feelings and distorted perceptions onto the world. They refuse to consider that they may lack wisdom and understanding. Many are tempted to believe the problem is with everyone else, before ever admitting their own shortcomings. With so many varying voices and opinions in conflict with one another, it is difficult to know who is trustworthy.

You know them by their fruit. "Every tree is known by its own fruit" (Matthew 7:20) When discerning whom to trust for living according to God's will, results matter. Jesus came to free us from the chains that bind us. He came to instruct us in the ways of mercy and wisdom. If mercy and wisdom are not seen, and no freedom from sin has been shown, these facts indicate what kind of tree you have. Look for people that have been transformed by God's healing grace.

The problem is hypocrisy. "How can you say to your brother, 'Brother, let me remove that splinter from your eye,' when you do not even notice the wooden beam in your own eye?" (Matthew 7:3) There is an inherent dilemma in Christian discipleship. No one of us is perfect as a follower of Christ. So how can we reprove anyone else when we ourselves fall short? Christ remains the headstone of the Church, its Master and Teacher. Before leading others, we must first be led by Christ. Listening to Jesus, experiencing his mercy, following his chastisements – all these enable us to learn and grow. Then and only then can we lead others – to Jesus, not to ourselves.

"No disciple is superior to the teacher; but when fully trained, every disciple will be like his teacher." (Matthew 10:24-25) We come to be more like Jesus as we follow Him. The path of Christian discipleship is like a chain of people linked together, being tugged on by Christ at the head.

Today, in the streets of Rio and New Orleans and in the canals of Venice, Carnival reaches its height. 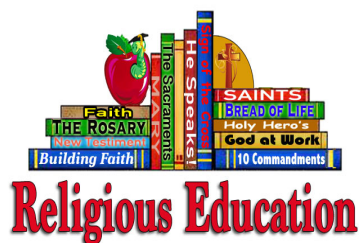

Sts. Martha – Isaac Jogues Parish Spiritual Life Commission invites all parishioners, family members, friends, and neighbors for the **2022 Lent Mission "Our Church on Mission: Our Identity and Our Future"** led by Fr. Paul Adaja and hosted at St. Isaac Jogues Church, 8101 West Golf Road in Niles. We hope you will come for a Lent mission we hope will help shape the weeks of Lent for all of us.

Fr. Paul will introduce the Lent Mission when he gives the homily in person at next Saturday's evening Masses at both St. Martha and St. Isaac Jogues Churches and via cd for the morning Masses next Sunday, Mar. 6. Father Paul was born and raised in Southwest Nigeria and ordained in July, 2009. He came to the United States in 2013 for further studies at Loyola University, where he now teaches. He received his doctorate in Theology in 2021. Father Paul also serves as a resident priest at Sts. Peter – Lambert in Skokie.



"This mission is a journey of how we can enrich our spiritual life drawing from the treasures of the Church's identity and mission. The Catholic today has challenges that reflect a world that wants to engage less with God. How do we relate with this world and at the same time maintain our identity without compromising our age-old values? How can we draw strength from the universal nature of our Faith to heal the division in our world? How can the Church's identity still be realized in a world in which the body of Christ now realizes itself in several forms rather than physical structures? These are some of the questions we shall explore together to prepare ourselves for the celebration of the Paschal Mystery in a way that appreciates our identity as Church and faithful Catholics."

Exposition and Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament will take place one hour before the Mission talk for those who want to come before the Lord to listen, to pray, to reflect. At the end of the sessions we will have Benediction (Sun. and Mon. done about 8 p.m.) or Mass (Tues. done about 8:30 p.m.). A free-will offering will be taken up at each session. The schedule of days is as follows:

Sunday, Mar. 6 – 3:00 p.m. Exposition and Adoration / 4:00 p.m. *The Identity and Marks of the Church*

Monday, Mar. 7 – 6:00 p.m. Exposition and Adoration / 7:00 p.m. *The Challenges to the Identity and Marks of the Church*

Tuesday, Mar. 8 – 6:00 p.m. Exposition and Adoration / 7:00 p.m. *Realizing a Thriving Future for the Church*

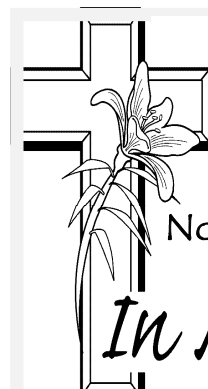
TODAY'S READINGS
