Pastor's Desk

Return to your God

"Return to your God." These words resound in our ears especially during the season of Lent. When you realize that you have taken a wrong path, you make every effort to set it right. Similarly, we are reminded to forsake the thoughts, attitudes, and actions that have drawn our attention away wholeheartedly from the love of God. Receive God's forgiveness, and renew your commitment to make every effort to be in right relationship with God.

Nothing happens without the effort on your part or without grace on God's part. Therefore worship, prayer, Bible study, giving, fasting, and service to others are activities designed to deepen your intimate relationship with God. One of the ways that we bring glory to God and cultivate our love for Him is by worshiping Him. One thing I desired was to dwell in the house of the Lord all the days of my life and to behold his beauty (Psalm 27:4). Giving of myself to God freely enriched my life. Giving a tithe (ten percent of your income) or more is not simply a way to financially support the Church—it is **a regular reminder that all you have belongs to God.** (See I Timothy 6:17–19.)

Here is the first step in returning to God: accepting personal responsibility for departing from him. Usually when we stumble and we have fallen on our faces, humiliated and unable to move or do anything -- -it is not natural for us to say, "It's my fault." Our tendency is to blame other people or circumstances for tripping us. We end up rationalizing what God calls iniquity. But he wants us to acknowledge it, to agree with him. "You have stumbled because of your iniquity." The word iniquity means habit patterns of sin that get ingrained into someone's life and that may go on for years and years.

We all know what it's like to sense a growing distance between us and the Lord because of sin. Prayer becomes strained, life becomes increasingly stressful, and our hearts become restless. The danger is that we will get comfortable with that state. We will settle for a spiritual mediocrity. We will feel the emptiness, but seek to forget it by filling our lives with the distractions of activity -- - even religious activity. Then finally life crumbles or a crisis strikes, and we are brought face-to-face with the person we have become. We stumble and fall because we have wandered away from a trusting relationship with God.

Even the worst of sinners changed their life pattern like the Samaritan woman at the well. What brought about a transformation in her life was her acceptance of the fact that she was living a life of sin. When she decided to return to the Lord and as the Lord went in search of her, God searches for us and waits for us to return to Him too. God extends His invitation so that we may turn to him. Acceptance paves the way to return to God.

There are several opportunities to "return to the Lord" this Lent including Soup Suppers and St. Joseph Table. All are wonderful opportunities to take a moment and thank God for our blessings and share our time in community and service with others. Join us Sunday afternoon for St. Joseph Table and take time to "return to our Lord."

So are you prepared to return to your God..? God awaits your response. What is it?

He assists on weekends at St. Patrick Parish in Wadsworth and has given many retreats and spoken at many adult formation events.

YOUR DONATIONS HAVE HELPED SO MANY PEOPLE!

Several homeless and unemployed, sleeping in shelters at night, but with nowhere to go during the day, have come to St. Isaac Jogues for food. We have been graced with the opportunity to help a young, single mom with triplets who just lost her job, another mom and her young son who is the caregiver for her older sister and brother, both of whom have suffered heart attack and stroke. We have helped several disabled people suffering with cancer. Some, just like many of us, living on limited incomes, need help with a utility bill or medication. We have provided temporary shelter for 2 families suffering domestic abuse. **They all have faces and names. They all have stories. They all need our help.**

Over the past few months some of the assistance we have provided:

- 60 bags of food
- Walmart cards for perishable items including milk, cheese & meat
- Cell phone minute reloads so people can continue to hunt for jobs and maintain contact with doctors and families
- Funds for medication
- Water, gas and electricity bill assistance

April 20th, we will be providing and serving meals to 100 men, women and children at Catholic Charities in Des Plaines and we are currently preparing for our annual Easter Food baskets for 17 of our neediest! If you are interested in helping us - please call the rectory. Everyone is welcome.

During this Lent, we **THANK YOU** for your generosity. Without **YOUR** donations of food and funding, none of this could happen. We know the people we assist are grateful.
