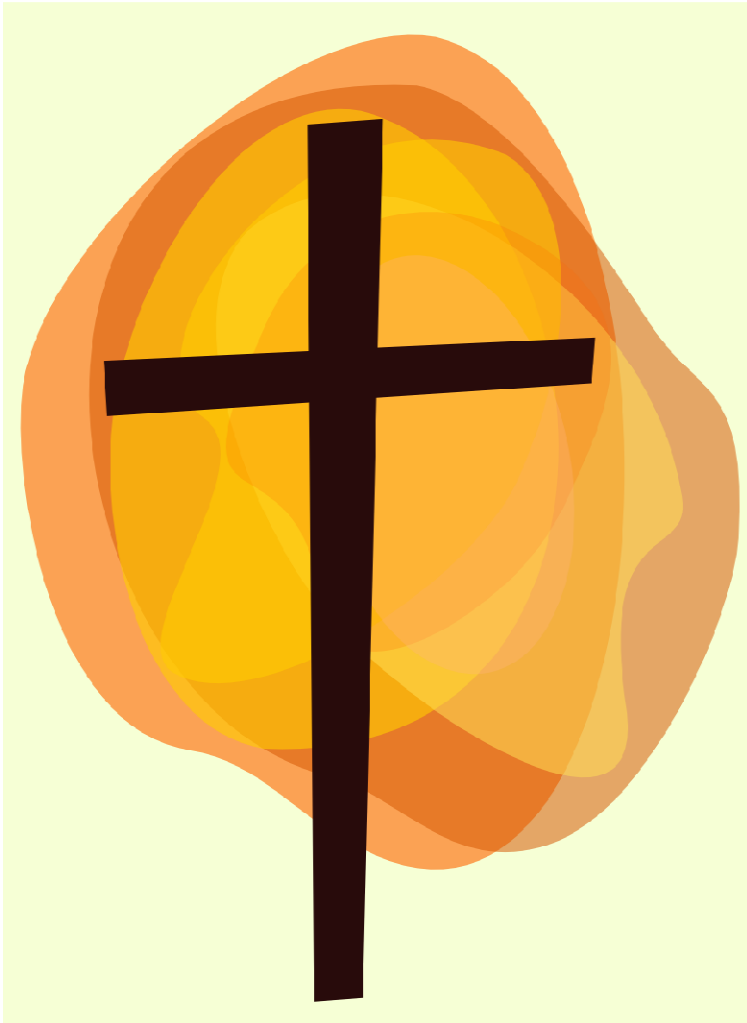

## The Eyes are Useless When the Mind is Blind

What actually do we see when we're looking at something immediately in front of us? Scientist discovered that we see only the object on which our eyes actually focus. By nature, we miss much of what else is directly within our field of vision. No one sees everything. Those who presume they can or do are badly mistaken. For those who doubt that statement never saw what to others was obvious.

To put the above illustration in the proper use, a person can have eyes and a mind and not properly use them; they might as well be blind. To properly use your eyes you need to approach every situation with an open mind. As a matter of fact, to know the meaning of the quote "the eyes are useless when the mind is blind" make a huge difference in everyday situations in a person's life. It's sad to admit but in truth most people of the world operate, like the quote, "the eyes are useless when the mind is blind," and it is not because they have to, we all have a choice. Most people's eyes are useless because they are afraid to see life for what it is; free the mind to ensure you have good use of your eyes.

In order to understand the quote "The eyes are useless when the mind is blind" we look into the cure of the man who was blind from birth but was healed by Jesus (Jn 9/1-41). The Pharisees on learning about the cure of the blind man could not admit that Jesus could perform such a miracle and even after finding out the fact they said to the man who was cured "Give God the praise! We know that this man is a sinner. Of course, the man who was born blind had no problem admitting that he could not see. But the proud Pharisees thought that they were the only ones in Israel with a spiritual sight. They imply this when they railed against him (9/34), "You were born entirely in sins, and are you teaching us? "And they imply it in their sarcastic question to Jesus (9/40) we are not blind too, are we? But Jesus replied (9/41) "If you were blind, you would have no sin; but since you say, "We see, your sin remains. In other words, if they would have admitted their blindness, Jesus would have healed them by forgiving their sins. But since they insisted that they could see, they remained in their sins.

When Jesus said, "Those who do see might become blind," he was not talking about people who really had spiritual insight. Rather, he was talking about people who only *thought* their insight was spiritual light, when it really was only darkness. They claimed to know spiritual truth, but when the Truth was right in front of them, they would not see it. Jesus did not *make* them blind, but he showed that they were blind.

One of the main things that keeps people from gaining spiritual sight is that they refuse to admit that they are blind. They think that they are good enough to qualify for heaven. They may admit that they need a little boost from God. But they minimize their sins. They won't admit that they are totally blind and that they don't just need bifocals, they need sight. This is why they could not believe: In (Jn 12/40)," He has blinded their eyes and hardened their hearts, so that they might not perceive with their eyes, and understand with their mind and in turn I would heal them."

Let's use our eyes to see how awesome life is and not wonder around blind to all around us, free our mind and think.

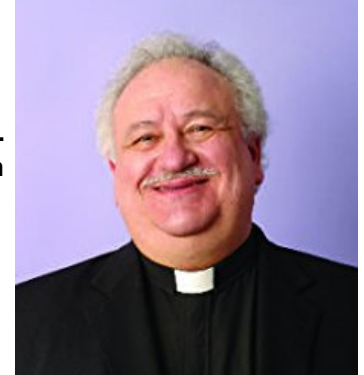


### JOINT LENT SOUP SUPPERS AND SERIES


