

FROM THE
Pastor's Desk

“Friend, do what you have come for”

These were the words uttered by Jesus to Judas his Apostle, who was on the verge of selling his master for thirty silver coins in exchange for handing Jesus over to the Jewish authority. What must have been going on in the mind of Jesus that very moment, knowing that he was going to be betrayed by his very own? How would we respond to such a situation in our life that our own friend is going to disown us? Jesus respects the decision of his apostle Judas, and we can see that in his statement “Friend, do what you have come for” They say that life is not about the people who act true to your face. It’s about the people who remain true behind your back. Some people aren’t loyal to you - but they are loyal to their need of you. Once their needs changes, so dies their loyalty.

As friends, we necessarily don’t talk about every decision we need to make in life but we know that we are supported either way. We understand that sometimes we just need space and other times all we need is each other. We feel happy especially when there is a dire need and the person we count on is around, that’s when, we are drawn to think that when no one else was around; you proved your loyalty by being present. My one concern has been as a Pastor of this Parish that I am in dire need of the works to be undertaken on an emergency basis and I need your help and I know that you love your church and would do anything to help us.

Reflecting upon the recent happenings of the parish life, a big meeting was held for the parishioners to be part of. In that context, a lot of things surfaced. A major concern has been the Demographic shift in the attendance of people at mass and the need for greater participation in the work of other commissions of the parish activities. Seeing into the need of taking up the major works of the parish on an emergency basis, we realized that, we need to understand our identity, of who we are, and what we want, and why we do it. To help us realize, the Archdiocese of Chicago has a pivotal plan in place with regard to “Renew My Church.” We need to take care of the spiritual needs of our people, use well our resources & talents, protect our infrastructure, and be more vibrant and vital in our service to God and his people.

To help us in these arrears of concern, the Archdiocese of Chicago is helping us go through the process of Parish Transformation. Parish Transformation has been a process in the Archdiocese for a long time and many parishes have grown with it. We look forward to the process, and pray that our parishioners will help us go through it with their participation. We are a diverse community, many ethnicities, all ages young & older, families and individuals - - we want to ensure that all are represented. We believe at least 50 to 60 participants, who would join this process of reflection, discernment and planning will help to make this parish more vital and vibrant. This process will take about 10 weeks or so for completion, depending on a schedule we choose to work for us.

What else could I say to you then? Maybe, let Jesus’ words rest with each of us - “Friend, do what you have come for”

HOLY THURSDAY PILGRIMAGE

Why on this night do we travel from church to church to adore the Lord? It was at the Last Supper Jesus gave us the Eucharist, His Eternal Presence in our lives. He gave us the Eucharist to remind us that He is always with us to help strengthen us as we go about living our lives as his disciples. The Eucharist also points to Christ's command that we be one in love for Him and each other. So, on this night we travel about to share our celebration of the Holy Eucharist with one another.

Our tradition of making a pilgrimage to other churches on Holy Thursday will take place again this year. The Mass of the Lord's Supper is at 7:30 p.m. We leave promptly at 9 p.m. and will hopefully return to St. Isaac Jogues to spend some time in adoration here in our own parish. We do not have a list of churches yet as many parishes say they have not yet determined how long they will be open that night.

It is necessary to reserve a seat on the bus. It is important to make a reservation early as we will have just one bus. **Please call the Rectory at 847/967-1060 to reserve your place. A donation of \$5 per person is requested to offset the cost of the bus. It will be collected that evening.** Please remember we get on and off the bus several times and some of the churches have stairs or are a bit of a walk from the parking lot to the building.



As discussed at the Parish Communications Meeting on March 26th, **this is a time of hope, trust, creativity, imagination, honesty and commitment for our parish as we move forward** and further share in the mission which Christ commissioned us to carry out. In this coming Easter Season and beyond St. Isaac Jogues Parish will participate in the **Parish Transformation Process** that will help us in many ways:

- +Renew our commitment to the Mission of Christ
- +Make the parish stronger, more effective, holier, and responsive to human needs & spiritual hungers
- +Continue to form each of us into disciples in mission to share the joy of the Gospel
- +Create a parish vision and concrete plan that links our mission with our resources
- +Undergo a self-assessment of the parish to help us talk with and collaborate with other parishes in our grouping and area.

DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY

St. Faustina wrote, “While I was saying the chaplet, I heard a voice which said, **“Oh, what great graces I will grant to souls who say this chaplet; the very depths of My tender mercy are stirred for the sake of those who say the chaplet. April 23rd is Divine Mercy Sunday. The Feast of Mercy Mass will be at Noon followed by the Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament until 3 p.m. Confessions will be heard in English 2-3 p.m. and the Divine Mercy Chaplet prayed at 3 p.m. followed by Benediction. All are invited to continue the celebration of Easter by participation in all or some part of this feast day!
