

A Priest for 30 years: Gratitude & Joy

It has been a long time as a priest for 30 years serving in God's vineyard. Looking back into my call to the priesthood, the notion I had; how long is it taking me to be a priest and why so many years of formation one has to go through and am I going to reach the end of it?

Well, it's amazing, the years as a priest rolled by so quickly that I cannot imagine it. I am so thrilled to know, that I am still alive and serving the Lord wherever I am called. Reflecting back on my priesthood, I have worked in formation houses directing seminarians, in the administration at the Provincial level, in mission areas and parishes. My life as a priest revolved around ministering to people of various cultures, languages and countries. Be it in Indian context, Canada, Bahrain, Qatar or US.

One has to encounter number of challenges, but I could always feel the presence of God. There were times I was filled with fear and other times with anxieties but soon all these would cease when you utter the name of the Lord. In my pastoral field, I was put to test for my faith as people came to me seeking God's intercession when they were sick for a cure and when I prayed over them or with them, God never let me down.

At this moment, I am reminded of an elderly lady sacristan back home in Goa, India where I worked in a parish as a Pastor. The lady was 76 years old then and being active would regularly carry out the job of a sacristan. One day she told me that from next month onwards she would not show up as she is very sick and her condition is deteriorating. She further stated that she would be paralyzed for the rest of her life as per her doctor's report. I was stunned when I heard it and thought what's going to happen as we don't have anyone to replace her and secondly she lives all by herself.

It was a time of challenge for me and I kept praying knowing that God would show me the way and indeed it happened. As her condition worsened and she was barely able to walk, one day at a week day mass, I asked the faithful gathered to come forward after the post communion prayer and place their hands on her as she was made to sit beside the altar. I placed my hands over her and prayed like a child weeping, pleading God to have mercy on her and cure her from her illness and with me the rest of the congregation wept. I couldn't believe, within two days' time she was totally healed. She is still alive and doing well.

I am so filled with joy & gratitude for the wonders that God worked and took care of me as a priest and looked after my people wherever I was called to serve. I have many incidences to narrate of God's working in my life. I believe miracles happen all the time but we don't notice them taking place. I am mindful of the blessings of this vocation and the gift of my Missionary Society of St. Francis Xavier to which I belong, which within the Church has given me this priestly ministry. I would recommend the vocation to young men and women to serve in the Church in the decades to come and experience the joy of serving the Lord which is beyond comprehension.

Thank you my people for your prayers & good wishes. I am ever delighted to serve you and energized by God's goodness shown towards me through your loving care and appreciation. May God be your strength & support during this time of pandemic as He will safely lead us through. Missing you all and hoping to see you soon. Be assured of my prayers for each of you. Make yourself count: April 1, 2020

LET'S ALL GET COUNTED

The **2020 U.S. Census** is "much more than just a head count, it provides a detailed picture of our nation and its communities. An accurate count is very important because the data collected is used to determine the allocation of more than \$675 billion in federal funding to states and local communities each year for programs that support education, housing, health facilities, transportation, food assistance, emergency services and more. It also determines how many representatives each state will have in the U.S. Congress for the next 10 years."

"**Be Proactive:** The best way to avoid a follow-up visit from a census taker, when they start, is to **fill out the census questionnaire online, by phone or by mail now.**" They want to ensure that everyone is counted. Please note: "**Your personal information is kept confidential. The Census Bureau is bound by federal law to protect your information and your data is used only for statistical purposes....The Census Bureau will never ask for your Social Security number, bank or credit card account numbers, money or donations, or anything on behalf of a political party.**





Dear parishioners & well-wishers,
