

THOUGHTS FROM FR. JOSE

LOVE ONE ANOTHER

In the Gospel of this weekend, Jesus places before us ‘love’ as the weapon to work miracles in people’s lives in our time, just as Jesus worked them in people’s lives in his time. Through love, God has put at our disposal the greatest power in the world. It is a power all the leaders in the world don’t possess. And what is more, love is a power that every human being has, no matter what sex, what religion, what nationality or what educational achievement to which they belong. Love isn’t reserved for the healthy. It isn’t reserved for wealthy. It isn’t reserved for the wise. It isn’t reserved for the famous. Love is for everyone. This image of love is more sharply defined in the language of love and friendship.

In Jn. 15:9-11, Jesus invites his disciples **to abide in his love**, that is, **in his love for us and our love for him**. This love is a descending gift of the Father, a bond which holds together in an invisible net a series of relationships between Father, Son and his disciples. But the model and source of Jesus’ love for disciples is the Father’s own love for his Son, so that the whole act of love lavished by Jesus on disciples and evident most of all in his death, is the actual communication of God’s gift of love in and through his Son, Jesus. Thus, Jesus loves disciples with that same gift of love with which the Father loves him.

Furthermore, Jn. 15:10, shows how the disciples remain in that bond of love with Jesus by **“keeping his commandments,”** that is, they listen and respond in loving obedience to his word with the same spirit of docility and promptitude as Jesus listens and responds to his Father’s word. Jesus himself remains in a continued presence of familiarity with his Father which always gives him joy. For him, this joy consists in being loved by Father and in responding out of love to him.

In Jn. 15:12-17, the message which Jesus brings to us from the Father is about friendship and fraternal love. But this friendship is due to the initiative of Jesus, because he has chosen us, his disciples, to be his friends for whom he has sacrificed his life.

This is the good news that ‘love’ can transform our world so beautifully. We will be able to work miracles through our love in our lifetime, just as Jesus worked miracles through his love in his lifetime. **So let us love one another as Christ has loved us.**

FOOD DISTRIBUTION VOLUNTEERS

Thanks to those who helped with the April food distribution done in collaboration with Catholic Charities and the Greater Chicago Food Depository. We **served 302 households which totaled 1058 people**.

The next distribution will be hosted here in our SIJ parking lot on **Wednesday, May 26th, 4:00-6:00 p.m.** Please pass this information along to those who would benefit from such support right now. Packing will either be indoors or out depending on the weather but the distribution will be outside, regardless of weather.

We are in need of about **30 volunteers for each time frame**. The **first time frame is 2:30 – 4:45 p.m.** for instructions and to carry out the tasks of getting food indoors, packing it and then bringing it outside to tables, setting up signs, checking in guests and the like. The **second time frame is 4:15 - 6:30 p.m.** to help with the distribution, continue packing as needed and clean up. We are in particular need of people who can help carry heavy items including families, teens, and adults under 65 years of age. Everyone needs to be in good health, no underlying conditions, and will have to wear a mask and gloves (which we will provide). Those over 65 and have no underlying medical conditions who choose to volunteer, are welcome to contact us to discuss your involvement.

If we do not have enough helpers by that day, we will reach out to other volunteer pools. MARIAN PRAYER: REGINA COELI

This is one of four Marian antiphons, traditionally said or sung after night prayer, immediately before going to sleep. It is said throughout Eastertide. (Easter Day through Pentecost) and in place of the Angelus during the same season. "According to *The Golden Legend*, a famous 13th century work about the saints, Pope St. Gregory the Great heard angels singing the first three verses from the *Regina Coeli* during a procession in the 6th century and was inspired to add the fourth line "Ora pro nobis deum" ("pray for us to God" in Latin). Although this story is itself considered to be a legend, it is, as Father Herbert Thurston once put it in his book *Familiar Prayers*, 'inseparably associated with the *Regina Coeli*.' This prayer reminds us at Easter, and throughout the year for that matter, of how much we have to be thankful for, even in the midst of our daily trials. When our Lord conquered death in His resurrection he opened the gates of Heaven for us to be able to share Eternal Life with Him there, along with his Mother, the saints, and our loved ones!"

Queen of Heaven, rejoice. Alleluia.
For He, whom thou wast worthy to bear. Alleluia.
Has risen as He said. Alleluia.
Pray for us to God. Alleluia.
V. Rejoice and be glad, O Virgin Mary. Alleluia.
R. Because the Lord is truly risen, Alleluia.
