Pastor's Desk

I am with you always

It is always a good feeling to be assured of one's presence no matter where you are or what you do. This is the assurance given to us by Jesus. That we are not left alone but He is watching over us all, in everything that we do.

Christ gave his disciples the mandate to go and make disciples and assured them saying, **I am with you**, and not, I will be with you. Just as God sent Moses, so Christ sent his apostles as he is God, to whom past, present, and to come are the same. The apostles knowing well that he was about to leave his bodily presence and this grieved them, but he comforts the apostles by assuring that his spirit would be with them at all times. He would hold them, be at their side, strengthen, comfort and guide them along their journey. Christ was now sending them to set up his kingdom in the world.

Exodus 33:15-23 Moses speaks as one who dreaded the thought of going forward without the Lord's presence. God's gracious promises, and mercy towards us, should not only encourage our faith, but also excite our fervency in prayer. God is omnipresence and therefore, the truth of God's omnipresence is good news because it assures us that no matter what God calls us to do or what he permits to happen in our lives, he will be there with us. He will never leave or forsake us.

We can count on his presence when we have to deal with a sinning brother, confront a spouse, question an erring teenager, fire an employee, meet the legitimate expectations of our children, face difficulties at work, deal with irate customers, etc. God's omnipresence means that Jesus will be with us as we set out on our mission to make disciples of all nations. He told the disciples that all authority had been given to him and that they were to go and share his message of faith and obedience to all peoples on the globe and then added, "And surely I am with you always, even to the very end of the age" (Mt 28/19-20).

Christ assures us of his presence always thereby; we can tear down the strong hold of Satan and build Christ kingdom on the values of the gospel especially those laying down their life in service of another. Let us remember as we celebrate the "Memorial Day" all those who in particular made this great sacrifice of their life while in service. May we be gracious enough to treasure those sacrifices and use our abilities and gifts in service of His kingdom.

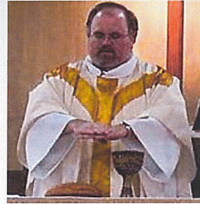
