

FROM THE
Pastor's Desk

You are Witnesses of these things

One of the pertinent questions we would ask is, "what is the witness that we are called to give." It is when Jesus says to his Apostles you are witnesses of these things. What things? First of all what do we mean by witness? Well, it is *not* someone who merely repeats what others have seen and heard; it is one who testifies to what he himself has seen and heard. The apostles, having contacted personally the certain truth of the resurrection proclaimed by the Church and having had it clarified for them, are now ready to go forth as witnesses.

So we come to the next question, "what things"? Jesus the Son of God became man and walked on foot to different parts of the country of Israel spreading the news of the kingdom of God, healing the sick, raising the dead, offering forgiveness of sins. The disciples who followed him right from the baptism of John to His death and resurrection have been called to be witnesses of his resurrection. The disciples who have been closely following Jesus in his mission have been eye witnesses to all that Jesus has done. Greater the witness the stronger is going to be the impact of one's witness. The Apostles having witnessed all these things, has a lasting impression of their minds and heart of the person of Jesus that when Jesus pours forth his spirit on them, they are called to carry out the witness aspect.

Before ascending into heaven Jesus instructed his Apostles to be his witnesses. In order to fulfill it, one needs to be filled with the Holy Spirit. Jesus stated that he would cloth them with power from on high in order to carry out the mission entrusted to them. As the Apostles looked towards heaven at the Lord's ascension, what we need to know is what made it possible for such a thing like that to happen? We know that Sacrifices, Cross and Obedience to Father's will made it possible. We need to draw our example from Jesus' life by carrying out a similar witness.

What message or witness do we give to those around us by the films we watch, the books we read, the music we listen to, the things we "like." By using media we morally might disagree with, we are choosing to support them – we create a market for them to thrive. It reaffirms the current trend that these things are acceptable to us as Christians. Our witness is lacking, in these small things, perhaps. Let us therefore strive to ignore the ways the world tries to shape our thoughts, our ways of acting, and even more craftily, to desensitize us from thinking about the right things. Let us strive for "*whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is gracious, if there is any excellence and if there is anything worthy of praise*" (Phil 4:8). The world will hate us because we stand against the current, stirring up in the souls of others the Truth that exists in every human heart.

Jesus told his disciples "*you will be my witnesses...to the ends of the earth*" (Acts 1:8). Our witness sometimes requires words, but always requires right act. And what is it that we are giving testimony to in our daily lives? Are we proclaiming Christ through our words and actions in a way that leaves those who encounter us to confirm in their hearts goodness deeper than civility expects? Our testimony — if rooted in the Christ-love we contemplate on the Cross — touches others to see Christ through our loving them.

As witnesses, we can and must say, "The Church says that He is risen. The Scriptures say that He is risen. And I say to you that He is risen." *You are witnesses of these things.*

I extend a warm welcome to all the volunteers of SIJ who "*witness*" their faith in service to the parish throughout the year in different ministries, to join me at the appreciation dinner hosted on Friday June 7, 2019 at 6.30 pm in the Holy Family Room.
