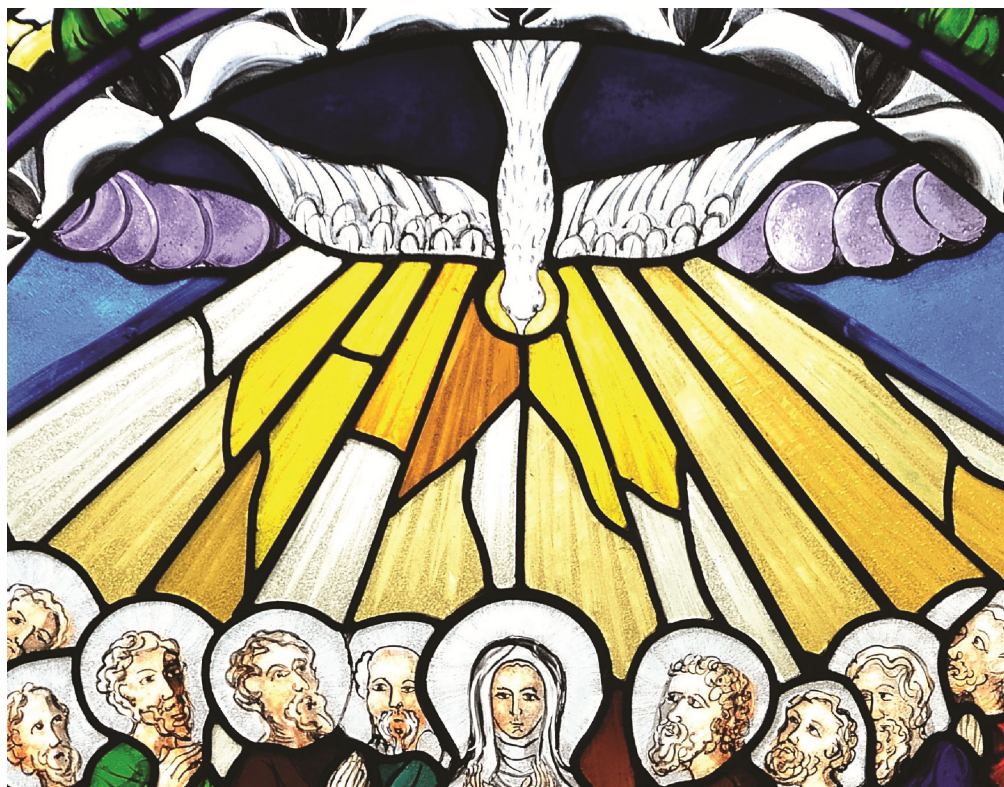

Reflections from Fr. Dennis

Dear Friends and Fellow Parishioners:

Think of the times you have witnessed or experienced a warm breeze in the spring, the wind on a hike in nature, or a cool breeze in the late summer or early autumn. Conversely, think of hurricane or tornado devastation. Wind can be gentle and can be all-powerful. What is the best way for you to notice the Holy Spirit in your life?

The gift of the Holy Spirit allows us to see Christ in our midst. Disciples leaving Jerusalem after Jesus' passion and death did not recognize him when He appeared to them until He had a meal with them. Even though their "hearts were burning", they did not recognize him until after He was gone. When Jesus appeared to disciples on the beach on the Sea of Galilee, they did not recognize him until eating the meal He prepared for them. When Jesus appeared to the disciples in today's Gospel, again the disciples did not recognize him right away. He had to show them his hands and his side. Through the breaking of the bread, WE recognize Christ. The wounds of our lives and labors allow OTHERS to see Christ in us.

The name of the Lord is Holy. Whenever we have doubts about the presence of God, we can rely on St. Paul, who said, "No one can say Jesus is Lord except by the Holy Spirit." This can be a prayer or mantra. In Matthew, chapter 12, Jesus warns that sins against the Holy Spirit will not be forgiven. Such a sin occurs when one with full knowledge says that the workings of the Spirit are evil. Such a sin would be difficult to do. But the statement illustrates that the Holy Spirit is serious business and MEANS business. The Spirit is the Spirit of truth. There is a reason why the devil is called the "father of lies". Those who publicly proclaim to be the truth things they know to be lies are spokespeople of Satan, and Satan's goal is always to divide people. So, on the one hand we have the Holy Spirit, whose goal is always to make us one in Christ. On the other side, we have the prince of darkness, whose goal is to so confuse people that they no longer know either who or what to believe. Satan is manifestly alive and well- THRIVING even - in the many polarizations in this country and in the world.

St. Paul also tells us that every knee shall bow at the name of Jesus. Further, the second command instructs us not to take the name of the Lord in vain. Is this something that I need to address? Could this be a small but profound way to witness Christian faith? Each of us has gifts and talents. Some things we can work to improve, others are part of our nature. All our gifts, our life, should be directed to the greater glory of God. This is done by seeing Christ in others and BEING Christ in others. Ask to feel the breath of the Holy Spirit in our exchanges with others.

God comes to us in simple ways in nature and as well as visibly in the sacraments. Ancient Greeks believed there were four elements: earth, wind, fire, and water. In John 9:14, Jesus placed mud on the eyes of a blind man to restore his sight. In Acts 2:3-5, the Holy Spirit descended on the disciples like tongues of fire after a violent wind shook the place where they were. God comes to us in nature and in the sacraments. In simple bread and wine, Jesus is present to us here today.

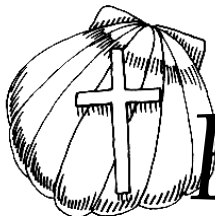

Amen.

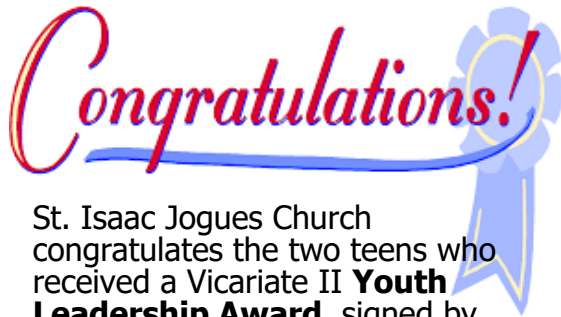

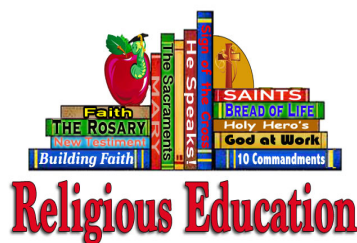
FOOD DISTRIBUTION VOLUNTEERS NEEDED

The next food distribution will be Wednesday, June 22nd, 4 – 6 p.m., here in the SIJ parking lot. Please share this information friends and neighbors who would benefit from extra food support at this time. If they have a Greater Chicago Food Depository pantry card, please ask them to bring it with as it will move the check in process along. We are in need of about 20 volunteers for the first time frame of 2:45 – 4:15 p.m. and about 20 for the second time frame, 4:00 - 6:30 p.m. which includes clean up. Volunteers need to be in good health with no underlying conditions. Check in takes place inside and distribution is outside. Even though we are outside, we do wear masks and gloves (which are provided). Please remember to dress for the weather as we distribute rain or shine! WELCOME TO OUR TEMPORARY CHURCH

As we begin Masses in the Holy Family Room, which will be our worship space from now through early to mid Fall, we hope this information will assist you.

- +Please park in spaces. If you have good movement, kindly park farther away from the door so that those with movement concerns can park closer to door #12, the door to enter to come to the Holy Family Room. There are a few parking spots for those with disability placards near the front of the school. There is also a small ramp there if you need to bring someone in that way and then go park your car.
- +Please make sure your cell phones and other devices are turned off before our worship begins.
- +Take a hymnal from the Usher or the cart so you can participate in prayer and song during Mass.
- +Please go to the middle and far side of HFR first. Kindly fill in the middle seats so others do not have to go past you to get to a seat.
- +Please arrive a few minutes before Mass is to begin to get your seat and to take a moment for prayer and preparation for worship. Ushers will not seat people during the procession, readings or homily, so as not to distract the minister. They will seat you once the procession has moved to the center aisle, during the psalm and during the Alleluia.
- +We will stand for the Eucharistic Prayer. If you are not able to stand for long, please be seated.
- +There will be four Communion stations. Eucharistic Ministers will wear masks as they distribute Holy Communion and will sanitize their hands before they begin to do so. Please follow the direction of the Ushers. We ask your understanding and patience as per Archdiocesan policy Eucharistic Ministers sanitize their hands after giving someone Communion on their tongue.
- +Ushers will distribute bulletins as you leave. Copies of the Senior Connection and Chicago Catholic, as well as special collection envelopes will be found on the small tables on either side of door #12.
- +The only restrooms available are outside of the Holy Family Room in the school. The first set of doors on the right is the men's room and the second set is the ladies. The downstairs Hall and bathrooms are for storage and renovation needs at this time.
- +Should the fire alarm go off, please follow the direction of the Ushers to the front door of the school or door #12 or the door across from door #12. No matter what door you exit, please then move away from the building toward either Golf Road or the fence by the condos so to leave access to the fire department and their vehicles. We will re-enter the building only when given an "all clear" signal.
- +Should tornado sirens go off, please follow the direction of the Ushers to downstairs or to the school hallway (but away from doors with windows) or to the end of the school hallway to the bathrooms on the right and left (no windows in these bathrooms). Again we will assemble in HFR once an "all clear" is given.
- +If you need assistance or have a question, please ask an Usher (wearing usher badge) or one of the ministers of the Mass. We are happy you are here to offer praise and thanks to the Lord!
