FROM THE
Pastor's Desk

Receive the Holy Spirit

Jesus knew very well what was needed to carry forth his mission and therefore tell his disciples that they would receive Holy Spirit from above, and, he would reveal to them explicitly whatever has been conveyed by Jesus. The role of the Holy Spirit would be one of teaching guidance, as he is known to be the Paraclete (Advocate).

Jesus spoke to his disciples about the role of the Holy Spirit and how important it was for him to depart from this world in order that we may receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. *Was the gift of the Holy Spirit given only to the first apostles?* Jesus having accomplished his mission, breathed on his apostles the gift of the Holy Spirit, to carry forward his mission on earth. With Peter (the first Pope) as their head (Mt 16/18) the Church's mission continues with the successors of St. Peter and those apostolic successors (bishops) in union with him.

In a general sense, the gift of the Holy Spirit is for everyone, as all who receive baptism become temples of the Holy Spirit (1cor6/19-20). It is the Holy Spirit that guides Christians to give witness to God. At Baptism we receive the Holy Spirit and thereby we become sons and daughters of God.

St. Peter tells his fellow Jews to "*repent and be baptized every one of you in the name of the Lord Jesus for the forgiveness of your sins and you shall receive the gifts of the Holy Spirit.*" (Acts 2/38) Paul finds in Ephesus some disciples of John the Baptist who had never heard of the Holy Spirit. Paul explains to them that John pointed people forward to Jesus, and on hearing it they were baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus. And when Paul had laid his hands upon them the Holy Spirit came on them and they prophesied.

In order to receive the Holy Spirit one must believe in the Lord Jesus; for it is in believing you are saved. The apostle Paul, speaking to the Galatians said, "*Did you receive the Spirit by the works of the law, or by the hearing of faith?*" (Galatians 3/2) the answer obviously is faith. You have to believe that if you ask, you will receive. Secondly, one must be willing to obey the Spirit of God and St. Paul has made this need clear in the book of Romans when he said, "*Present your bodies as a living sacrifice.*" (Rom12/1)

We need the Holy Spirit of God to lead us into all truth. Without the help of the Holy Spirit our knowledge and discernment may lead us elsewhere away from God and his works. Therefore let us constantly seek the presence of the Holy Spirit so that we make the right decisions and choices in our life.






