
Sacrament of Reconciliation: Saturdays, 11AM - 12:30PM, BY RESERVATION



REFLECTIONS FROM FR. CARLOS

Only Saint Mark the evangelist records the parable of the seeds growth. Using the short parables of the growth of wheat seeds and mustard seeds in the field, Jesus explain the nature of the growth of the kingdom of God.

In the case of both wheat and mustard seeds, the initial growth is slow, mysterious and unnoticed. But within a days, a leafy shoot will emerge and within months a mature plant with numerous branches and leaves, flowers and fruits will be produced. The growth is silent and slow but steady, using power from the seed and natural resources. Growth doesn't take place because of our understanding. It is God's initiative that brings forth growth, we need to be patient and not give up or get discouraged, because sometimes growth takes longer than we expect. God works in a ways we don't understand, God works in mysterious ways. But God is still with us even when our efforts are frustrated, because He is the source of Growth.

Jesus explains that the kingdom of God grows the human soul. The seed of faith lies dormant within each of us, we need to nourish it with our personal, communal prayer, and sacrament and reading of the Scriptures. The growth of our faith may be slow in the beginning, but this tiny seed of faith will grow by using the power of the Holy Spirit, given to us through the word of God, the Mass, the sacraments and prayers. Finally God's rule in human heart transforms individual and communities in God's people doing His will in His Kingdom.



**Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time
June 13, 2021**

They that are planted
in the house of the LORD
shall flourish in the courts of our God.
—Psalm 92:14

SPIRITUAL REFLECTION: From a treatise on the Lord's Prayer by St. Cyprian, bishop and martyr

"Above all, he who preaches peace and unity did not want us to pray by ourselves in private or for ourselves alone. We do not say 'My Father, who art in heaven,' nor 'Give me this day my daily bread.' It is not for himself alone that each person asks to be forgiven, not to be led into temptation or to be delivered from evil. Rather, we pray in public as a community, and not for one individual but for all. For the people of God are all one.

God is then the teacher of harmony, peace and unity, and desires each of us to pray for all (people), even as he bore all (people) in himself alone. The three young men shut up in the furnace of fire observed this rule of prayer. United in the bond of the Spirit they uttered together the same prayer. The witness of holy Scripture describes this incident for us, so that we might imitate them in our prayer. *Then all three began to sing in unison, blessing God.* Even though Christ had not yet taught them to pray, nevertheless, they spoke as with one voice. It is for this reason that their prayer was persuasive and efficacious. For their simple and spiritual prayer of peace merited the presence of the Lord. So too, after the Ascension we find the apostles and the disciples praying together in this way. Scripture relates: *They all joined together in continuous prayer, with the women, including Mary, the mother of Jesus, and his brothers.* They all joined together in continuous prayer. The urgency and the unity of their prayer declares that *God, who fashions a bond of unity among those who live in his home, will admit into his divine home for all eternity only those who pray in unity.*

My dear friends, the Lord's Prayer contains many great mysteries of our faith. In these few words there is great spiritual strength, for this summary of divine teaching contains all of our prayers and petitions. And so, the Lord commands us: *Pray then like this: Our Father, who art in heaven.* We are new (people); we have been reborn and restored to God by his grace. We have already begun to be his (children) and we can say 'Father.' John reminds us of this: *He came to his own home, and his own people did not receive him. But to all who received him, who believe in his name, he gave the power to become children of God.* Profess your belief that you are (children) of God by giving thanks. Call upon God who is your Father in heaven."

FOOD DISTRIBUTION VOLUNTEERS

We are in particular need of people who can help carry heavy items including families, teens, and adults under 65 years of age. Everyone needs to be in good health, no underlying conditions, and will have to wear a mask and gloves (which we will provide). Those over 65 and have no underlying medical conditions who choose to volunteer, are welcome to contact us to discuss your involvement.

THY KINGDOM COME . . .

Ezekiel said that God would tear off “a tender shoot” (17:22) for this replanting. What does this sound like? Why, Advent, of course, and specifically the words of the prophet Isaiah: “A shoot shall sprout from the stump of Jesse, and from his roots a bud shall blossom” (Isaiah 11:1); and again in Isaiah’s Messianic texts we hear: “He grew up before us like a tender shoot” (53:2). Jesse was the father of the great king David and, as we know, Jesus came to be that tender shoot, that blossom, the new Davidic King whose throne, the cross, was once a tree.

God’s incarnation in Jesus, born fully human, is the fulfillment of the promise to Ezekiel of the renewed and restored cedar, the new Kingdom. That new creation and covenant exists for us in the Church, through the Holy Spirit making the seed planted within us grow, flourish, and spread. Thus we have the faith and courage to be that visible sign of the Kingdom bringing hope and renewal to the world. We must live Kingdom lives before we can convince others to do so.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION PROGRAM REGISTRATION FOR 2021-22

We are looking forward to a great 2021 – 22 Religious Education season! At this time both St. Isaac Jogues and St. Martha sites will have their own Religious Education Program held at their own buildings. **So our St. Isaac Jogues Church RE Program will be on Mondays, 6:45 – 8:00 p.m., from late August until mid-May.** Registration forms have been mailed to families who participated in the 2020-2021 RE Program.

Registration for the 2021-2022 RE Program begins this Monday, 5:30-7:30 p.m. in the Holy Family Room (please wear masks) for families whose children will be in Kindergarten – Confirmation Year II (Gr. 8 or early high school) as of September, 2021. Please bring completed form and partial payment, if possible. The tuition for parishioners will be as last year: \$200 – 1 child; \$300 – 2 children; \$400 – 3 or more children; book fee is \$40 per student; First Communion/First Reconciliation fee is \$80 and Confirmation Year II fee is \$80. Please plan to stop by on June 14th and take care of this important task. Early registration gives us time to get catechists, assistants and order necessary materials.

Growing in faith is a lifelong process. Please allow us to help you help your child create a firm foundation in faith and send them each year for religious education! Everyone is welcome! Please note that students must participate in religious education the immediate two years prior to receiving any sacraments (First Communion, Confirmation). **New families are most welcome** to come register that evening as well. In addition to a family form and a student form for each child, we would appreciate you bringing a copy of each new child's baptismal certificate and the dates of any sacraments they have received so far. **Families with children who have special needs and/or older children who have not yet celebrated First Reconciliation or First Communion or are not yet baptized** are encouraged to contact Dolores Stanton to discuss options for learning and preparation, 847/966-1180 or email sijre2004@yahoo.com.
