

Pastor's Desk

They all ate and were satisfied

As we celebrate the feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ what amazes me is that Jesus multiplied five loaves and two fish to feed such a large crowd. He not only took care of their spiritual need by his teaching, but he also healed them of their physical ailment. He did not stop there, but he showed us that he cared for their needs of hunger by providing food until they were satisfied.

If Jesus fed the hungry then, we would say, why is he not doing it today? There are millions of people out in the world who go hungry even today. Is God not concerned about their care today? Why doesn't he multiply bread for the starving people? The answer lies in the very gospel text itself (Lk 9/11-17). Jesus asked his disciples to give the crowd some food to eat. He further asked them what they have and invited them to share whatever they have and they came up with five loaves and two fish.

There is so much out in the world that we can share with the hungry but we lack in compassion towards the poor and the less fortunate. There is plenty of food that this earth produces which can feed all the hungry people to their satisfaction like Jesus, who fed the five thousand men alone and they all ate and were satisfied; further they collected twelve wicker baskets signifying that God could feed the whole nation of Israel as well. It indicates that we should not waste food that is given to us or at our disposal. Eat and be satisfied and let others eat by sharing our food with them. If every individual were to realize that just as we feel hungry likewise; there are people who feel the same. There are some people out in the world who are left with nothing else to eat but boiled leaves that hide their hunger.

We are living in an advanced world where the production of food has increased greatly more than ever before and the resources that we have can take care of the needs of people of this world. Yet our very own brothers and sisters die of hunger and malnutrition, only because we lack the basic principle of sharing what we have rather than amassing wealth for ourselves and our families. So how can we say that God is not supplying enough bread for everyone when we destroy millions of tons of food supplies to safe guard food prices from falling? All we need to do is find a better way of distributing and sharing what we have.

The celebration of the Eucharist is a reminder of that very bread which Christ gives us as food to nourish our soul. As we take part in the procession of Corpus Christi may we learn to journey along with the less fortunate by assuring them of a better future in sharing our resources. If God feeds us all and we can be satisfied then let's share our resources so that all can eat and be satisfied. God bless you and wish you a fruitful "Corpus Christi" celebration.




