

FROM THE
Pastor's Desk

The harvest is abundant but the laborers are few.

It is not so much the caption itself that caused me to stop and think, but rather all the words of Jesus when he said "*The harvest is abundant but the laborers are few; so ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest*" (Lk 10/2). This verse in scripture is often quoted as a reminder for us to pray for more vocations to the priesthood too, because in certain parts of the world, especially in the US, the number of young men interested in the priesthood is dwindling. The mission has to continue but how do we proceed?

We are all called to help gather people to the Lord. The mission entrusted to us by the Lord has to continue both by clergy and by laity as well. Since we are all baptized into Christ, so we share in that very mission of Christ to evangelize by the gifts that we possess. We have to encourage one another to fulfill what God has called each one of us to do, whether to become a priest or religious, or catechist, or by participating in the different ministries at the parish by playing an active role. I feel sometimes the reason people do not step into these roles in church is because of a lack of confidence in their abilities. The challenge for us today might be to help others see the good traits they already possess and encourage them to develop their talents and abilities to serve the church.

Jesus didn't call the trained; rather he trained the called, just as in the gospel text. Jesus didn't wait until the disciples were fully trained before sending them out into the world to do his will. Part of their training would be hands on experience and this is true for all of us today as well. The best way to learn to become the person the good Lord has called us to be is to simply take the first step. The rest will come, for we do not guide our lives on our own, but rely on Jesus Christ and the working of the Holy Spirit to help guide us in all that we do.

If you are ready to proclaim Christ to the world then get on board and experience the joy of actively participating in His Kingdom. Your desire to serve God through different ministries will reap abundant fruit in your life. No matter how busy you are at your work place, one can always lend a helping hand as we need more laborers to carry forth his kingdom.

We have a number of ministries that needs assistance in Church, so please come forward to fill in the required spot; also one can think of even lending your helping hand to work on Saturdays at the office in the rectory for a couple of hours as we need people. Your help will be greatly appreciated. As we have the "Mission Appeal" this weekend, so please contribute generously "*For God loves a cheerful giver*".

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

It's high summer now, school is out, the pace of work slows, and some people drift away. There are visitors in the churches every summer, and familiar faces are "among the missing." Some find the summer's call more appealing than the summons of the church bells. Many, however, would not dream of missing a Sunday, and so they make their way to Mass in unfamiliar places, watching the locals for clues as to when to sit or stand, where the Communion stations are. In answering the call, they keep the "sabbatical" rhythm of the Christian life: every seventh day, the Body of Christ assembles for worship.

For centuries, there was no obligation to Sunday Mass in the sense of a written law, but Christians have always yearned to be together on Sunday. In the city of Abitina, during a persecution by the Emperor Diocletian, a group of Christians were urged to stop worshiping together on Sundays. They responded, "Then take our lives, for without the Sunday we cannot live." By a curious coincidence, the appointed readings today center us on thoughts of peace. On our Independence Day, the experience of worship situated us in community, and evoked a commitment from us to be advocates of peace in all aspects of our society's life.

GOD'S PROVIDENCE

Today's readings celebrate God's providence. No matter how wonderful (or heartbreaking) our relationships are, God always provides for us. No one cares for us the way God does.

Isaiah delights us with a deeply intimate image of God caring for us "as a mother comforts her child." The prophet describes us not as the usual "children of God," but as "babies." We should not resist this image, but rejoice in it. Trusting in God's care, we can all let down our guard and rest like infants in the lap of our mother.

Saint Paul's trust in God allows him to be at peace like this. He boldly declares that no one can "make troubles" for him, because he has given himself completely to Jesus. And when Jesus sends his disciples out to preach and heal, he challenges them not to provide for themselves, but to let faith be their guide.



This weekend of July 6/7, St. Isaac Jogues will be participating in the Archdiocesan 2019 Missionary Cooperative Plan. Our missionary guest this year is from the Archdiocese of Bamenda, North West Region, Cameroon. Located in West Central Africa, the Archdiocese is home to approximately

half a million Catholics in a population of 1.5 million. The Region is undergoing socio-political crises that began in 2016 with so many displaced persons, including women, children, pregnant and nursing mothers. The mission of the Archdiocese is to bring humanitarian assistance to the affected communities. Deacon Neba from St. Margaret Mary Parish, Chicago is a native of the Archdiocese of Bamenda and will be making this year's mission appeal. Your generosity will be greatly appreciated.
