

Pastor's Desk

Seed for the Sower

The seed and the sower play an important role in the growth of a plant. But there are many other factors as well before a sower goes out to sow, like the credibility of the soil, manure, water and so on. What we find in the gospel is that a sower went out to sow seeds and the seeds fell in four different directions, on the path, rocky ground, among thorns and on rich soil.

On a number of times as a priest I have reflected on this parable of the sower. Every time, the word of God inspires me in such a way that I can see the richness that the parable has and why Jesus used the parable of the sower to drive home his message about the kingdom of God. Parables convey a powerful message that are rich in content.

When we read about the parable of the sower it disturbs us or rather challenges us as to how are we being called as disciples of Jesus? The contemporaries of Jesus rejected his teaching and his message because of their sluggish way of life, and the unbelieving ones are those who are drawn to Jesus and his teaching about the kingdom of God. In which category do I belong?

How gifted we are and how do we use the gifts given to us by God? As we find through the parable that only the seed that fell on rich soil yielded fruit. So we can say 75% of it did not yield and the reason being care has not been taken to sow the seed in the right manner. But the one sown on rich soil yielded extraordinary result. Like the parable of the sower we have been blessed in numerous ways by God. Do we realize that our life belongs to God? The gifts we possess are our own but we have been blessed by God to have it; and so do we give thanks to God and are we ready to offer our time and talent in return to meet the needs of the Kingdom of God?

The parable of the sower is a reminder to us that Jesus came to reveal the hidden mysteries of the Kingdom of God to us and different people responded differently. The mission of Jesus continues where all of us as Catholics are called to be a witness of God to people out in the world. It is not an easy task to stand in the name of Jesus and to carry forth his mission. Just as Jesus felt rejection so too says Jesus we would have to carry the cross if we are to follow him.

I would say, we all can do it in small ways as parents and grandparents, we can take it upon ourselves to catechize the little ones in our home by teaching them to make the sign of the cross on their forehead and showing them to love, respect and honor the things of God. In doing so we would be sowing good seeds which later on would yield a good harvest.

WEEKEND AND WEEKDAY MASSES

First and foremost it is important for everyone to understand that our efforts will prioritize the safety and wellbeing of all while maintaining due respect and reverence for the sacraments and liturgical norms of our faith. While our parish will attempt to take appropriate precautions consistent with the advice of public health authorities, parishioners and guests should understand that they assume the risk of contracting COVID-19 anytime they enter a public space since such precautions do not eliminate the risk of infection.

Those who are 65 years or older and/or who have an underlying medical condition that would put them at greater risk for infection are reminded that you are not bound by the obligation to attend Mass at this time. You can still watch the televised Masses on Sundays at 9:30 a.m. on WLS Channel 7 (with Cardinal Cupich) and on WGN Channel 9 (Mass at Mercy Home). If you choose to come to Mass you are welcome!

New links for weekend and week day Masses, as well as Reconciliation (Saturdays) are either already on the parish website or will be by end of day Monday. **Only 50 people are able to attend any Mass and you must make a reservation using the online system.** If you do not have access to a computer, you may call the Rectory at 847/967-1060, and we will help you make a reservation.

To give access to everyone who would like to attend a Mass, you are asked to sign up for **only one weekend Mass and/or one Reconciliation time a month.** You may sign up **once a week for weekday Mass.** We do not call, text or send an email to remind you of your Mass or Reconciliation time. We ask for a phone number or email in case we are made aware of someone who was at the church and tested positive for coronavirus and need to contact you.

Please note: You may check reservations on Fridays after 1 p.m. for the coming weekend for availability and sign up if you want to come.

Before coming to church on the day of your reservation, please check your temperature and make sure you are feeling well. We also ask that you use the facilities at home, as we would like to have the only bathroom in the church used for urgent needs only. If you have a fever or are not feeling well, we respectfully request that you stay home for your well being and that of others. If you feel well and come to the church, please wear a mask. You will need to wear it the entire time.

The **only entrance door** is off the main parking lot at the stairs with the white railing and will open 15 minutes prior to the start of each Mass. You will be greeted, checked in, have your hands sprayed with hand sanitizer, and shown to your seat by an Usher. Families who live together will be seated together.

It is important that you are on time and enter the church during those 15 minutes. Doors close soon after Mass begins. For everyone's health and well being people cannot just walk in without going through the above arrival process. If the doors are closed you cannot come in even if you have a reservation. Thank you for your cooperation.

Please note: Due to the sanitizing guidelines we have taped up the kneelers. So there will be no kneeling (we will stand for the Eucharistic Prayer). There will also be no singing at this time by the Assembly, but we will recite Mass responses. The collection basket will not be passed. Please place your offering in the alms box as you enter or later leave the church. We will continue to wish each other the Sign of Peace with words or a bow, but no physical contact.

Regarding the reception of Holy Communion: Reminders will be given prior to Communion. Father and Deacon sanitize their hands. Only hosts are distributed and only in the hand, not on the tongue. Ushers will invite you into the aisle socially distanced on the blue tape markers on the floor. There will be a single line in the aisles going up for Communion. When you are about 2-3 people away from the front, the Usher will again spray your hands with hand sanitizer. Please rub it in and from this point forward do not touch your face or anything else.

When you get up to Father/Deacon, please do not remove your face mask. Extend one hand. Bow your head and respond "Amen" to "The Body of Christ". The host will be put in your hand. Move sideways to the next blue tape marker. With your other hand remove one side of your mask, place the host in your mouth, put the side back up and then return to your seat. **Please note that you are to return to your seat and not leave the church as you must be led out by an Usher. We respectfully remind you that Mass is over when Father leaves.**

At the end of Mass the Ushers will guide each row out beginning with the back. While maintaining social distance everyone in that row will be escorted to the **only exit door**, which is the narthex door by Golf Road (long ramp). The Usher will either fix the door so it stays open or will hold it open for you. Please do not touch the doors. Should an emergency arise and we need to move everyone out of the church (i.e. fire alarm goes off) we will use every available exit but ask that you follow Usher directions and keep some distance from person in front of you.

Once in the parking lot please go straight to your cars. There is to be no gathering outside. A wave to others or a hello from six feet away is fine, but no physical contact and no groups. As we see how things are working, there could be some changes. Thank you for the attention and cooperation shown so far, and for your prayers.
