Pastor's Desk

Shun Evil and Do Good

One would wonder why have I used the caption shun evil and do good instead of just focusing on doing good. Good is something we all like to aspire for or want others to do good to us or be good with us. Let us remember God is good and He alone is supreme good. If we are going to focus on good and on doing good, first and foremost we have to be free of the evil that contaminates our life and blocks us from the revelation of God. The parable of the wheat and the weeds in Mathew's gospel for this weekend (Mt 13:24ff) has a lesson for us all.

Physically one may avoid doing evil, but for the mind to be rid of all evil would take much more time and efforts. Therefore it is important to be aware of this fact that in order to bear good fruits in life we have to cultivate doing good. We have to uproot the causes of evil first that surround us. Jesus knows well the causes of evil and how it destroys our relationship with him.

The people of Israel were in slavery in Egypt and it is only when God brought them out of slavery that he makes a covenant with his people. God does not oppress anyone as we do with our people. The latest riots in the country on racism is a reminder that we are all God's people and the mission of Jesus as Luke mentions in Chapter 4:18 has been precisely to set the captives free. So to have the revelation from God we should free our mind and our body of the evil within.

The question that comes to my mind then - from where does the evil one come? God is the one who is good and the evil one comes from the devil or Satan who is out to divide, destroy, sow seeds of discord, disharmony & disunity. Jesus was particularly aware of Satan's ways when he tried to tempt him in the wilderness during those forty days. We need to be watchful, lest we fall in Satan's trap. Well, the world we live in is such a strange mix of good and evil. We experience the highest heroism and also the deepest depravity. We find such goodness and generosity and also such meanness and miserliness. We must admit that there is good and evil in our personal life. As the saying goes "In the best of us there is some evil and in the worst of us there is some good."

Let's make our choice to do good by sowing seeds of compassion, kindness, and generosity. It is when we are open to God's will that we become sharers of the Kingdom of God with the people of our world who are wounded in many ways and look to us for healing and love. Our reward would be at the time of judgement when God will say enter the Kingdom prepared for you for in doing good to others you did it unto me.

WEEKEND AND WEEKDAY MASSES

First and foremost it is important for everyone to understand that our efforts will prioritize the safety and wellbeing of all while maintaining due respect and reverence for the sacraments and liturgical norms of our faith. While our parish will attempt to take appropriate precautions consistent with the advice of public health authorities, parishioners and guests should understand that they assume the risk of contracting COVID-19 anytime they enter a public space since such precautions do not eliminate the risk of infection.

Those who are 65 years or older and/or who have an underlying medical condition that would put them at greater risk for infection are reminded that you are not bound by the obligation to attend Mass at this time. You can still watch the televised Masses on Sundays at 9:30 a.m. on WLS Channel 7 (with Cardinal Cupich) and on WGN Channel 9 (Mass at Mercy Home). If you choose to come to Mass you are welcome!

New links for weekend and week day Masses, as well as Reconciliation (Saturdays) are either already on the parish website or will be by end of day Monday. **Only 50 people are able to attend any Mass and you must make a reservation using the online system.** If you do not have access to a computer, you may call the Rectory at 847/967-1060, and we will help you make a reservation.

To give access to everyone who would like to attend a Mass, you are asked to sign up for **only one weekend Mass and/or one Reconciliation time a month.** You may sign up **once a week for weekday Mass.** We do not call, text or send an email to remind you of your Mass or Reconciliation time. We ask for a phone number or email in case we are made aware of someone who was at the church and tested positive for coronavirus and need to contact you.

Please note: You may check reservations on Fridays after 1 p.m. for the coming weekend for availability and sign up if you want to come.

Before coming to church on the day of your reservation, please check your temperature and make sure you are feeling well. We also ask that you use the facilities at home, as we would like to have the only bathroom in the church used for urgent needs only. If you have a fever or are not feeling well, we respectfully request that you stay home for your well being and that of others. If you feel well and come to the church, please wear a mask. You will need to wear it the entire time.

The **only entrance door** is off the main parking lot at the stairs with the white railing and will open 15 minutes prior to the start of each Mass. You will be greeted, checked in, have your hands sprayed with hand sanitizer, and shown to your seat by an Usher. Families who live together will be seated together.

It is important that you are on time and enter the church during those 15 minutes. Doors close soon after Mass begins. For everyone's health and well being people cannot just walk in without going through the above arrival process. If the doors are closed you cannot come in even if you have a reservation. Thank you for your cooperation.

Please note: Due to the sanitizing guidelines we have taped up the kneelers. So there will be no kneeling (we will stand for the Eucharistic Prayer). There will also be no singing at this time by the Assembly, but we will recite Mass responses. The collection basket will not be passed. Please place your offering in the alms box as you enter or later leave the church. We will continue to wish each other the Sign of Peace with words or a bow, but no physical contact.


Regarding the reception of Holy Communion: Reminders will be given prior to Communion. Father and Deacon sanitize their hands. Only hosts are distributed and only in the hand, not on the tongue. Ushers will invite you into the aisle socially distanced on the blue tape markers on the floor. There will be a single line in the aisles going up for Communion. When you are about 2-3 people away from the front, the Usher will again spray your hands with hand sanitizer. Please rub it in and from this point forward do not touch your face or anything else.

When you get up to Father/Deacon, please do not remove your face mask. Extend one hand. Bow your head and respond "Amen" to "The Body of Christ". The host will be put in your hand. Move sideways to the next blue tape marker. With your other hand remove one side of your mask, place the host in your mouth, put the side back up and then return to your seat. **Please note that you are to return to your seat and not leave the church as you must be led out by an Usher. We respectfully remind you that Mass is over when Father leaves.**

At the end of Mass the Ushers will guide each row out beginning with the back. While maintaining social distance everyone in that row will be escorted to the **only exit door**, which is the narthex door by Golf Road (long ramp). The Usher will either fix the door so it stays open or will hold it open for you. Please do not touch the doors. Should an emergency arise and we need to move everyone out of the church (i.e. fire alarm goes off) we will use every available exit but ask that you follow Usher directions and keep some distance from person in front of you.

Once in the parking lot please go straight to your cars. There is to be no gathering outside. A wave to others or a hello from six feet away is fine, but no physical contact and no groups. As we see how things are working, there could be some changes.


