REFLECTION: From a sermon by St. Augustine, bishop (The Feast of St. Martha is Thursday, 7/29)

"Our Lord's words teach us that though we labor among the many distractions of this world, we should have but one goal. For we are but travelers on a journey without as yet a fixed abode; we are on our way, not yet in our native land; we are in a state of longing, not yet of enjoyment. But let us continue on our way, and continue without sloth or respite, so that we may ultimately arrive at our destination.

"Martha and Mary were sisters, related not only by blood but also by religious aspirations. They stayed close to our Lord and both served him harmoniously when he was among them. Martha welcome him as travelers are welcomed. But in her case, the maidservant received her Lord, the invalid her Savior, the creature her Creator, to serve him bodily food while she was to be fed by the Spirit. For the Lord willed to put on the form of a slave, and under this form to be fed by his own servants, out of condescension and not out of need. For this was indeed condescension, to present himself to be fed; since he was in the flesh he would in fact be hungry and thirsty. Thus was the Lord received as a guest who *came unto his own and his own received him not; but as many as received him, he gave them the power to become children of God*, adopting those who were servants and making them his brothers, ransoming the captives and making them his coheirs. No one of you should say: 'Blessed are they who have deserved to receive Christ into their homes!' Do not grieve or complain that you were born in a time when you can no longer see God in the flesh. He did not in fact take this privilege from you. As he says, *Whatever you have done to the least of my brothers, you did to me.*

"But you, Martha, if I may say so, are blessed for your good service, and for your labors you seek the reward of peace. Now you are much occupied in nourishing the body, admittedly a holy one. But when you come to the heavenly homeland will you find a traveler to welcome, some hungry to feed, or thirsty to whom you may give drink, someone ill whom you could visit, or quarreling whom you could reconcile, or dead whom you could bury? No, there will be none of these tasks there. What you will find there is what Mary chose. There we shall not feed others, we ourselves shall be fed. Thus what Mary chose in this life will be realized there in all its fullness; she was gathering fragments from that rich banquet, the Word of God. Do you wish to know what we will have there? The Lord himself tells us when he says of his servants, *Amen, I say to you, he will make them recline and passing he will serve them.*


2021 MISSIONARY COOPERATION PLAN

The Missionary Cooperation Plan connects our Archdiocese of Chicago with missionary causes around the world. However, missionaries are again unable to be with us due to the pandemic. Yet the chosen 104 mission causes are counting on our support more than ever to continue their life-saving ministries. Religious congregations of sisters, brothers, and priests, along with missionary dioceses and organizations such as schools, orphanages, and medical clinics will benefit from our prayers and donations.

For example, Fr. Rodlin Rodrigue (Associate Pastor of St. Raymond Parish in Mount Prospect) is the founder of **Sapaterre Mission in Haiti**. Sapaterre is a small village near Fr. Rodlin's home diocese in Haiti with a population of 6,000 people. At one time there was nothing: no drinking water, no electricity, no hospital, no school except a shady pavilion where the kids went to learn the alphabet. With the help of many generous donors, Sapaterre Mission was founded to achieve transformation and empowerment. Now Sapaterre has a mission school that accommodates 163 students. The children are provided with education, medical help, meals, and clean drinking water. Usually the annual budget for the Mission School is \$10,000 a year, but due to the pandemic and rising prices of food the budget has almost doubled.

The Foundation for Children in Need is a Catholic lay organization based in Arlington Heights, IL. Dr. Geetha Yeruva and Mr. Tom Chitta established it to work in the interior villages of Southern India. The foundation has built several schools, boarding homes, a community health center and a home for the elderly. They provide free medical check-ups and medicine to thousands of people. At the heart of the foundation's mission is education as it changes the trajectory of a person's life.

We'll feature a couple more causes next weekend, but we must each remember that the missionary work of the Church is our work, too, which we are called to support through our prayers and financial contributions. A **second collection will be taken up the weekend of August 7 – 8**. The local churches cannot support these ministries by themselves so if you are able, please place cash or a check (made out to SIJ Church and we will send a total check) in the second collection that weekend. CHURCH REMINDERS


- +The outside door by the Holy Family Room is now able to be used to enter and exit the church.
- +The Sacristy is for use by the clergy and work team. Liturgical ministers check in by the Usher's Room.
- +Everyone is asked to please be seated. Only Ushers should be standing.
- +The bathroom in church is still the only one for use.
- +Doors open a half hour before each Mass (weekday or weekend). Please make every effort to be here on time and to leave only after Father leaves the altar and goes down the main aisle.
- +Please help maintain a reverent atmosphere – lower & lift up kneelers and open & close any doors quietly.
- +The collection is now being taken up by the Ushers with long-handled baskets.
- +There are two lines for Holy Communion coming forward in the main aisle and a single line over by the chapel side. Whichever of the three ministers finishes their line first will go to the SIJ side of the church to distribute Holy Communion.
- +Bulletins are given out at the end of Masses on the weekend.
