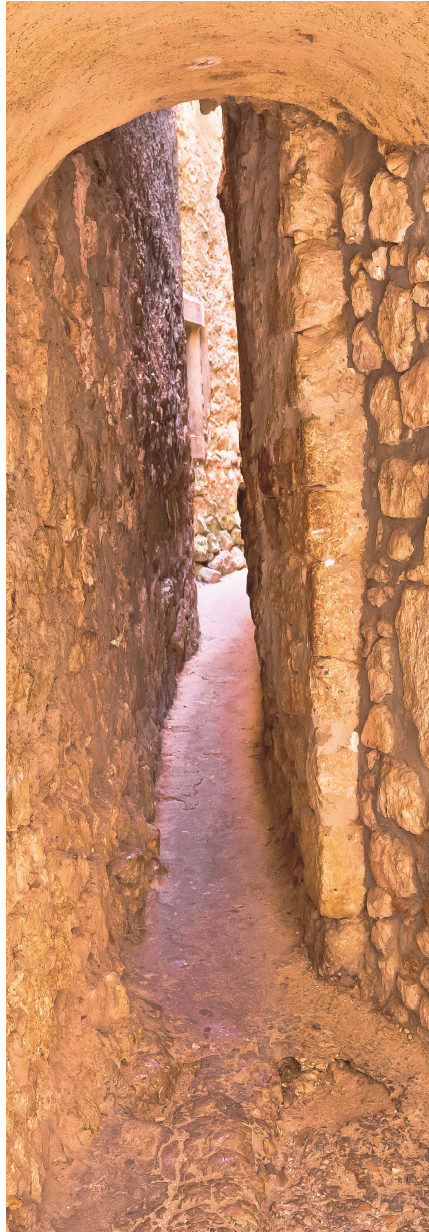

FROM THE
Pastor's Desk

Will only a few be saved?

This was the question posed to Jesus as he was on his way to Jerusalem. Our concern has been to know whether we will be saved or get to heaven. What do we need to do to get to heaven? One thing is certain by our own merits we can't be saved. If salvation were based on our own merits, it would not be possible simple because the scripture says *"All have sinned and fall short of the glory of God"* (Romans 3/23). It is only God who can save us when we believe in Jesus Christ; (Ephesians 2/8-9) who died for our sins that we need to repent and ask his forgiveness. What matters to Him is the attitude of our heart, our honesty, that in all humility we need to surrender to Him. We do not deserve salvation but he simply grants it to us in faith.

The Bible says, *"God so loved the world that He gave His only Son, Jesus Christ, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish, but have eternal life"* (John 3:16). Jesus said, "I came that they may have life and have it abundantly"—a complete life full of purpose (John 10:10). But here's the problem:

We have all done, thought or said bad things, which the Bible calls "sin." The Bible says, the result of sin is death, spiritual separation from God (Romans 6:23). But what we learn in Romans 5/20 is that God's grace is enough to cover all sins. The Bible is full of people who were saved from sin. We have the example of Paul, a persecutor of Christians in his early years by putting them in jail. (Acts 8/3) The thief on the cross who was promised paradise, Mathew the tax collector was called to be an Apostle. Peter who denied Jesus was entrusted with the keys of the kingdom and many other people. The prophet Isaiah in 50/2 says that there is no one beyond God's ability to save and therefore we must respond in faith and receive the free gifts of eternal life.

Who then can be saved? All those who accept Him as their Savior and Lord because it is God who desires that all men be saved (Mathew 23/37: 1Timothy 2/4). In order to save us from condemnation Jesus Christ died for our sake and rose to life again so that we could live forever. Jesus is the only way to God as he says *"I am way, and the truth, and the life; no one comes to the Father, but through me"* (John 14/6). If it is your desire to be saved, then look to Jesus Christ, Lord and redeemer. Be under his guidance, learn to trust Him and place all your cares unto Him and He will lead you to eternal life.

CHURCH FIRE PLAN

In an effort to be ready for the possibility of a fire, fire drills will be conducted in the coming months, one for each weekend Mass. If the alarm ever goes off, it will be accompanied by flashing lights. The Presider or Deacon will make an announcement that it is the fire alarm and to please follow the directions of the Ushers and other helpers with **orange flags**. You will be directed out row by row starting from the back. Be sure that kneelers are up for ease of movement out of the pew. Remember that not all three doors may be accessible in the event of a fire so you need to pay attention as to which door you are being led.

Once you get out the doors, go to where the orange flags are in the middle of the parking lots so as to be out of the way of emergency vehicles. Please move quickly and quietly in case other announcements need to be made. Those who may need some help will be assisted by Ushers or other helpers. If you see people who might need some help, please offer it, and if they accept, move as fast as the person is able. **It is important that everyone take a fire alarm seriously – you don't know if it is a drill or an actual fire and your actions could save your life and/or that of others. Calm and patience are necessary from everyone and cooperation greatly appreciated.**

As we have the drills we may find it necessary to alter the plan slightly, but we will make you aware of any changes. Thank you.

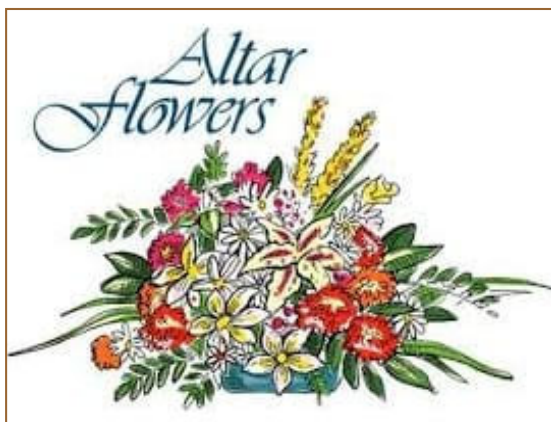

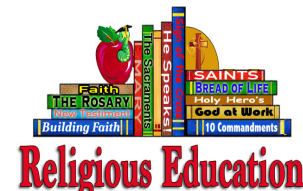

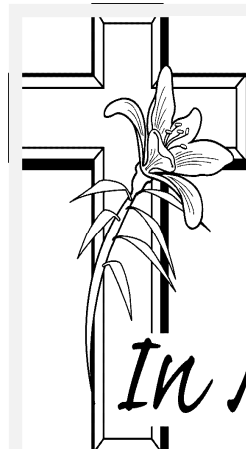
