


Pastor's Desk

Who do you say I am?

We have a certain image of self-regard, our beliefs and the kind of person we believe we are. In our journey of existence, we need to have a strong sense of identity which can bring about comfort and security. Identity helps us to make decisions and guides our behavior. Many people seem to spend a lot of time trying to figure out who they are, what they want, and what they believe. What happens in everyday life can affect our sense of self. This is because identity is created in social relationships. Having a sense of what kind of person you are makes it much easier to decide how you should behave, and to have confidence in your choice of options.

Who do you say Jesus is? One key aspect of Jesus that we must agree upon is that he actually existed as a historical person. He really lived and the New Testament contains the most reliable record of his life and ministry. It's also important to understand his nature. Jesus is fully God and fully human. In trying to understand Christ's Divine and human natures is challenging. Seeking to understand the relationship between Christ's Divine and human natures is part of what is called hypostatic union.

Jesus did not come with a "feel good" message, but to renounce sin and to lead people to seek the Kingdom of God. By renouncing sin, we would follow the path of the Savior. We know that Jesus is The Lord, who he claimed to be. That brings us to the question he asked his disciples, but what about you? Who do you say I am? (Mathew 16/15) Our individual answer is of eternal importance. By doing so, it changes our lives for better and in turn, allows us to change the world for the glory of God.

During the first three sessions of the Parish Transformation process, we discussed the question, "What draws us to St. Isaac Jogues?" Our discussions centered around cherished memories and signs of parish vitality as well as challenges or road blocks to faith and ways to increase parish involvement. Once **we recognize who we are**, it's easier to connect with other similar people and groups.

People with a strong identity often stand out more and are more memorable. I'd guess that the people who are most successful in life, especially people who become famous, all have pretty strong identities. Identities do help us to make decisions and to know how to behave. Having a sense of what kind of person you are makes it much easier to decide how you should behave. Having our own identity as parishioners of Isaac Jogues and the different ministries we enjoy and the friendly environment that exists, gives us a unique identity to our worship of coming together as God's people with a mission.


