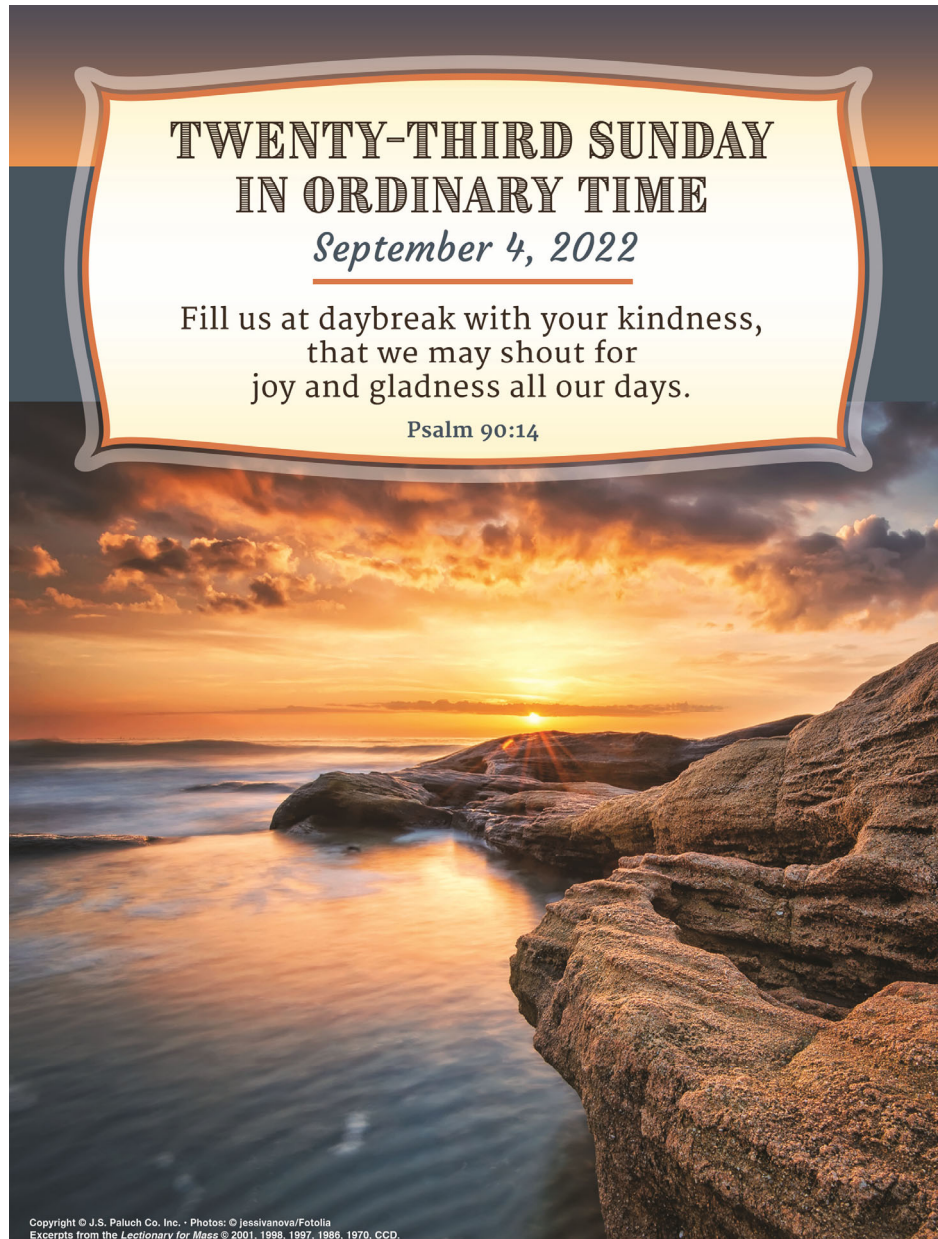

Sacrament of Reconciliation: Saturdays, 11AM - 12:00PM

Sacrament of Matrimony: Must be registered for six months prior to setting the wedding date with an additional six months for necessary preparation.

Note: The following wedding times can be scheduled:

Friday at 5:00 p.m.

Saturday at 1:00 and 3:00 p.m.

Sunday at 3:00 p.m. (Ceremony only)

Sacrament of Baptism: Second and fourth Sunday of each month at 1:30 PM. Baptism Preparation Session must be completed before Baptism. Contact the Parish Office as soon as possible for details.

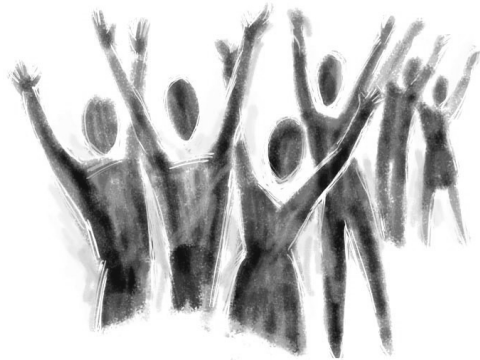

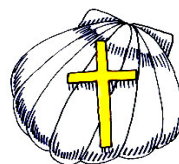
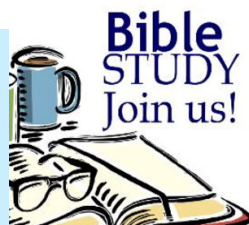
We will continue to review the bulletins and other communications to identify other changes that might be necessary and will keep you informed.

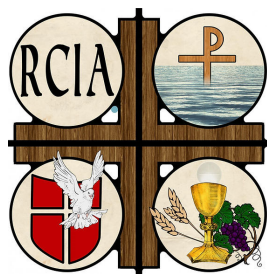

FLU AND PNEUMONIA
SHOTS CLINIC –
Sept. 25



Walgreen pharmacists will be at St. Isaac Jogues Church and at St. Martha Church on Sunday, Sept. 25, to administer flu and pneumonia shots.

Children ages 3 yrs. and older are able to receive the flu shot. If there is a desire for the senior flu shot they will be provided along with the flu and pneumonia shots. Children under 18 will need a parent/guardian with them to sign permissions. Please bring your insurance card or Medicare Part B card. Shots will be administered at St. Isaac Jogues in one of the class rooms, 8:45 –11:45 a.m. and people will enter the building during Mass times from outside door #11. Shots will be administered at St. Martha in the Café from 8:00 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. To help the pharmacists plan the number of shots to bring and which ones, you are asked to sign up on the sheets at the doors of the churches next weekend, Sept. 10-11, and the following, Sept. 17 – 18. You can still come on the 25th even if you don't sign up, but run the risk that they might have to go back to the store to pick up more shots.
