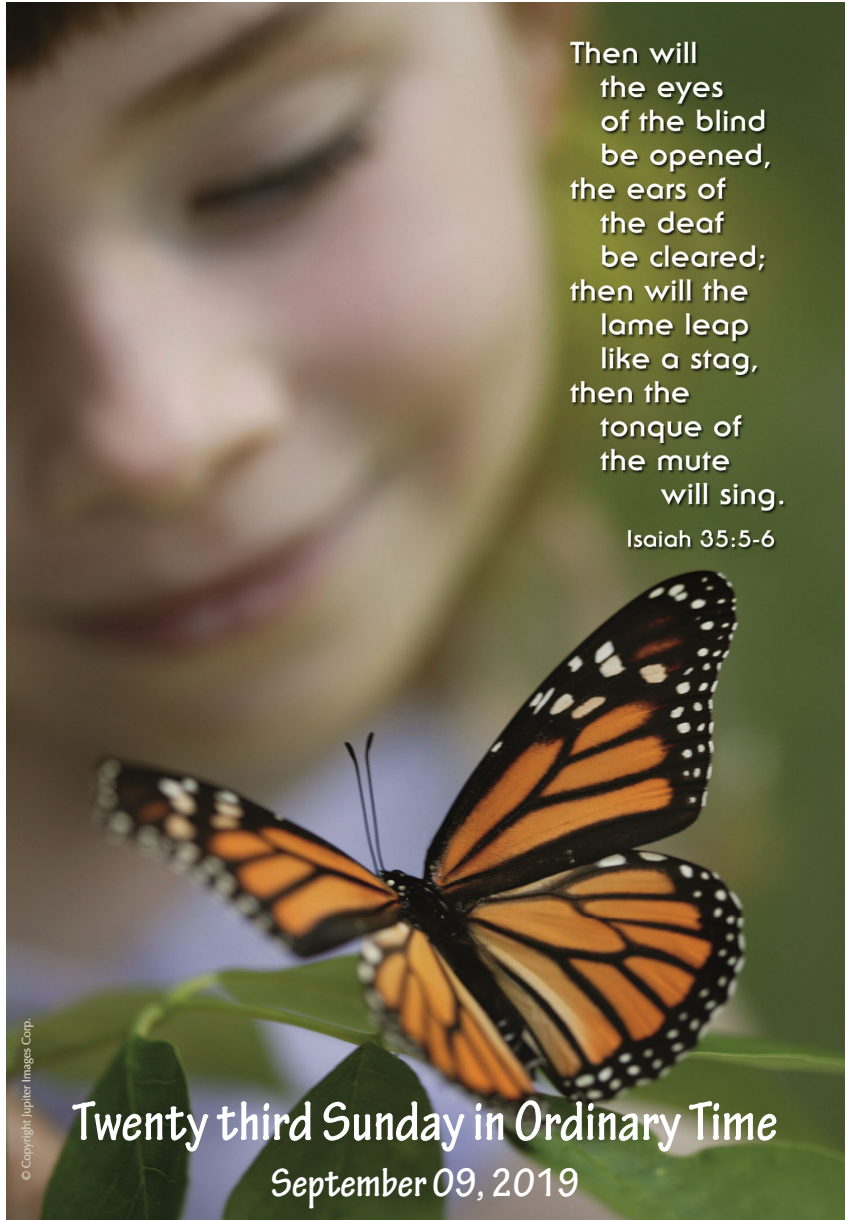

FROM THE
Pastor's Desk

He has done all things well

When one comes across such words as stated in the caption "He has done all things well" what did Jesus do that people gave him the accolade? The gospel of Mark tells us of the cure of the deaf man. What was so special in this miracle of the deaf man? Jesus' in his ministry always carried out healing people who came to him or were referred to him. What is very striking in the cure of the deaf man was when the people brought the man to Jesus, they begged him to lay his hand on him, which Jesus could have done spontaneously, and cured him. But Jesus treats him as an unique individual, respecting his dignity and that he cannot hear. He takes him aside from the crowd and gives him personal attention by communicating with him in a way he could understand. What a powerful way of dealing with the man, by showing great kindness and care.

It is amazing to note that although crowds flocked around Jesus in his ministry, we find people often would go in search of him. Jesus made time for this deaf person, to make him understand what he would be doing to him. No matter how busy we might be, we should not forget to respect the human dignity of each person and treat them with utmost respect.

Reflecting on my own life as a Pastor, called to shepherd my sheep, I come across different types of people with various needs. It is a good lesson for me and for us all that we need to follow our master and Savior Jesus Christ. He is a model to us, caring and being compassionate in our ministries, by being sensible to the needs of the people, both in our Church and in our ministries, or dealing with people in our outreach from parish.

One of the requirements needed in our ministry is to be available to our people. It is not so much in doing things, rather being there as they can sense our presence. I remember some months back, when I was an Associate Pastor, a penitent in the sacrament of reconciliation went on speaking for some time. I allowed the person to speak, and I just listened. The penitent was so grateful to me for just listening. The penitent said it was the first time they felt there was someone who cared.

We live in a fast paced world, constantly on the move, multi- tasking, failing to realize that at times we need to change gears and slow down. Everyone does not function at the same level. It is easy for me to attend to the faithful who come for mass regularly, but to reach out to those people who are on fringes, needs a great effort. That is where we are all called to carry the message of Christ. To do that we need to be disciples, immersed in the teaching of the Lord, living out the experience of his presence and then launching out as missionary apostles to make him known to others. God bless you and let's work with a mind set to reach out, each according to their needs. In doing so the ones who benefit from us will be uttering in like manner, "He does all things well."

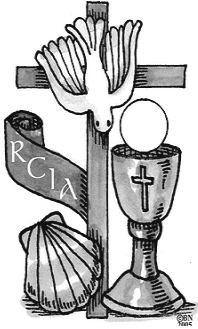

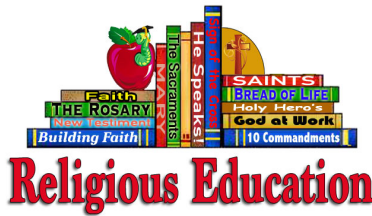
FlockNote Sign-up This Sunday!

In order to do this we are using a new, simple service called FLOCKNOTE. Like sending "notes" to your "flock." Flocknote.

This is all totally free for you to use and it's going to also make it easy for you to stay plugged in to the ministries or groups that you care about, all by text message or email updates. Your information will be completely safe and secure. **And you can unsubscribe from any updates at any time!**
