24<sup>th</sup> Sunday Ordinary Time, Year C, Sunday, September 11, 2022.

Anniversaries come and go, each one marks a particular event or events that still remain in our minds and hearts. We all bow our heads this day in remembrance of the terrorist attacks of Sept. 11, 2001. We are horrified by the results of such evil in our world. We remember the thousands of individual lives taken away, the unbearable pain of grief of the survivors and family and friend and the endurance and strength of countless first responders and the multitude of heroes. It is a heart breaking powerful sight at the Memorial of 911. There are names of the deceased engraved at the edge of the imprints of the World Trade Towers. The sound of water rushing down into the immense fountain leaves the visitor with an awareness of holy ground.

The First Reading this weekend describes Moses as sort of a ('first responder') a mediator of God's mercy. He must confront a "stiff necked people who have become depraved" and turned aside from God's way. Instead of following God they have created and worship a false god. Moses must ask forgiveness from Yahweh on behalf of a people who have rejected Him.

The Second Reading this weekend is from St. Paul's Letter to Timothy. Paul recalls a time when as a persecutor of Christians he rejected Christ. At the lowest moment of his life, Paul is blinded by the heaviness of his sin. Through conversion he came to experience the response of Divine mercy. "Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners of these I am the foremost."

Jesus responds to criticism from others as he eats with sinners. He responds to this situation with a teaching. In the famous parable of the "merciful father" in the Gospel of Luke, we remember the son who turned away from a loving father so that he might live a wild and free life. He appeared to have no concern about the consequences of actions until life fell apart. He reached the bottom. 'Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you; I no longer deserve to be called your son.' His father responded with mercy: 'Quickly bring the finest robe and put it on him; put a ring on his finger and sandals on his feet. Take the fattened calf and slaughter it. Then let us celebrate with a feast, because this son of mine was dead, and has come to life again; he was lost, and has been found.' The joy of the reunion celebration was not shared as the older son experienced resentment over his merciful father.

God's Word challenges us on this 24th Sunday in Ordinary time to look at the power of God's mercy and the gift of healing in our life. How do we respond?

Another powerful image found in the debris at Ground Zero in Manhattan is the towering set of steel beams in the formation of a cross. This Wednesday, September 14<sup>th</sup>, we will celebrate the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross. This is a reminder that healing and hope comes about when we truly reflect on the power of the cross of Christ. We see how God loved us through the cross; He gave his life for the forgiveness of the world. We pray during the Stations of the Cross: "We adore you o Christ and we praise you because by your holy cross you have redeemed the world."

## Church Renovation Update

We received our full permits from the Village of Niles and work continues!

The floor of the church has been levelled by applying a coating to the concrete. That work is completed.

The contractors are continuing demolition work to remove the old radiator covers from the walls which will be patched and painted.

The architect just completed a revised plan for the Americans for Disabilities Act (ADA) compliant restroom which is going to be installed in the same area off of the narthex. The doorway will be moved to open up behind a wall near the stairs to the choir loft. The contractor is now working on adjusted project costs and timelines to help us keep track of timelines and funding.

Flooring materials, tile, carpet, etc. is on track for delivery. So far no supply or delivery delays.

We just discovered another costly issue. We found broken drain tiles outside of the church on the Holy Family Room wall which is causing leaking/some flooding in the boiler room. In addition, one of the sump pumps is not functioning. Repairs could cost \$40K! We expect work to begin later this week.

We will certainly share more information as we move forward.

Please remember there is no capacity to store fresh foods, meat or bread and we cannot accept outdated items. Your support will assist those in need. Thank you!

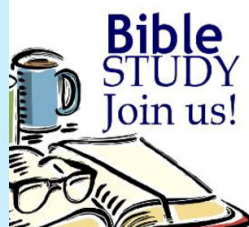

FLU AND PNEUMONIA  
SHOTS CLINIC –  
Sept. 25

**Walgreen pharmacists  
will be at St. Isaac  
Jogues Church and  
St. Martha Church on  
Sunday, Sept. 25, to administer flu and  
pneumonia shots.**

Children ages 3 yrs. and older are able to receive the flu shot. If there is a desire for the senior flu shot they will be provided along with the flu and pneumonia shots. Children under 18 will need a parent/guardian with them to sign permissions. Please bring your insurance card or Medicare Part B card. Shots will be administered at St. Isaac Jogues in one of the class rooms, 8:45 –11:45 a.m. and people will enter the building during Mass times from outside door #11. Shots will be administered at St. Martha in the Café from 8:00 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. To help the pharmacists plan the number of shots to bring and which ones, you are asked to sign up on the sheets at the doors of the churches next weekend, Sept. 10-11, and the following, Sept. 17 – 18. You can still come on the 25<sup>th</sup> even if you don't sign up, but run the risk that they might have to go back to the store to pick up more shots.

Volunteers to help with the registration process and light refreshments are sought for both churches.
