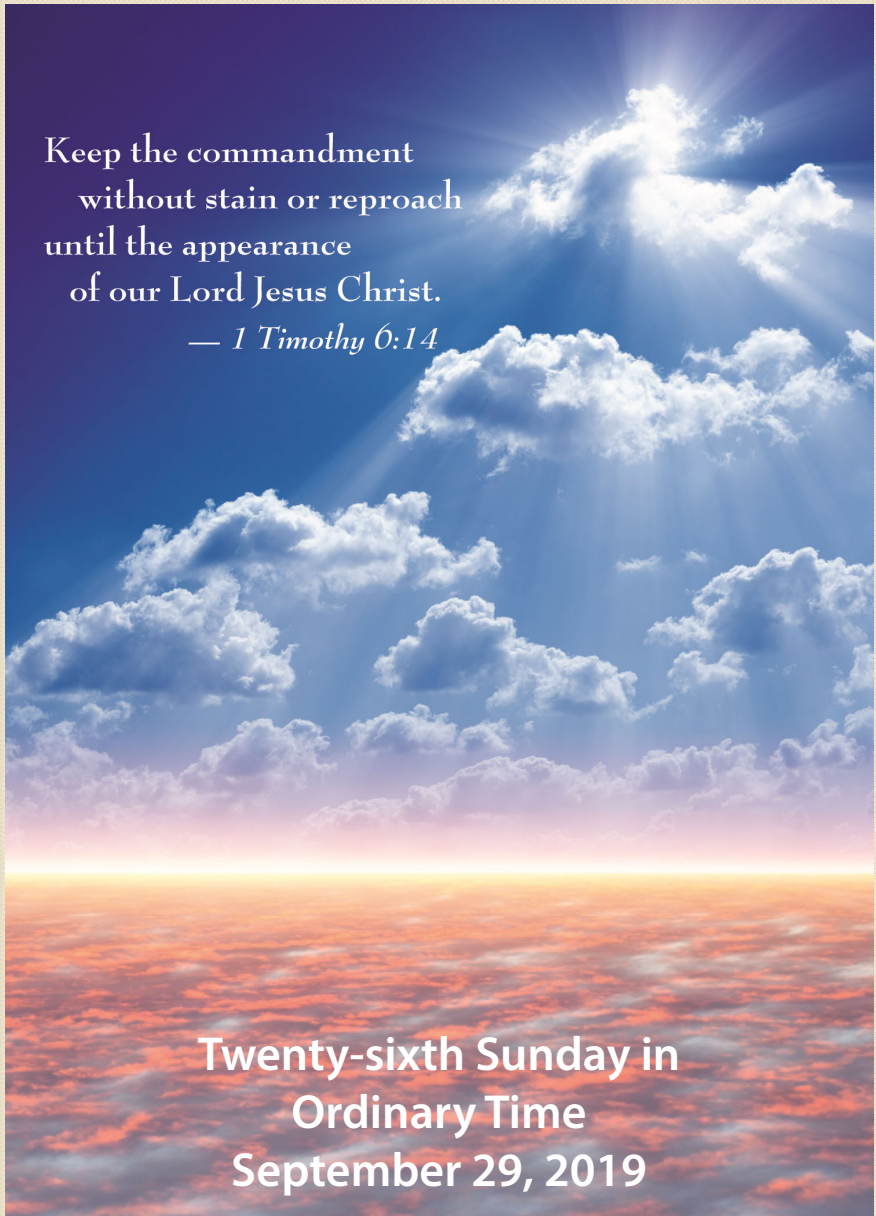

## Campaign Update

I am sure by now most of us have seen the exterior work of the church being carried out and I'm happy to say, it is almost coming to an end. The work of the exterior church began in early July 2019 by cutting some trees and bushes for the contractors to carry out the work conveniently without any hassle. They have done a fine job of ripping through the walls and scrapping wherever necessary. As per our request and design they carried out the work well and now we see how beautiful it looks from the outside. The work would have been completed by the end of September as planned but we encountered some challenges along the way. As a result we had to find some solution to it. With all said and done the narthex's door has to be completed. We are replacing the old door of the church with ADA compliant doors. The doors should be installed over the next few weeks. You will also see our new cross, which will be mounted on the church front over the next few weeks as well.

I am so excited to see the church has a new look from outside and you too will agree with me that it adds to the freshness of the worship site. For a while during week days we were using the Holy Family Room for our week day masses. We are now returning back to church for masses during week days from Monday, September 30, 2019. The narthex door and the cross at the entrance to the church is yet to be fixed and so the main entrance will remain closed for public use like other weekends and the excess to the church will be through other side doors.

Well, the good news is the committee has been working with the Architects on the interior designs of the church. A couple of meetings have taken place and initial pricing is underway. Once we get a firm idea of cost, a plan will be drawn for the interior. The contractors have to bid for the work. We are hopeful to get all the paper work done so we can begin the interior work of the church at the beginning of 2020.

With whatever money we have right now we will begin with the interior of the church and I know we are all excited to get the church work completed before Easter. I want to thank everyone for their patience through the renovation. I would also take this opportunity to thank you for your support in helping us raise the amount through our campaign for the Renovation & Restoration of the church and at the same time request those who have not yet contributed to this campaign to please support us with whatever you wish to give. If you are not able to give now, you can always pledge to fulfill your dream and our reality of a rejuvenated church. Every dollar at this time will be of great help. I know what a challenge it was for me to launch into a campaign to restore a structure that had leakage in different areas of the church building. I feel happy that we are moving forward to provide our people a conducive place of worship. It is only possible because of your support and cooperation. Do continue praying for the success of our campaign and completion of the Church work. Let us work together for a better tomorrow for ourselves and our kids. May our patron St. Isaac Jogues be our inspiration.

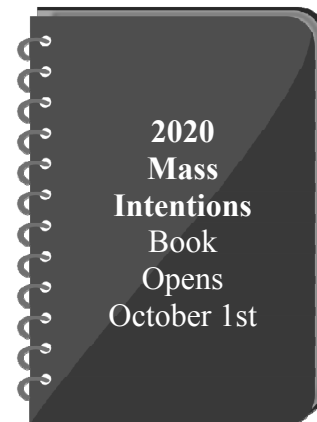


## Religious Education

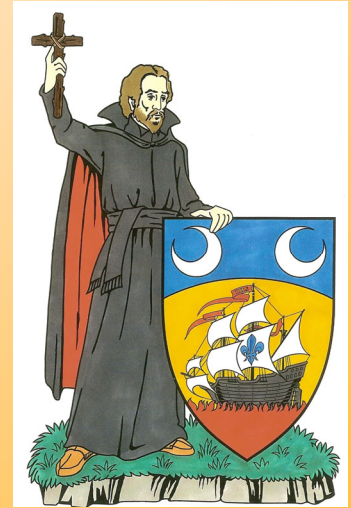

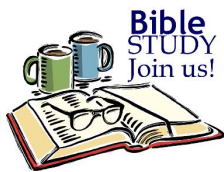

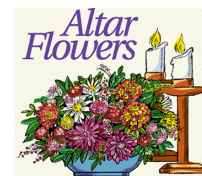
