Pastor's Desk

Let us cherish life together

As the month of October draws in, we focus on “Respect for Life.” But, what does that mean when we say respect life? Do I first of all respect my own life? If so, then would it be just the right thing for me to have a right view of my fellow human beings. As the Bible Says:” Everyone who hates his brother is a murderer, and you know that no murderer has everlasting life remaining in him (1 Jn 3/15)

Life needs to be protected from conception to death because life is sacred and it belongs to God who is the giver of life. For me, respect for life is respect for the process of life. It isn't wrong to chop down trees when young trees are planted to replace them. It is a lack of respect for life to kill a coral reef since it takes an extremely long time to replace them so they can once again serve their important purpose within the process of organic life on earth.

To respect human life is to respect the life process that connects birth and death. How can we do it? Do we respect the process of conception, of a growing fetus, of birth, childhood, maturity, and finally death? Are they considered equally important as a process worthy of respect? Instead do we respect what we want and disrespect the rest? Is this a preferable attitude? Human life is that physical existence that begins with conception and ends with natural death. Respecting life means that you do nothing to harm the life of another.

God wants us to have respect for life—both our own and that of others. Part of the Mosaic Law said: “You must not murder.” (Dt. 5/17) This showed the Israelites that God values human life and that people must value the lives of others. What about the life of an unborn child? Well, according to the Mosaic Law, causing the death of a baby in its mother’s womb was wrong. Yes, even such a life is precious to God (Ex 21/22-23). This means that abortion is wrong.

What about showing respect for our own life? People normally do not want to die, but some risk death for the sake of pleasure. For example, many use tobacco, chew betel nut, or take drugs for recreational purposes. Such substances harm the body and often kill the users. A person who makes it a practice to use these substances does not view life as sacred. These practices are unclean in God’s eyes. (Romans 6/19;12/1) so every effort must be made to treat our life as a precious gift from Him.

Respecting yourself means giving and defining your own worth and value as a human being. Think about this: if you do not respect yourself, it will be more difficult for you to respect anyone else. So it all begins with self-respect!

COME CELEBRATE OUR PATRON SAINT AND OUR FAITH COMMUNIY!


