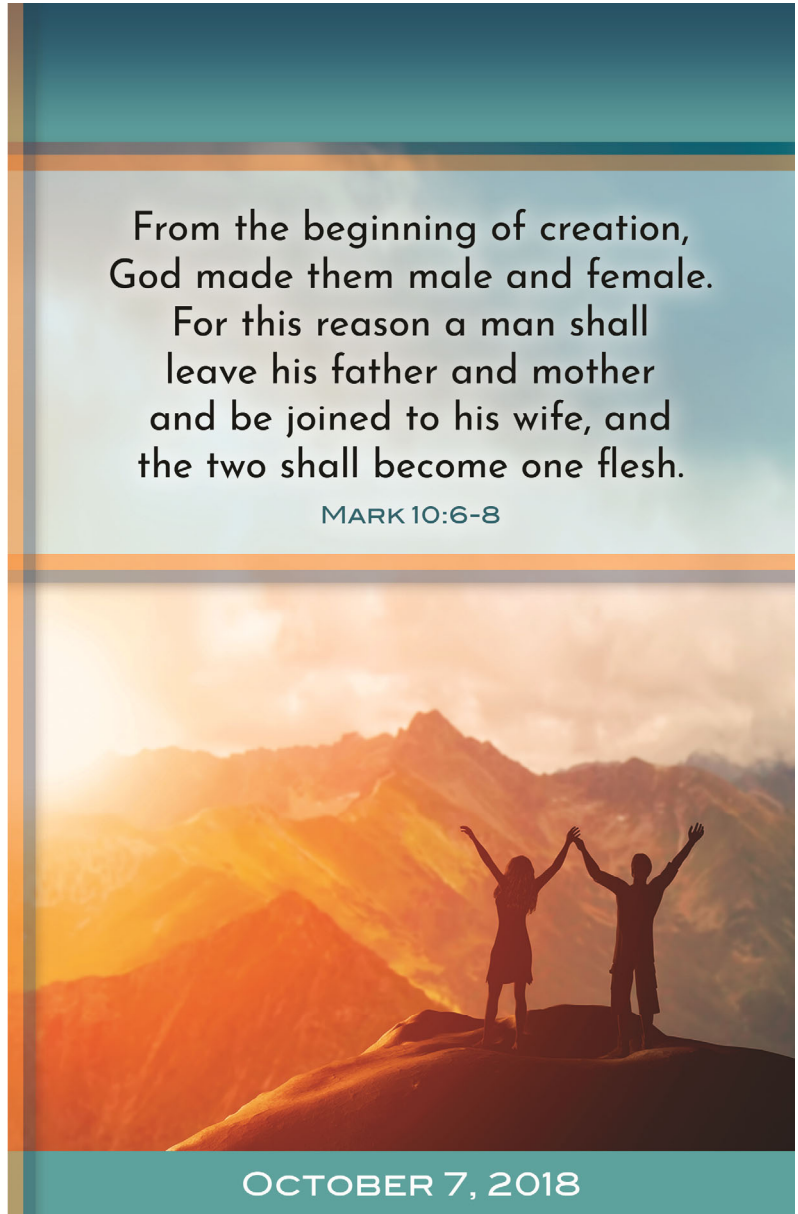

FROM THE  
Pastor's Desk

They are no longer two  
but one flesh

When you decide to get married, the two individuals are committing to becoming "one" with their spouse. Although the two become one, yes, they both need to maintain their sense of individuality that allows them to be there for each other when need be. But you also need to realize that your actions and decisions no longer only affect yourself, but another as well.

Now as they see themselves as **part** of a newly formed partnership and really appreciate what that means for their life and that of their partner, it can go a long way towards helping them drop their other bad habits. Realizing that their actions now can have a strong impact on the life of their partner, they need to begin to shape up financially, drop their irrational jealousy, stop keeping secrets, and check their jealousy at the door.

Jesus' point is that married couple is something that "God has joined together." Marriage is not of a human origin; it originated with God and is part of the way that God designed the human race to live. In saying "let no one separate" a marriage, Jesus taught that divorce is not God's plan. Once a couple is married, they have been joined together by God Himself, and the union is meant to be for life. This principle holds true despite the faith of the couple. If God has joined them together, then no human being has the right to break that union.

Getting married to the person you love is a huge step, one that often invokes plenty of soul-searching. You want to be a partner for your spouse for what will hopefully be the rest of your lives, but it can be difficult to know how to begin down the road of self-improvement. Every couple to be married is going to face their own unique challenges, but one should remember that in marriage, one should not be waiting to only receive from one's spouse but should be prepared to give oneself for the sake of another. In doing so, one begins to lay the foundation for a new beginning of a family life of love.

God intended humans to be happy and so when the question of marriage was placed before Jesus, he reminds them the intention of God from the beginning by quoting the Scriptures from the book of Genesis, stating that from the beginning of creation, God made them male and female. For this reason a man shall leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh. Let every couple in a relationship understand the purpose of God in creating man and women in his image and likeness, so that they may realize that they have entered into a sacred covenant that has united them in the sacrament of Marriage.



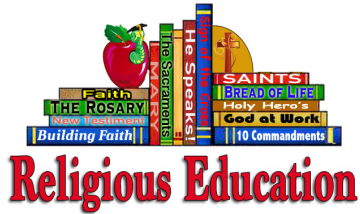
#### ALTAR FLOWERS CAN BE A BEAUTIFUL TRIBUTE

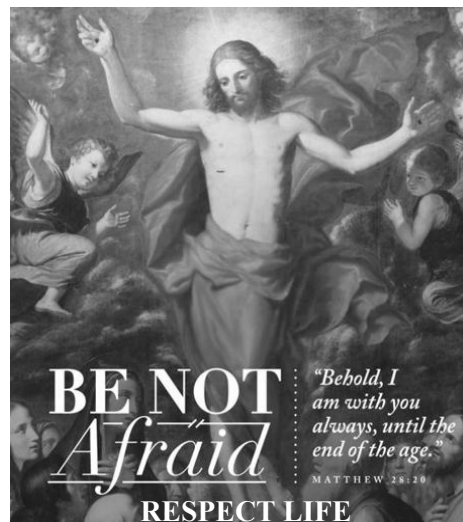
