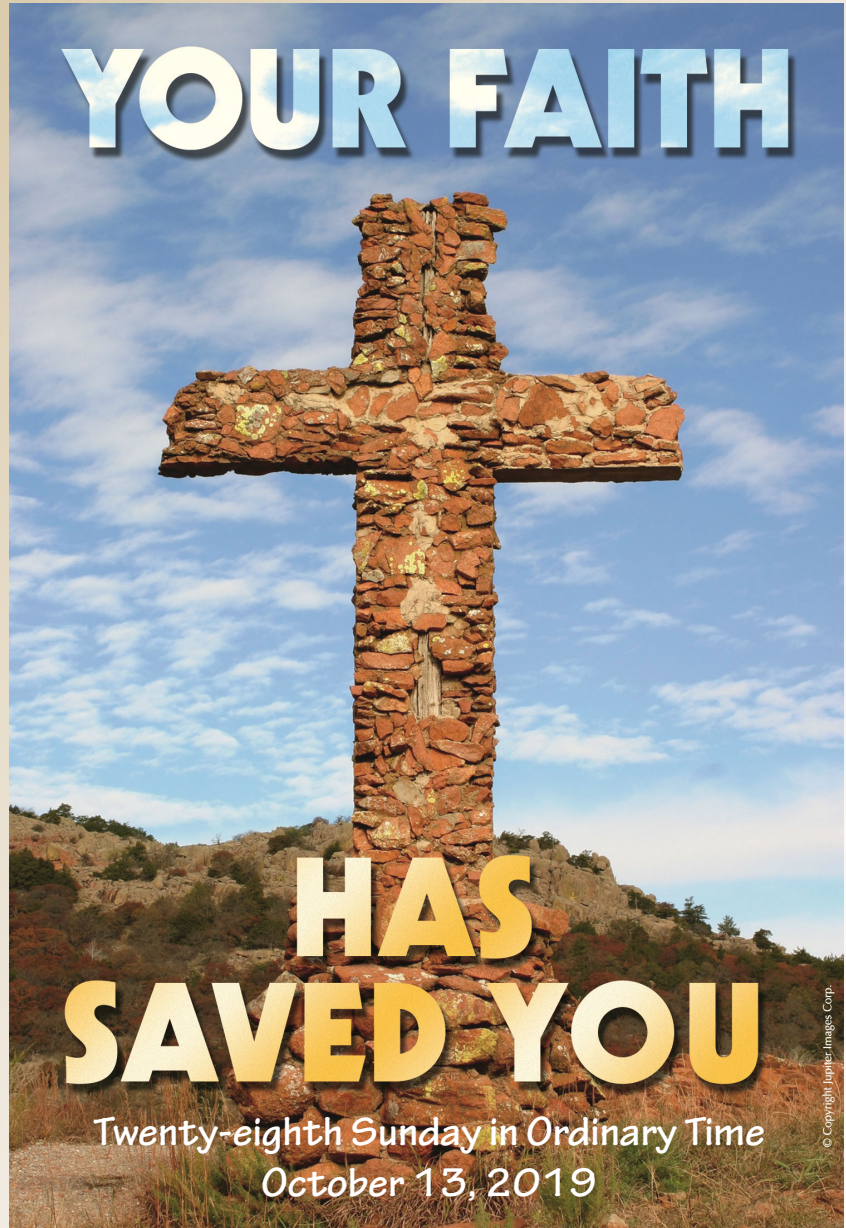
**Sacrament of Matrimony:** Must be registered for six months prior to setting the wedding date with an additional six months for necessary preparation.

## *Your faith has saved you*

One of the things that's evident in the life of Jesus' ministry is that he went about healing people. He didn't do it randomly or healed a passive bystander, rather throughout his ministry people came to him to be healed knowing of the power that he has in him. Jesus would use the expression "Your faith has healed you." What would it mean to us that it is just the faith that led to the healing of a person? By saying your faith has healed you, meant that their confidence in Him (Jesus) led the person to be restored back to good health.

In our life situations we place our faith in doctors when we have to undergo a surgery. Don't we? Similarly, in like manner, we need to place our confidence or trust in God and what we ask of him in faith will be granted. We have to believe in the power of God. Our faith in God will help us to accomplish the things we look for. In the gospel text Lk 17/11-19 tells us that Jesus met ten lepers who requested that he have pity on them. Jesus responded saying show yourself to the priests and as they followed the instructions given to them they were cleansed because they believed in Jesus. Had they to doubt Jesus and expected that he would use some miraculous power to heal them then and there; they would not have experienced the cure they received. Only the Samaritan man returned to thank God because of the faith he had in Jesus' and Jesus said to him "Stand up and go; your faith has saved you." The Samaritan man not only got the physical healing like the other ten, but because of his trust in God he was rewarded for his faith in Jesus as Jesus said to him "Your faith has saved you'

There are a few examples of people that Jesus healed before eliciting their faith. We have the example of a disabled man at the pool of Bethesda in Jn 5/1-11. He only chose this man of the many people out there to be healed. And the interesting part of it is that all Jesus asked the man was if he wanted to be healed. The man responded in a confused way saying that he cannot get in before others and there is no one to carry him to the pool. Jesus healed him and the man did not know it was Jesus until later when he learned about Jesus of Nazareth, a rabbi sent by God.

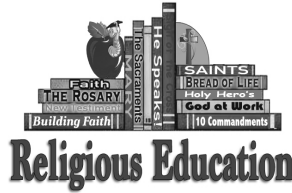
Everyone whom Jesus willed to be healed was healed. Sometimes he healed those who expressed their faith in Him, and He made a point of emphasizing the condition of their heart: "Your faith has made you well." Other times, in His great mercy, He healed those who had no faith and later drew them to Himself. As his followers, we are invited to participate in this same healing ministry. Not only this, but as we trust in Christ, we come to realize Christ's unshakeable trust in **us** to do great things. Our faith can heal us of many infirmities, but what we need to do is place our trust or confidence in God who has all the powers and can carry out what we ask of Him in faith. Our faith has to be in quality and it can be as small as that the size of a mustard seed. When we have that, Jesus would say to us "Your faith has saved you"

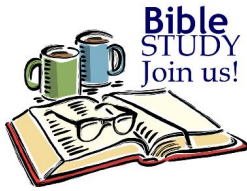

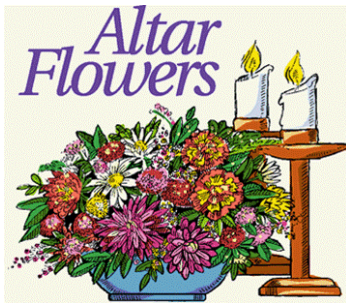
