FROM THE
Pastor's Desk

Come, follow me

Often we have heard these words, come, follow me. Even without someone requesting us to follow, consciously or unconsciously, we are being led or influenced by people to follow them. Everyone follows something: like sports personalities, film stars, musicians, popular culture, selfish desires, etc. Jesus' call to follow him in many cases was with regard to his twelve disciples, but other times, he was speaking to anyone who wanted what he had to offer like in the text of today's gospel (Mark 10/17-30) sell what you have, and give to the poor and you will have treasure in heaven; then come follow me.

The disciples who responded to the call of Jesus had to leave everything behind so that they could make Jesus their priority in life. They left behind their family, friends and their comfort zone and responded to his call. So others will have to leave behind a job or dream that conflicts with God's call on their life. Everyone who follows Jesus will be changed in such a way that they must leave behind some of their former ways of life that are sinful and dishonoring to God. In other words Jesus becomes the priority and everything else is secondary.

Jesus clearly made it known to the people and his followers about following him and what it means, that one should be prepared to face division in family life on account of the gospel values. His teaching will bring about a discord or division in the family. To truly follow Christ means we do not follow anything else. Jesus said whoever wants to be my disciple must deny themselves and take up their cross daily and follow him.

These words resounded in my ears; years back and it does still resound today. It is not enough that we respond to his call; we need to constantly position ourselves to listen for his calling. It involves a challenge of responding to his invitation, of carrying out His will in our life and denying those very things which distract us to sin. Following Jesus means striving to be like Him. He always obeyed His Father, so that's what we need to strive for to be like him. To truly follow Christ means to make Him the Boss. That's what it means to make Jesus Lord of our lives. Every decision and dream is filtered through His Word with the goal of glorifying Him in everything. We are not saved by the things we do for Christ (Ephesians 2/8-9) but by what He has done for us. Because of His grace, we want to please Him in everything. All this is accomplished as we allow the Holy Spirit to have complete control of every area of our lives. He explains the Scriptures empowers us with spiritual gifts, comforts and guides us. To follow Christ means we apply the truths we learn from His Word and live as if Jesus walked beside us in person.



RESPECT LIFE MONTH: EVERY LIFE CHERISHED – CHOSEN – SENT

In 1531, when the indigenous peoples of Mexico were subjugated and the practice of human sacrifice was still a recent memory, the Mother of God appeared to St. Juan Diego as a pregnant native woman, now known as Our Lady of Guadalupe.

She sent him with miraculous flowers in his cloak to tell the bishop to build a church where people could receive her Son and her loving, tender care. When St. Juan Diego opened the cloak before the bishop, an image of Our Lady was revealed that remains to this day. The chapel was quickly built, millions embraced Christianity, and the Church increased its protection of the indigenous peoples. By embracing the mission entrusted to him, St. Juan Diego helped bring Christ's transforming love to cultures gripped by oppression and death. (continued next week)






Religious Education


