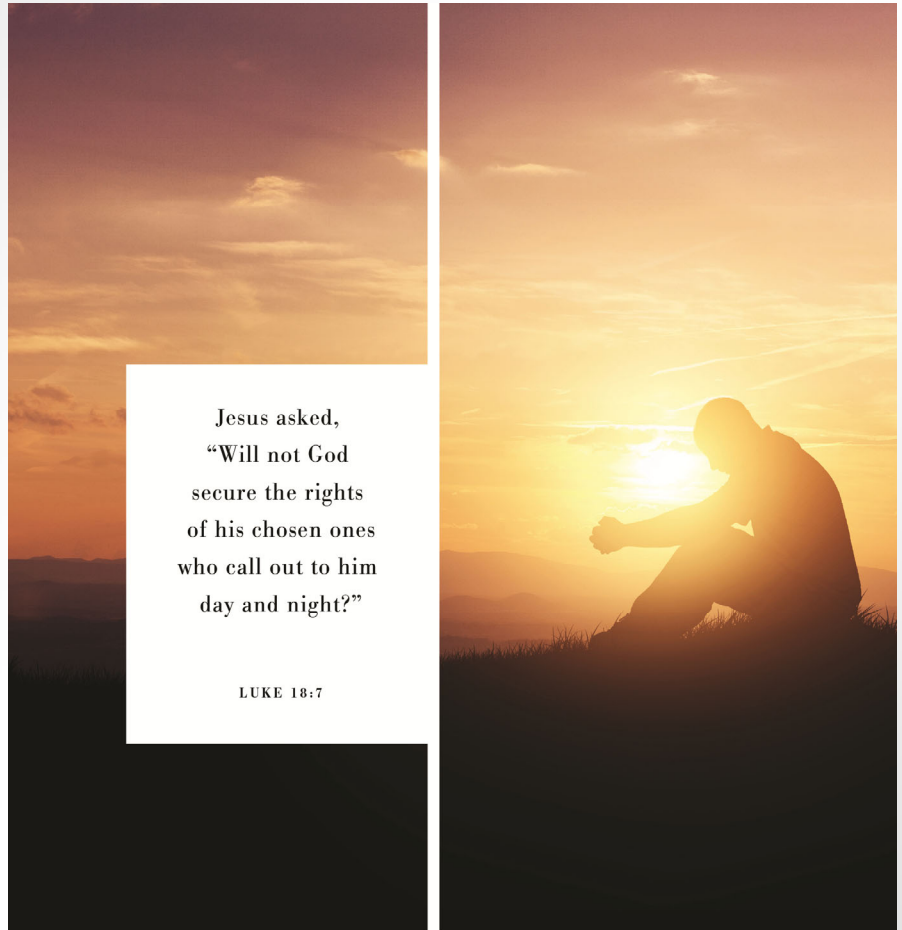

Taste of St. Isaac Jogues

One of the most beautiful traditions of the parish is the celebration of the feast day of St. Isaac Jogues known as "Taste of St. Isaac Jogues." The celebration is unique in the sense that the Patron Saint left his own country of France to come to North America to unite the people of God by working with the Natives. The month of October used to be a month for October Fest celebrations for the parishioners for many years. From October 2013 the celebration turned into the Taste of St. Isaac Jogues. It is an honor for us to walk in his footsteps. In our own little ways we carry out the liturgical celebration for the day followed by the taste. This year we have Bishop Mark Bartosic as the main celebrant at the Eucharist followed by the taste.

The celebration not only unites people to come together as a parish family for the taste but more than that the sharing of the food representing at least 12 countries. The parish comprises many people with different ethnic background. Through their food it shows us that in the world there are many countries and their representation helps us to know them through their cultural dishes. People who willingly come forward to share their food with others give us a feeling of oneness and that is our strength. It is not so much that we come to eat but to share with others our culture, taste and the likes through the different set ups for each country. Each country has designed its taste for food based on its produce and availability and that has led each group to opt for certain food items. Besides food we have entertainment in music & dance. It is a day to praise and thank God and celebrate our diversity.

Jesus fed thousands of people by multiplying the bread and fish offered to him. Something in like manner happens when people share the little they have; it has always brought joy participating in such celebration. There are quite many families and people in the parish who are very generous and on account of their generosity; it becomes possible for us to carry out this celebration in a unique way. Now it is the Taste of St. Isaac Jogues that people look forward to. Our Feast Day celebration gives us an opportunity to reach out through this ministry of the parish to those who do not know God by sharing our food.

St. Paul would say that God loves a generous giver. Our patron St. Isaac Jogues dedicated his very life to work to uplift the tribal people by leaving his country of birth and by shedding his blood to make Christ known to others; thereby teaching us that playing our part or role in the mission of the Lord will lead us to greater joy. What better way than to have the spirit of our patron saint to be at the service of our people? The celebrations will come and go but our patron saint teaches us that in order to add taste in the life of others, one has to be broken just as our patron was who followed greatly the teaching of our Lord and Master. Let the celebration of the parish be a real taste where we manifest brotherhood, comradery and genuine love for our fellow brethren.

As required by Archdiocesan policy, we respectfully submit the Fiscal Year 2019 Annual Report to the parish (without Pledge Campaign income or expenses). The annual report has been reviewed and approved by the Parish Finance Committee and accepted by the Vicariate II Office and Parish Operations. The parish remains financially stable. St. Isaac Jogues is without debt and continues to pay ordinary expenses on time. Our deficit reduction (green envelope) collection and our Annual Catholic Appeal & TTWCI rebate helped cover the shortage in the ordinary operating expenses. However, while Sunday collections continue to decline, we find it necessary to make changes where possible that have the least impact on parishioners or ministries. As good stewards we are responsible to do what's necessary for the good of St. Isaac Jogues Church. In 2020 St. Isaac Jogues along with St. Martha and St. John Brebeuf will begin the Renew My Church process during which we will be guided towards a sustainable long-term objective. Through our collective prayer and discernment and your continued spiritual and financial support we will find God's path for St. Isaac Jogues.

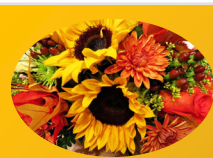

Dates fill up quickly, so please book in advance by calling the rectory at 847-967-1060.

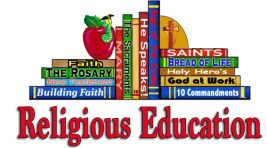

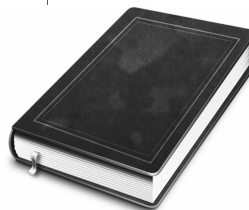
