Pastor's Desk

One Family One Mission

Each Year we celebrate the World Mission Sunday. This year it is on October 22. When we reflect on the mission of Christ and His call to us, so it is our bounded duty that we be generous in our contribution to protect and promulgate this great saving act of building over one thousand local churches in Asia and Africa, the Pacific Islands, and part of Latin America and Europe. Through the work of these churches, and their witness to Christ, the poor receive practical help and experience God's love and mercy, His hope and peace.


This year, we are reminded by Pope Francis that Mission is at the Heart of Christian Faith; the materials for World Mission Sunday from the Society for the Propagation of the Faith encourage an ongoing formative relationship for mission, offering portraits of today's missionaries inspired by the words of our *chief missionary, Pope Francis*.

It is a call to all of us of our role in the Mission of the Church of Christ, when Jesus said to the Pharisees " Repay to Cesar what belongs to Cesar and to God what belongs to God." What does that mean? Does it imply Jesus saying "pay the taxes," it would turn the common people (the people of the land) against Him. It would also turn the zealots against Him. If He said, "don't pay taxes," then the Herodian's (agents of the king) have it from His mouth that He is fomenting rebellion. If they reported something like that with grounds, the arrest would have happened sooner.

The key thing to note in regards to Jesus' answer is the relationship between the 1st century Jews and the Roman Empire. The Romans were an occupying force that had a say over every matter in Jewish life. Even the Temple was subject to this and still operating only at the mercy of the Roman officials in Israel. There were many forms of both organized and unorganized resistance to the Romans in and around the time of Jesus.

Jesus made his mind clear when he asked them for a coin and asked whose head is on it? By saying "Repay to Cesar what belongs to Cesar and to God what belongs to God." Since the coin had the image of Cesar, give him his dues whereas to God belongs your very person as we have been created in His image and likeness. As we belong to God as a family, so the mission for us is one to establish His kingdom here on earth by our monetary aid and spiritual support. Thank you for your generous support to the missions. May god bless you and your families.

THE WILD GOOSE IS LOOSE: Series on the Holy Spirit



THE BOOK OF LIFE


