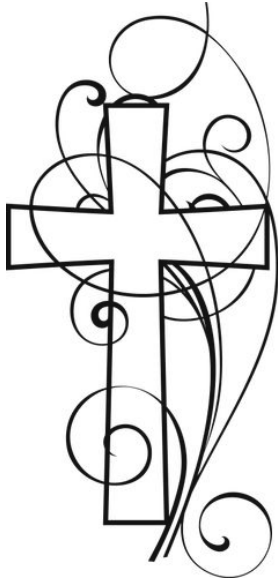


Please join us in extending a warm welcome to our new Director of Music, Bradley Whaley. Brad assumed the full-time music director position for All Saints Parish effective October 1st.

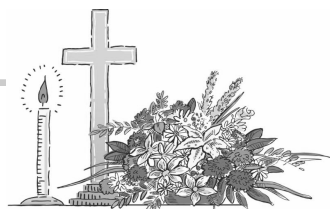

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Today we join Catholics worldwide in the annual Eucharistic celebration of World Mission Sunday. We remember our common call to both live the mission that is entrusted to us and proclaim the person of Christ and His message. Pope Francis reflects on this year's theme: "You shall be my witnesses" (Acts 1:8). He emphasizes the call to every Christian to bear witness to Christ, to participate in a mission of universal evangelization, and to seek strength and guidance from the Holy Spirit.

Beginning in 1822, the universal fund of the Society for the Propagation of the Faith provided approximately seven million dollars in help to the new and growing Church in the United States. Blessed Pauline Jaricot began this work 200 years ago and established a network of prayer and collections for missionaries so that the faithful could actively participate in the mission "to the ends of the earth." Her vision would lead to World Mission Sunday, which helps the Pope support global missionary activity.

Your prayers and generous support today sustain communities of faith in more than 1,100 mission dioceses in Asia, Africa, the Pacific Islands, and parts of Latin America and Europe as they proclaim the Gospel, build the Church, and serve the poor. When you contribute to the World Mission Sunday collection, you provide for the formation of our seminarians and religious men and women. You assist in building the schools and orphanages that care for children in places few visit. Missionaries can build churches in areas with scarce resources. Priests, religious Sisters and Brothers, and lay leaders can buy food and the bare essentials that make it possible to proclaim the Gospel and celebrate the Sacraments.

In this bicentennial anniversary year, I encourage your generosity on World Mission Sunday. Your prayers remain your greatest gift, and your financial support is life-giving to our brothers and sisters in the world's most vulnerable communities. Applying this to our spiritual life we recognize that often our pride fills us and spoils our appetite for God's mercy and love. A good portion of humility is needed as we realize that we need God’s grace. In the Gospel today we take note: “whoever exalts himself will be humbled and the one who humbles himself will be exalted Luke 18:14.

In our Catholic Catechism #2559: "Humility as the foundation of prayer. Prayer is the raising of our minds and hearts to God or requesting good things from God but when we pray do we speak from the height of our pride and will or out of the depths of a humble and contrite heart? Only when we humbly acknowledge that we do not know how to pray as we ought are we ready to receive freely the gift of prayer."

Let’s allow our prayer to be grounded in humility so that as we place our ultimate trust in God, we will be heard. We looked to Jesus as he shows us humility in the incarnation and passion. At every Mass we humble ourselves to receive his love and mercy. Another parental advice was “ always be humble and serving.” I am humbled by this opportunity to serve you as pastor of All Saints Parish.

We give praise and thanks to God, sharing our gratitude to Cardinal Cupich and welcome Bishop Bartosic. He will celebrate the 10:30 am Sunday Mass. During the Mass I will receive a special blessing, lead us in Profession of our Faith and offer an Oath of Fidelity as pastor. Thank you for the welcome and confidence.

We gather with those who are present here at Mass and those unable to attend today. Thank you for everyone who has helped us prepare this celebration especially the pastoral staff and volunteers. Let us continue to reassure one another and pray for each other with our shared faith. The Lord will bless us in a time of Renew My Church. Thank you for your prayers and be assured of my prayers for you and your family.

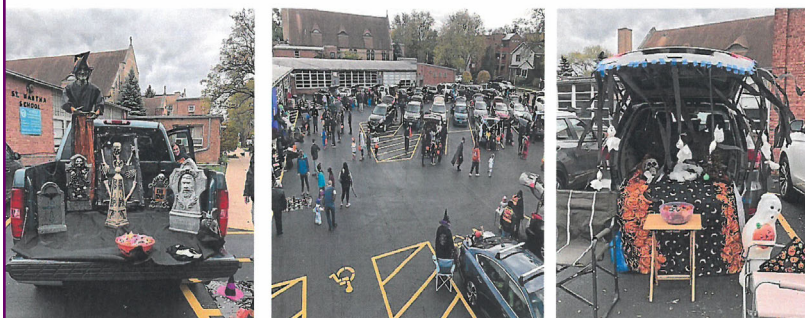
### Volunteers Needed
