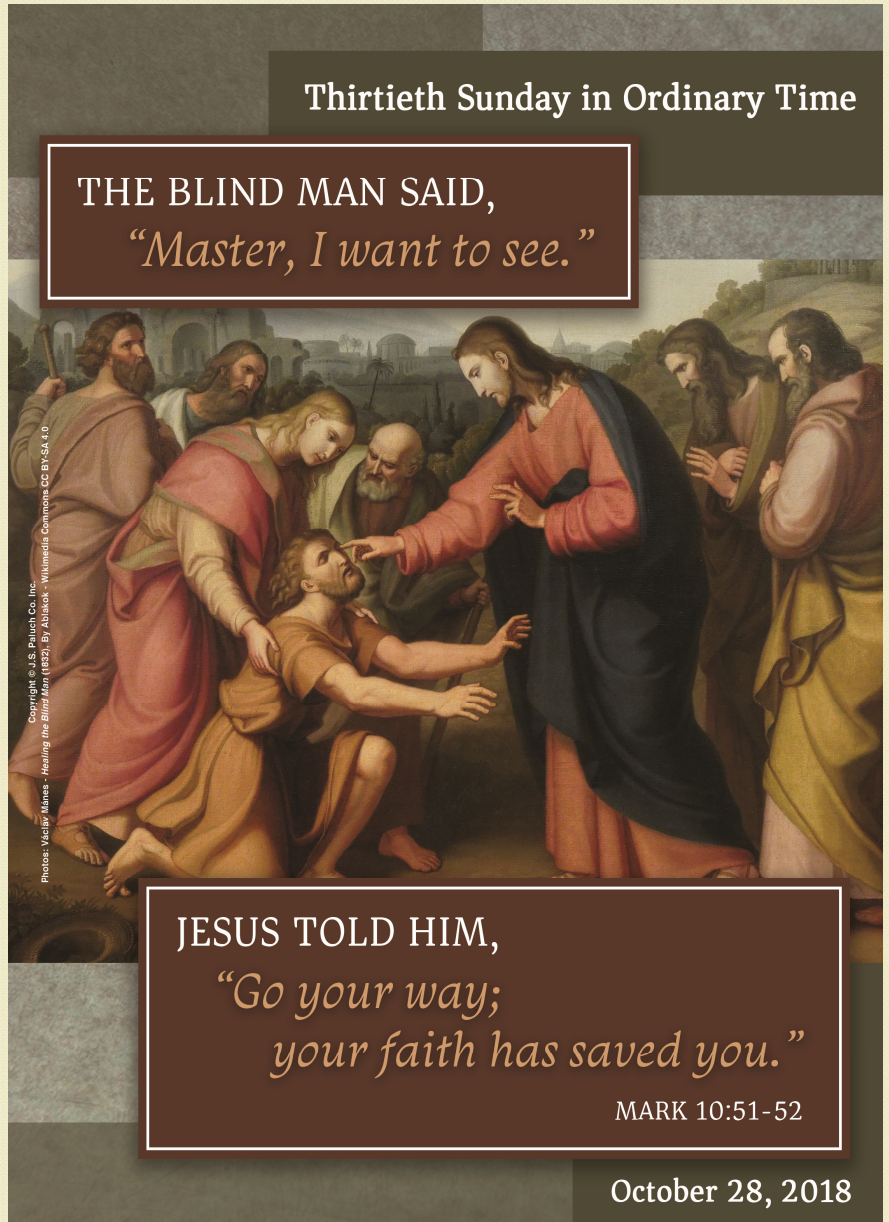
Sacrament of Matrimony: Must be registered for six months prior to setting the wedding date with an additional six months for necessary preparation.

FROM THE
Pastor's Desk

Master, I want to see

The world is beautiful to look at; and we can enjoy the beauty of it due to the gift of the sense of sight. Senses play an important part of our life. Human beings have five senses; the eyes to see, tongue to taste, nose to smell, ears to hear and skin to touch. But the most important organs of sense are our eyes as it allows us to walk freely and safely everywhere. We perceive up to 80 per cent of all impressions by means of our sight. And if other senses such as taste or smell stop working, it's the eyes that best protect us from danger.

It is said that "The eyes are the windows to the soul" is an expression that is often used to describe the deep connection one feels when looking into another's eyes. However, like windows, the eyes work both ways. They are not only important in seeing into another person's soul, but they are also vital in how we view the world around us. Eyes are the most complex organs in our body. We rely on our eyes to navigate and understand our surroundings.

The request of the blind man who was asked by Jesus as to what he wants him to do and he replied saying, Master, I want to see. We have our sight and we can see clearly but there could be a few who are unable to see properly with their eyes. I know how important sight is. When I take my glasses off I realize how important it is for me to have my glasses to read clearly and distinctly. Is it the physical sight that we ask Jesus to restore, or should we request like the blind beggar, to restore our vision spiritually, which has been blurred due to sin, desire for materialism, sexual pleasure, and all other vices that has eroded our body and have taken our innocence away?

The blind beggar not only got back his physical sight but his faith helped him to be healed spiritually. Unless, our sight is restored we would not be able to admire the beauty of the wonders God works in our lives. The Sacraments are gifts to us. Eucharist is one such gift that allows us to have a direct contact with our God in our place of worship. Through the Sacrament of Reconciliation one's soul is purified and is able to see and admire the gifts of God. Let us enjoy these gifts while we have our eyes and use them to glorify God.

With all simplicity then, let us turn to the Lord seeking his help by crying out to Him, Master, I want to see.

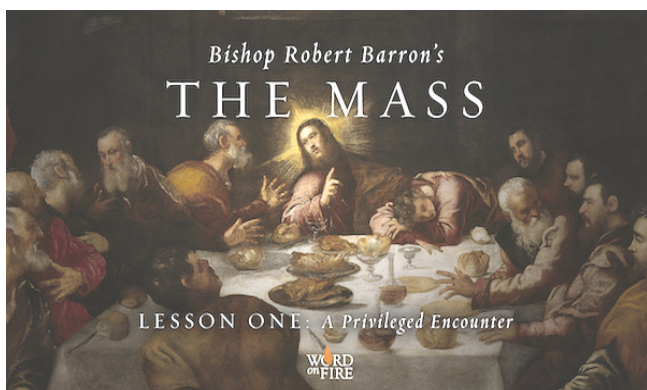

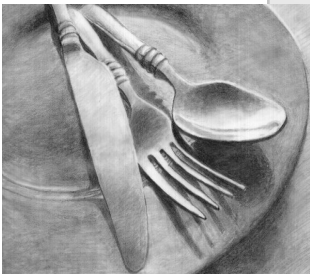
