FEAST OF FAITH

Prayer after Communion

The rites following the reception of Communion
are very short. It is as if the Church is saying to us that
the only way to respond to this great gift is to go forth
and live it! But there are some significant rites yet
before we are sent forth from the Mass. After
Communion, we pray together in silence or sing a
hymn; both are ways to thank God for the gift of the
Son. Then the priest prays another collect, the Prayer
after Communion. This prayer, usually very short,
gathers our prayers into one. It reminds us of what we
have already experienced: in receiving the Eucharist,
we have received a foretaste of the heavenly banquet;
we have eaten the bread of angels. This reality, this
knowledge, should transform us, so that we may
journey through this life with our hearts set on eternal
life, and find in the Eucharist—which is food from
heaven and daily bread—the strength and hope we need
to work toward God's kingdom of justice here and now.

Our Fiscal Year 2021 Annual Report follows which we are required to publish per Archdiocesan mandate. The Annual Report has been submitted to and accepted by the Archdiocese of Chicago. Fiscal Year 2021 was challenging for all of us. COVID continues to make us question our choices. Many people have not yet returned to Mass. While the ordinary income/expenses look difficult, we need to take the Paycheck Protection Loan, Annual Catholic Appeal Rebate and "green envelopes" into consideration. Notes:

As mentioned above, overall income in FY 21 was \$100K lower. Total collections for the year including Sunday, Holy Day, Christmas & Easter were 25-30% lower. Rental income was lower due to COVID restrictions. Fundraising was down over 50% due to COVID restrictions. Fund raising represents our mail raffles, but all other events were cancelled. Thanks to all who supported the mail Raffles! All tenant leases have been renewed.

Line 3700 includes miscellaneous donations, mass stipends, funerals and baptisms.

We did experience expense savings due to the lack of activity on the campus.

Please refer to line 5060. This line includes our 1st Paycheck Protection Loan which has been completely forgiven, together with the "green envelopes". Line 5110 includes our Annual Catholic Appeal rebate. Capital Collections reflects the Pledge Campaign funds that continue.

Overall after a very challenging year, St. Isaac Jogues is sustaining for now. We continue to monitor both income and expenses. Please let us know if we can provide any additional details. God Bless!

Dear Saint Isaac Jogues Parish family,

Last January, I wrote to inform you that the Archdiocese of Chicago had been notified that an allegation of misconduct with an adult woman 17 years ago had been made against your pastor, Father Mario Pereira, SFX. In keeping with our policies, I asked Father Pereira to step aside from ministry while his religious order, the Society of the Missionaries of Saint Francis Xavier investigated the matter.

I have received communication from the superior general of this religious order that their investigation has concluded and has found the allegation to be unsubstantiated. As part of this process, Father Pereira has spent time in reflection and has asked that he continue his ministry in India. I have asked Father Dennis O'Neill to continue as parish administrator while we seek a replacement for Father Mario Pereira.

Please know that I appreciate your prayers and patience while we awaited the results of this process. We take all allegations seriously and are committed to ensuring the men we assign to care for our faithful are fit for ministry. Please continue to keep everyone involved in this matter in your prayers and know that I am praying for you as your parish works toward a vibrant future.

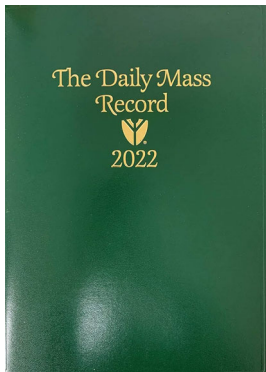

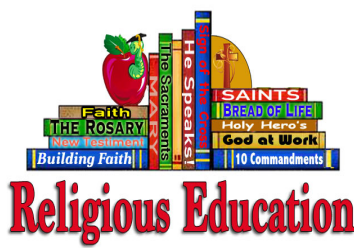
