Pastor's Desk

The greatest among you must be your servant

In every man there is a seed of greatness, for we are made in the image of a great God, whose very presence is impact, whose very being is great. Here Jesus gives us the true answer to our longing: we become great by honoring the greatness in everyone else. Often the Apostles of Jesus had arguments among themselves as to who among them was the greatest, or more powerful than the other. They functioned purely from the standard set by the world of their time until Jesus entered their lives and turned things around with His teaching. It must have been difficult for them to grasp the meaning of it.

To be greater, one tries to be powerful, bigger, stronger, exhibiting his might to prove himself and that is how the world measures the greatness of one to another. The teachings of Jesus focus on the humility of the person rather than his pride and boastful nature of might is right.

In our world, we too try to impress upon another that we are greater than the other in many ways. That is how the weaker section of people are treated as under privileged, deprived of their status, and vulnerable in society. The mission of the Church is the mission of Christ to be totally engaged in upholding the rights and dignity of every individual in Society. It is in being humble and simple in our dealings with people of all spears of life that can truly lead us to living a life of great value by being the servant of another.

A desire for bigness has hurt many folks. Putting oneself in the limelight at the expense of others is a wrong idea of greatness. *"The secret of greatness, rather than bigness is to acclimate oneself to one's place of service and be true to one's own convictions. A life of this kind of service will forever remain the measure of one's true greatness - "Richard W. Shelly, Jr.*

We cannot fully comprehend what Jesus speaks about when taking the role of a servant in order to achieve greatness in life. True greatness consists in being great in little things as Charles Simmons says. Do not look for honors and glory, for in trying to seek those things will earn earthly praises for you and loose the sight of God's kingdom. Surely, greatness lies not in being strong but in the right use of strength, and that strength is not found in us but in God alone.

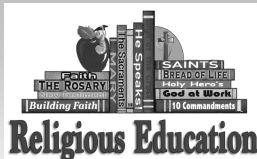
