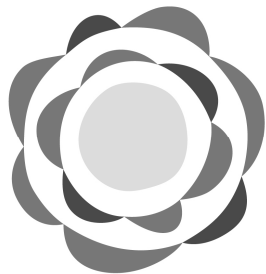

SPIRITUAL ADOPTION OF AN UNBORN CHILD

During Respect Life Month you were invited to spiritually adopt an unborn child by praying the following prayer each day for nine months - - "Jesus, Mary, and Joseph, I love you very much. I beg of you to spare the life of (give the baby a name), the unborn baby I have spiritually adopted, who is in danger of abortion. Amen." —Venerable Archbishop Fulton J. Sheen

"Your spiritually adopted baby has been quite active over the past month. Already your baby is 10,000 times bigger than at conception. Your baby has developed the foundations of his/her brain, spinal cord, and nervous system by the 20th day. His/her heart began to beat on the 21st day. His/her heart is pumping blood through its own circulatory system and the blood type can be different from his/her mother's. Your spiritually adopted baby is most vulnerable during the next month of being aborted. Pray that the Lord of Life might move the heart of his/her mother to give him/her the most precious gift of all – the gift of life."

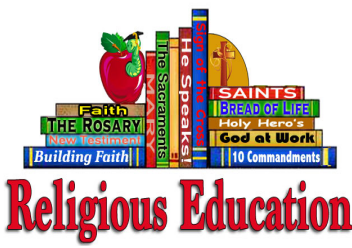
