

FROM THE
Pastor's Desk

THE LORD IS COMING!

As we start the season of Advent we are reminded of the coming of the Lord. From the Scriptures and the traditions of the Fathers we know that Jesus the Messiah came 2,000 years back with the message of redemption. He suffered died and rose to life again. We also believe in his second coming.

The question that comes to our mind may be why is he coming again? God the Father sent Jesus to redeem us from sin and Jesus faithfully carried out the will of his father even by embracing the cup of suffering in order to fulfill the father's will in every way. So having fulfilled the will of his Father, is it necessary for Jesus to come again which is his "Second Coming"?

Let us try to understand what this second coming of Jesus is all about. Jesus' second coming is a pivotal part of God's redemption story for us. Because of Jesus' death on the cross, we are a forgiven people. Because of his resurrection from the dead, we are a people of hope. Because of his second coming, we are a people with a home and a future. Jesus did say to his Apostles in Jn 14/2-3. He speaks about his Father's house having many dwelling places and he is going to prepare a place for each of us and he would return to take us back to be with him. So our home, an everlasting home is in heaven with God which Jesus assured us.

So if Jesus is coming again, then what are we supposed to be doing to receive him and when will he come? All that the scriptures tell us is about his second coming is that it does not give us the exact time which is unknown to us but we should expect to be ready to receive him. We should pay heed to his warning as he says in today's scripture (Mt 24/37-44). We are too busy eating, drinking, marrying etc. as it happened in the days of Noah so it will happen in the days of the coming of the Son of man. As followers and disciples of the Lord we should be prepared and vigilant at all times. Even in the ordinary events taking place in our life, the emphases are in the suddenness and unknown period of time when it does happen.

We should not be worried and pre-occupied about what to eat and what to wear, for he says that life is more important than these material needs (Mt 6/25) and God the Father knows what we need. All that is expected of us is to be seeking the kingdom of God and his righteousness. Are our lamps ready? They must be if we are to receive Jesus, the bridegroom. In the parable of the ten virgins who set out to welcome the bridegroom, five were foolish and five were wise.

Which camp do we fall into? There are only two: the foolish and the wise. They both heard the rumors of the bridegroom's coming, but only one group took extra care in getting ready. Jesus explains that the bridegroom arrived as the foolish women went to buy additional oil, "and the door was shut." When they finally made it back, they asked to come inside. "I tell you the truth," the bridegroom said, "I don't know you." (Matthew 25:1-13)

Jesus then separates those who belong in his kingdom and those who do not by their demonstration of faithfulness. As with every story and prophecy about the end of time and the return of the king, it is given to us so we might follow in the way of righteousness. Like the wise men that traveled afar bearing gifts for Jesus, we too are on a journey. If we choose to go, we must carry the light until the end of our journey.

DECEMBER 8

December 8 is traditionally the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Because it falls on a Sunday this year, the Second Sunday of Advent has priority as a celebration of the Lord's Day. **Therefore the celebration of the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception is moved for this year to Monday, December 9th.** However, the obligation is removed. Given that this is the patron feast day of the United States we will have **Masses at 8 a.m. and at 7 p.m. that day.** The Religious Education classes will participate in the evening Mass. All are encouraged to honor Mary on this special holy day.

Join us next Saturday, December 7, for an **Advent Morning of Reflection, "Finding Joy in Serving the Lord," with Fr. Mario.** It will begin with the 8 a.m. Mass. +Open the appropriate door of the Advent Calendar each day. Reflect on the Scripture verse and consider what the picture says to you about Jesus' coming.




AWAY IN A MANGER...

The little Lord Jesus asleep on the hay...It is an Advent custom to pad the manger with good deeds, big or small, symbolized by pieces of hay, so that the Christ Child has a soft place at Christmas. Each Advent weekend you will find bags of hay at the doors of the church. **When you arrive, place some hay, symbolic of your good works during the week, and place it in the basket.** During the Presentation of the Gifts the hay baskets from each of the doors will also be brought forward. After Mass the hay will be placed in a larger basket and accumulate each of the four weeks. When the manger is put up, all the hay will be placed inside so to be ready on Christmas for the statue of the Christ Child. What will you do during Advent, in word and deed, to share the hope, joy and anticipation of Christ's coming?
