John the Baptist appeared,  
preaching in the desert of Judea and saying,  
“Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand!”

MATTHEW 3:1



A friend of mine is fortunate enough to have an extra family home by a lake. It is a good place to get away to relax. They are so generous in welcoming others to visit their home and feel at home. They have named their home “Mi casa es su casa” - My house is your house.

I think of that when I reflect upon today’s Second Reading from St. Paul to the Romans about welcoming one another as Christ welcomes us. As brothers and sisters in Christ we should carry on that appeal in our hearts as we gather together at Church for Mass. Renew My Church calls it “radical hospitality” where everyone has a chance to receive an encounter with Christ when they enter our Church “home” through his love. It is always a great gesture when we can turn to others and welcome them in our presence because we are gathered in presence of God.

We are challenged to do that more often especially when we welcome the living Word of God during this special time of Advent. Perhaps it is an extra moment of prayer while reading a passage from Sacred Scripture or looking ahead to the readings for Mass.

We congratulate the students in the Religious Education Program who heard the reading of the Parable of the Merciful Father as they received the Sacrament of Reconciliation for the first time this weekend. They are preparing to receive Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament, Holy Communion. They remind us to prepare ourselves to turn away from our faults and welcome the merciful love of Jesus. Advent affords us an opportunity to receive that powerful gift of mercy.

John the Baptist steps into view on this Second Sunday of Advent he is not only seen but also heard. He stands out in what he wears and eats and his message is controversial. He spoke a word crying out in the desert; prepare that way of the Lord, make straight his path. He called out to himself and others to a change of heart by turning away from all that prevents one from welcoming Christ to rule our life. Advent calls out to us by living a life in harmony with Christ.

Let’s gladly welcome the challenge to make room for the Lord even in those times when we feel like we are on the outside looking inside or those times when we are discouraged. As St. Paul’s letter to the Romans describes God as God of endurance and encouragement. May this Advent provide us with strength and hopefulness and a warm welcome home.

## ADVENT PRAYER CORNER

**Sunday** – *Light two candles on your Advent Wreath and pray: Reread today’s Gospel, Matthew 3:1-12. If alone, think about something you’d like to change this Advent to be more prepared to welcome Christ. If with family/friends, share what you’ll work on and tell them in what way(s) they might help you make that change.*

*(Each day this week light the two candles of your Advent Wreath or just light a single candle. Take a quiet moment. When ready, make the Sign of the Cross and say this week’s prayer – **God of Tender Mercy, guide us along the way of your peace so that this Advent leads us to the Christ child’s manger. Help us discover your presence in our lives so that we might more readily respond to the Spirit speaking in our hearts. Encourage us as we reach out to serve you in the needy and the least of our brothers and sisters. Give us hope for the coming of your Kingdom in all its fullness. May we become, like John the Baptist and the angels of old, heralds of the Good News of salvation. Amen.** Read the Jesse Tree Scripture for the day and reflect on and/or discuss the day’s question.*

**Monday:** Jacob (ladder) – “He had a dream: a stairway rested on the ground, with its top reaching to the heavens; and God’s angels were going up and down on it. Gen. 25:1-34; 28:10-15. Remember or share a time from your life when you felt heaven and earth touch. How did that help your faith?”

**Tuesday:** Joseph (tunic) – “I am your brother Joseph, whom you sold into Egypt...It was really for the sake of saving lives that God sent me here ahead of you.” Gen.37:23-28, 45:3-15. Recall something from your life that, when it happened, you didn’t think it was very good, but looking on it later you realize it helped bring about something that was for the good.

**Wednesday:** Moses (commandments) – “Now go, I am sending you to Pharaoh to bring my people out of Egypt...This is what you will tell them: I AM sent me to you.” Ex.3:7-15. Have you ever felt that God called you to go and “save” another with words of wisdom or actions of justice or peace? How did you feel?

**Thursday:** Samuel (temple) – “Speak, for your servant is listening...Samuel grew up and the Lord was with him, not permitting any word of his to go unfulfilled.” I Sam. 3:1-8. How much time do you spend listening to God when you pray each day? What makes it difficult for you to listen? Will you change and listen more?

**Friday:** Ruth (anchor) – “Wherever you go I will go, ...Your people shall be my people and your God, my God...A son was born – Obed, the father of Jesse, the father of David. Ruth 1 & 4. Ruth was a foreigner who was part of God’s plan of salvation. Have you ever met someone who was really different from you, but who made an impression on your life? Who was it and how did they do it?”

**Saturday:** David (harp) – “And the Lord said to you, ‘You shall shepherd my people Israel...’ and they anointed him king of Israel.” II Samuel 5:1-3. What do you think are qualities of a good shepherd? How have you shown some of those qualities and been a “good shepherd” to others?

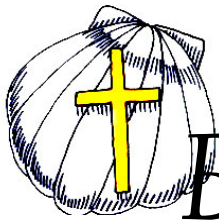
**Faith in Action This Week** (*Choose at least one of these actions or one you come up with*) – As you pray this week, increase your listening time with God. Participate in the Christmas Card Project for Ministry of Care (see article in bulletin). Skip a treat or meal out or use part of your allowance and purchase a toy or gift card for the Catholic Charities Celebration of Giving Project (see article). Heed the cry of John the Baptist to “repent and prepare” and celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation at the first of two parish services. (see schedule). Attend Mass on Dec. 8<sup>th</sup>, a Holy Day of Obligation, and give thanks for the purity of our Blessed Mother and for her “yes” to her role in God’s plan of salvation for the world.

Dear Friends in Christ,

On the Third Sunday of Advent, our parishes will be conducting the Retirement Fund for Religious collection, an annual appeal that benefits nearly 25,000 elderly sisters, brothers, and religious order priests. Our senior religious are a treasure—both for their service to our Church and for the ways their prayer and witness enrich our faith. “Planted in the house of the Lord, they shall flourish in the courts of our God. They shall bear fruit even in old age” (Ps 92:14-15). As I reflect on the ministry of women and men religious—past and present—I am grateful for the ways they have shaped my own faith. 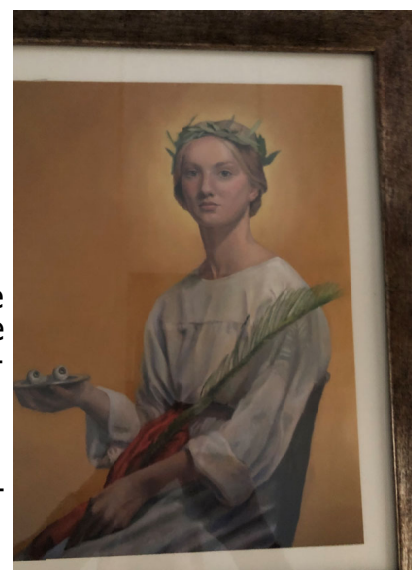


## Our Fantastic Relic of St. Lucy

One of the most revered virgin martyrs named in the Roman Canon of the Mass is St. Lucy of Syracuse. She grew up in Syracuse, Sicily and was educated a Christian by her mother, Eutychia. After her mother had been miraculously healed at the tomb of St. Agatha at Catania, Lucy was permitted to take a vow of virginity and distributed her dowry to the poor. Denounced as a Christian to the governor, after some shameful tortures and indignities and several miracles, her throat was pierced with a sword. Pope Honorius (625-38) built a church in her honor in Rome. Some of her relics were brought to Spoleto by Duke Faroald in the 8<sup>th</sup> century, from there to Corfinium and then to St. Vincent's Monastery in Metz. Between 1038 and 1040, the army of Byzantine General George Maniakos retook the city of Syracuse from the Arabs. In 1089, he ordered the remains of St. Lucy transferred to Constantinople with the claim that they would be safer in the imperial city than under constant Muslim threat. During the looting of Constantinople by the Fourth Crusade in 1204, Enrico Dandolo, the Doge of Venice, ordered the transfer of the remains of St. Lucy (and St. Agatha) to Venice. At first, they were kept in the church of San Giorgio Maggiore. But, after several pilgrims drowned trying to visit her shrine, in 1279, the remains were transferred into the heart of the city to the Church of the Annunciation of Our Lady, built in 1192, and now rededicated to Santa Lucia. In 1513, her head was said to have been given to the King of France and placed in the Cathedral of Bourges. But this probably never happened, since her head is still in Venice. The church of Santa Lucia was closed in 1860 and demolished in 1861, to make way for the Venezia Santa Lucia railway station. St. Lucy's mummified remains were moved down the street to the church of St. Geremia, where they remain to this day at her altar behind a glass window. During the time he was Patriarch of Venice, the future Pope John XXIII viewed the remains of St. Lucy, and ordered that her shriveled face be covered with a silver mask. In November of 1981, a bizarre theft took place. Just as the parish priest was locking up the church for the evening, two masked men with machine guns appeared and forced him and two others to lie on the floor, while they smashed the glass coffin and stuffed St. Lucy's body into a nylon duffel bag. They left behind her head, which had detached at the neck and fallen to the floor, along with her silver mask. Considering the disrespect they showed for her remains, it was likely they intended to hold them for ransom; but none was paid. On her feast day, December 13th, a



month later, with the help of restaurant manager Gianfranco Tiozzo, the police found her body, still in the nylon bag, in a hunting lodge near Venice and had them returned and placed in a stronger, much more secure coffin, with bulletproof glass and electric alarms. The relic we just acquired for the Shrine of All Saints is a large portion of the upper-right-hand side of her skull. It was sealed and certified by Archbishop Marcello Mimmi of Bari on July 10, 1930, and was used in a relic exchange with the Greek Orthodox monastic community on Mount Athos. It comes to our Shrine from Mount Athos.





### PARISH OUTREACH MINISTRY

The following items (all non-perishable only) would be helpful to assist those coming to our doors. Cans with pop tab lids are especially good for the homeless (no can opener): small cans of deviled ham, tuna or chicken packets, boxes of crackers, granola bars, individual fruit or applesauce cups, protein drinks, small cans of pork & beans, little hot dogs, hand warmer packets; also pasta, pasta sauce, cans of fruit, rice, oatmeal, canned stews, hash, chicken, hams, laundry detergent, shampoo, toothpaste, tooth brushes, deodorant (for use by men/women).
