

Reflections from Fr. Dennis

Dear Friends and Fellow Parishioners:

In a desperate attempt to give her overactive five-year-old son something engaging and constructive to do, Jonathan Larson's mother gave him a crochet hook and several balls of yarn, and sat him in front of a You Tube video on how to crochet a dish cloth. From the start, Jonathan was a crocheting "whiz kid". He soon founded Jonathan's Hands, a charitable organization through which he sold his many crocheted creations to raise money for Ethiopian children in need. Because Jonathan, who was born in Ethiopia, couldn't keep up with the orders, he began instead to teach crochet on You Tube. Now a young teen, he has used the monies from his tutorials and public appearances to build a library for the Ethiopian children in his hometown – and to build a science and technology lab for students there.

We are never too young to be part of God's plan, to be a sign of God's love, to make a difference in this world. We are never too old to put our gifts of wisdom, knowledge, faith, and healing to use for the good of others and for the building up of God's kingdom on earth.

Let's remember who we are. Many of us remember the children's rhyme, "Sticks and stones may break my bones, but words will never harm me." Yet words CAN and DO harm us. Many of us here today bear the scars of being called names that have made us feel less than beautiful, useless, and unloved. These names stay with us, in our minds and hearts, sometimes for years. Today, God is inviting us to leave the names of the past behind and to accept a new name: "my delight." My joy, my happiness. This name is not reserved for the sinless and perfect it is for every one of us, wherever we are on the journey of life and faith – right now, today. It is a name that invites us to change the way we see ourselves – and perhaps the way we see God.

Let's use our gifts. Even as a five-year-old, Jonathan Larson used his talent for crocheting to put to use the spiritual gift of mighty deeds. He continues to make a lasting difference in the lives of Ethiopian children. His story stirs in our hearts the spiritual gift of faith, for it reminds us that still today, it is possible to do mighty works with simple tools like a crochet hook and yarn. What talents do we have that we can use to serve the Lord? Some of you visit and bring Holy Communion to the homebound. You extend your gifts of faith and healing. Some of you are catechists. Who put to use your spiritual gifts of wisdom and knowledge. Some of you lead us in singing. Some in praying. The list is endless.

Let's look for opportunities. In today's Gospel, Jesus did not attend the wedding at Cana, intending to be a sign of God's power. But the opportunity to do so presented itself, and He supplied what was needed in that moment. Each day is full of little moments that offer us opportunities to live up to the name of "My Delight". When we use our spiritual gifts in the service of the Lord, we extend that delight, joy, and happiness to others. And when we seize the opportunities to serve others by being signs of God's love and power, we do indeed help God's kingdom to unfold on earth.


RELIGIOUS EDUCATION NEWS

GOD'S LAW

Scripture has always held God's law to be the path to human happiness. In today's first reading, Ezra the priest reads the scroll of the law to the people returned from exile. They weep—then are joyful. Israel's relationship with God had always been defined by how they kept and lived God's law. The author of Psalm 96 likewise praises the law of God as the source of wisdom, joy and enlightenment, purity and justice.

In his advice to the bickering Corinthians, Paul points out that, just as God has made all parts of a human body essential for the health of the whole, living as "Christ's body" requires that each member be recognized as necessary for the good of all. Finally, in Luke's Gospel Jesus claims that the Spirit is sending him to relieve human suffering. Like Ezra, he is reading from a scroll, proclaiming God's "law" of mercy to those in need.
