

REFLECTIONS FROM FR. CARLOS

Today is Valentine's Day. What some do not know is that in the Church, today is also the feast day Saint Valentine who was also known for his promotion and support of authentic marital love. May we always come to know the Love of God and share it with others. Amen.

Today's readings talk about God as a healer and in this case, a healer of the skin disease called leprosy. The way the first reading described the one who contracted this skin disease reminds us well of what it means to quarantine oneself today in the era of COVID-19. It is true that today we have cures of so many diseases that our ancestors did not have. However, that does not mean that Jesus has stopped being a healer. In a way, just as we have discovered the cure to many ailments in our world, there are so many others we do not have a solution to, and we have to look up to God for healing. Even in cases where cures are possible, it is not everyone who has access to the cure that survives. In the end, we need to always remember that our medicine is always a show of care, but, it is only God who truly heals. Also, we have many other ailments sometimes that are beyond the physical. Marital challenges, getting one's family or friend off one form of addiction or the others, loneliness of the soul, fear or anxieties. While we have also developed psychological strategies to cope with these challenges of human life, we should always remember that God is the true doctor of the soul. Our belief in science should not mean that there should not be a space for God. In fact, our belief in science should necessitate our belief in God.

From the Office of Readings for Ash Wednesday: From a letter to the Corinthians by St. Clement, pope

"Let us fix our attention on the blood of Christ and recognize how precious it is to God his Father, since it was shed for our salvation and brought the grace of repentance to all the world. If we review the various ages of history, we will see that in every generation the Lord has *offered the opportunity of repentance* to any who were willing to turn to him. When Noah preached God's message of repentance, all who listened to him were saved. Jonah told the Ninevites they were going to be destroyed, but when they repented, their prayers gained God's forgiveness for their sins, and they were saved, even though they were not of God's people.

"Under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit, the ministers of God's grace have spoken of repentance; indeed, the Master of the whole universe himself spoke of repentance with an oath: *As I live, says the Lord, I do not wish the death of the sinner but his repentance.* He added this evidence of his goodness: *House of Israel, repent of your wickedness. Tell the sons of my people: If their sins should reach from earth to heaven, if they are brighter than scarlet and blacker than sackcloth, you need only turn to me with your whole heart and say, "Father," and I will listen to you as to a holy people.* In other words, God wanted all his beloved ones to have the opportunity to repent and he confirmed this desire by his own almighty will. That is why we should obey his sovereign and glorious will and prayerfully entreat his mercy and kindness. We should be suppliant before him and turn to his compassion, rejecting empty works and quarreling and jealousy which only lead to death.

"Brothers, we should be humble in mind, putting aside all arrogance, pride and foolish anger. Rather, we should act in accordance with the Scriptures, as the Holy Spirit says: *The wise man must not glory in his wisdom nor the strong man in his strength nor the rich man in his riches. Rather, let him who glories glory in the Lord by seeking him and doing what is right and just.* Recall especially what the Lord Jesus said when he taught gentleness and forbearance. *Be merciful, he said, so that you may have mercy shown to you. Forgive, so that you may be forgiven. As you treat others, so you will be treated. As you give, so you will receive. As you judge, so you will be judged. As you are kind to others, so you will be treated kindly. The measure of your giving will be the measure of your receiving.*

"Let these commandments and precepts strengthen us to live in humble obedience to his sacred words. As Scripture asks: *Whom shall I look upon with favor except the humble, peaceful man who trembles at my words?* Sharing then in the heritage of so many vast and glorious achievements, let us hasten toward the goal of peace, set before us from the beginning. Let us keep our eyes firmly fixed on the Father and Creator of the whole universe, and hold fast to his splendid and transcendent gifts of peace and all his blessings."

THIS WEEK'S LENT SCHEDULE:

***Monday or Tuesday** – If you have not already decided, what is your plan for Lent to help you turn away from sin and live your discipleship more closely to the way of Jesus? How will your prayer look? Your fasting? Your almsgiving and good works?

***Ash Wednesday -- Masses will be at 8 a.m. & 7 p.m. Liturgies of the Word will be at Noon and 4 p.m. Ashes will be distributed at all four services.** Reservations

need to be made. A link is available through Flocknote (already sent out) and on the parish website. As part of the COVID guidelines from the Archdiocese please note that our parish community will receive ashes in the ancient tradition of a pinch of ashes being sprinkled on the crown of the head (preferred option). They will not be placed as a cross on the forehead. on. **Alms recipient is the SIJ Outreach Ministry** - support this long - serving parish ministry, which has been a great support to many within and beyond our boundaries during the pandemic, by giving **monetary donations** (for gift cards or some rent/utility bill assistance (following Outreach Ministry guidelines), or **non-perishable food items** for the pantry. Please also pray for all who come to our parish door in need. May each person who visits have their dignity affirmed by our community as we help them practically and spiritually.

***Ash Wednesday is a day of fasting and abstinence. Fasting** (Diocesan regulations): Only one full meal is permitted by those **between the ages of 18-59**. Two smaller meals may be eaten for reasons of health, but there is no eating between meals. Fasting is on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. **Abstinence**: No meat or poultry products on Ash Wednesday, the Fridays of Lent, and Good Friday, by those **ages 14 & older**.

***Friday -- Chaplet of Divine Mercy and Stations of the Cross, 3 p.m., in church.**

***Saturday – Sacrament of Reconciliation, 11:00 a.m. – 12:30 p.m. by reservation.** Link was sent on Flocknote and is on parish website. FYI – There will be no Parish Lent Reconciliation Service w/individual confessions this year. Plan ahead and make your reservation early for the Saturdays. Twelve appointments will be available the last two weekends of March with six in the church and six in the HFR.

***Weekend of Feb. 20 – 21:** First Sunday of Lent; **Almsgiving recipient:** Continues to be SIJ Outreach Ministry. If you are not coming to church but would like to support this almsgiving recipient, please mail or drop off your donation during the week. On the envelope or in the memo line please indicate alms for Outreach Ministry. Thank you.

The Outreach Ministry thanks all who have been so generous in supplying the food pantry. We do remind



FOOD DISTRIBUTION VOLUNTEERS

Thank you to all who helped with the January food distribution (with prayer, time in person, etc.) done in collaboration with Catholic Charities and the Greater Chicago Food Depository. In these trying times 220 households came and 826 of our brothers and sisters had a little more food support!

The next distribution will be hosted here in our SIJ parking lot on Wednesday, February 24th, 4:00-6:00 p.m. Please pass this information along to those who would benefit from such support right now. We will pack indoors but the distribution will be outside, rain or snow or cold or shine.

We are in need of about 30 volunteers for each time frame. The first time frame is 1:45 – 4:00 p.m. for instructions and to carry out the tasks of getting food indoors, packing it and then bringing it outside to tables, setting up signs, checking in guests and the like. The second time frame is 3:45 - 6:30 p.m. to help with the distribution, continue packing as needed and clean up. We are in particular need of people who can help carry heavy items including families, teens, and adults under 65 years of age.. Everyone needs to be in good health, no underlying conditions, and will have to wear a mask and gloves (which we will provide). Those over 65 and have no underlying medical conditions who choose to volunteer, are welcome to contact us to discuss your involvement.

If we do not have enough helpers by that day, we will reach out to other volunteer pools. What a great way to jumpstart your Lent – reaching out to the community in this time of greater need.
