

## Sts. Martha & Isaac Jogues Parish Unification Process Report

After receiving permission from Bishop Bartosic to proceed with the unification process of Saints Martha and Isaac Jogues Parish, a Unification Committee was established consisting of twelve members, six from each of the legacy parishes. An initial meeting was held in mid-February for introductions of the committee members and the project manager and for a description of the tasks at hand. The larger Committee is comprised of three working sub-committees described below, with two members from each legacy parish participating in each sub-committee.

**The Naming Sub-Committee** will identify eligible new parish names by soliciting suggestions and their rationale from all parishioners and tabulate the submissions according to the preferences of the parishioners which will then be presented to the Cardinal and Presbyteral Council for final selection. These members are Val Noronha, Terry Williams, Peg Desario and Ron Macam.

**The Communication Sub-Committee** will regularly communicate the activity of the Unification Committee and Sub-Committees through various print and electronic mediums. These members are Debbie Szachowicz, Judy Putrus, Gerry Zeller and Kathy Lord.

**The Non-Liturgical Ministry Sub-Committee** will identify active ministries not related to liturgy or Religious Education at both legacy parishes and provide current contact information for ministry heads, with the goal of "cataloguing" active ministries and initiating introductions of ministries and heads in support of the unified parish. This sub-committee may also consider offering suggestions for new ministries to meet the needs of the unified faith community. These members are Anna Duerr, Peggy Friewer, Fernando Bonto and Aurora Linang.

Make or buy some Easter cards, sign them from our church and bring them to Mass during Lent (they will be brought to local nursing facilities during Holy Week).

## PARISH LENT MISSION THIS WEEK

Sts. Martha – Isaac Jogues Parish Spiritual Life Commission invites all parishioners, family members, friends, and neighbors for the **2022 Lent Mission “Our Church on Mission: Our Identity and Our Future” led by Fr. Paul Adaja** and hosted here at St. Isaac Jogues Church beginning this afternoon. We encourage you to come for a Lent mission we hope will help shape the weeks of Lent for all of us. May the grace and guidance of the Holy Spirit be with Fr. Paul and our parish during this time of renewal, vitality, and hope so that strengthened in our discipleship we may faithfully carry on the mission Christ entrusted to the Church for the world and the glory of God!

“This mission is a journey of how we can enrich our spiritual life drawing from the treasures of the Church’s identity and mission. The Catholic today has challenges that reflect a world that wants to engage less with God. How do we relate with this world and at the same time maintain our identity without compromising our age-old values? How can we draw strength from the universal nature of our Faith to heal the division in our world? How can the Church’s identity still be realized in a world in which the body of Christ now realizes itself in several forms rather than physical structures? These are some of the questions we shall explore together to prepare ourselves for the celebration of the Paschal Mystery in a way that appreciates our identity as Church and faithful Catholics.”

Exposition and Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament will take place one hour before the Mission talk for those who want to come before the Lord to listen, to pray, to reflect. At the end of the sessions we will have Benediction (Sun. and Mon. done about 8 p.m.) or Mass (Tues. done about 8:30 p.m.). A free-will offering will be taken up at each session. My Jesus, I believe that You are truly present in the Most Blessed Sacrament.


I love You above all things, and I desire to possess You within my soul. I am sorry for ever having offended you.
