THE MATERNITY OF MARY



From 1949 to 1957, I attended Our Lady of Lourdes Grammar school. It was "K through 8" - - all the way! Sometimes, it was like "Nonsense." Most often it was serious formation. I have grateful memories of the "good sisters" and what they tried to instill in us. For me, May spawns nostalgia. I look back on daily May devotions, flowers and candles and the regimented grandeur of an all-school May Crowning. I can even sing bygone hymns with surprising accuracy:

*Mary, dear Mother,
O Virgin Sublime,
Take thou our pray'r
To heavenly climbs.
Bring thou our praise
to God's holy throne
As now our sins we bemoan . . .*

Simple and sentimental . . . those words helped an eight year-old overcome his fear of the dark! In his 2012 editorial in Magnificat, Fr. Peter John Cameron asks:

*Where would we be without Mary
as our Mother?*

Fr. Cameron observes, with a touch of humor:

Adam did not have a mother, and look at all the trouble he got into . . . What if we did not have the Mother of God to cry out to? . . . Without the Mother of God to love, we would feel a huge emptiness - - a lack - - in our life.

Saints, like the great St. Teresa, who have lost an earthly mother, often "adopt" the Mother of God in a very powerful way. St. Teresa writes:

When I began to understand what I had lost, I went afflicted, before an image of Our Lady and besought her with many tears to be my Mother.

It is no secret that I have a collection of Madonnas. They are not all beautiful in a conventional sense, but they all reveal the beauty and complexity of the Divine Maternity. I have written many articles on Marian images and their significance. I have a special fondness for Medieval Madonna's. Crowned and regally lovely, they are rarely depicted without the Infant Jesus.

Travel "guru," Rick Steves, recently commented on a "different take on the Virgin Mary" in Sweden's Uppsala Cathedral.

The eerily lifelike statue from 2005, called Mary (The Return), captures Jesus' mother wearing a scarf and timeless garb. In keeping with the Protestant spirit, this version of Mary is shown not as an exalted queen, but as Everywoman, saddened by the loss of her child and seeking solace - - or answers - - in the church.



Honored by icons and images of all sorts, the Motherhood of Mary is a collective, but intensely **personal** mystery. St. John Paul II said:

motherhood is a relationship of person to person: a mother is not only mother of the body or of the physical creature born of her womb, but of the person she begets.

May means more than savoring springtime and "saying it with flowers." It carries with it a real **nostalgia** for our heavenly mother and our heavenly home.

As we honor our earthly mothers, living and dead, on this Mothers Day, let us also honor the Blessed Virgin.

- *People to host (sit with them at lunch, etc.) our guests from Maternity BVM and St. Mary Kananya Churches



We discover the depth and power of those relationships because we are connected in him who holds all of us in his love.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

With June not far off, attention in the parish turns to the celebration of weddings. Perhaps no other area of parish life is more shaped or challenged by the expectations of our culture. An old Irish proverb, "Marry in Lent and you're soon to repent," is amplified by another warning: "Marry in May and rue the day!" Memories of old pagan parties in May endured, and the Irish felt wedding receptions in May would be a stress on community morals. Queen Victoria did not approve of May weddings either, and her influence is still felt on family calendars, as is her daughter's introduction of the white wedding gown. Sometimes we mistake customs and curiosities for tradition. Tradition with a capital "T" has to do with Christ's miraculous rescue of the wedding feast at Cana, his affirmation of a man and woman pledging lifelong fidelity at the heart of a community's feast. The Church cherished that memory over time, but it took a millennium for us to think of marriage as a sacrament. Much of the rest of what we associate with weddings has to do with culture, customs, and family practices. A wise rabbi once said that "tradition is not wearing your father's hat; tradition is having a child." Don't let Queen Victoria reign over your wedding plans!


