## A MOTHER'S DAY "ARRANGEMENT"



On **Mother's Day**, I am like almost everyone else. There is a tug at my "heart strings" that cannot be denied. I am unapologetically sentimental and grateful for my mother's re-

markable faith, her strength and many sacrifices. Recently I told a grieving son, "Always keep a picture of your mother near and look at it often." Since my mother's death, I have done just that. Not only on **Mother's Day**, but often, I visit the cemetery with flowers. Therefore, it is shocking - - at times painful - - if sons and daughters seem to be indifferent or neglectful of their mothers. Do mothers suffer most then or do they **understand** and rise above it all?

The iconic portrait of Anna McNeill Whistler is popularly known as "Whistler's Mother." It was no sentimental **Mother's Day** tribute. There is very little color and even less sentiment in James McNeill Whistler's canvas. For its day (1871) it was a radical departure. The artist was not interested in florid impressions or flattering realism. He called his works "arrangements," "symphonies," or "nocturnes." Of his mother's portrait he said:

*"Art should be independent of clap-trap - - should . . . appeal to the artistic sense of eye or ear, without confounding this with emotions entirely foreign to it . . . Take the picture of my mother as an **Arrangement in Grey and Black**. Now that is what it is . . . what can or ought the public care about the identity of the portrait?"*

Does that sound heartless or disrespectful? James McNeill Whistler was renowned for his wit. He could be sardonic, yet playful. His salvos could match his broadsides. He occasionally bested even Oscar Wilde in the fine art of the "put down." But he more **enfant terrible** than parlor bully!

How did Whistler's Mother interpret the **Arrangement in Grey and Black**? Anna has been described as "pious, submissive, and her life centered on domestic issues." In that, she was a model Victorian. But Anna was more.

She had lived in three countries, witnessed the American Civil War, lost both her husband and three of her children while the family was in Russia. Despite her losses, Anna proved to be intelligent, resilient and practical. She was James' art agent and actually mixed well with her son's eccentric, **avant garde** friends. Of them she wrote:

*The "artistic circle in which he is only too popular, is visionary and unreal tho so fascinating."*

Anna McNeill Whistler was obviously far more colorful than her son painted her. She appears to have been an acceptable "den mother" for the Whistler salon. The real "key" to Anna's motherly reaction to the **Arrangement in Grey and Black** is found in a letter she wrote to her sister, Kate Palmer, on November 3, 1871, when the portrait was completed.

*"(James) has no nervous fears in painting his Mother's portrait for it was to please himself & not to be paid for in other coin . . ."*

She notes that James became frustrated and stormed, "it is impossible to do it as it ought to be done perfectly."


Anna "lifted her heart that it might be as the Net cast down in the Lake at the Lord's will." She saw him try again and succeed. She was exultant:

*" . . . oh my grateful rejoicing in spirit as suddenly my dear son would exclaim,"*

*"Oh Mother it is mastered, it is beautiful!" and he would kiss me for it!"*

Anna did understand and rose above even her son's "genius." Above all, she was happiest when he was happy! How like every good mother! Hers was not an "arrangement" in grey and black but in radiant motherly love!

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Every rectory office has received a panicked phone call from a person who has been invited to serve as a godparent, or from someone newly engaged, who suddenly "needs to get confirmed." While the lack of confirmation is not an obstacle for marriage, it is for godparenting. Many are surprised that the Church seems to be looking for a kind of sacramental "seal" on one's baptism before the door opens fully to this ministry. Yet if you think about it, would you want someone to guide you to a place that he or she had not yet been? A godparent has to be someone who has "been there" and knows the way.

Although signet rings and wax seals have passed from use, our society depends on "seals of approval" ranging from certificates of quality to the familiar safety seals on medicines and foods. While Eucharist is the "seal" of the sacrament of baptism, there is a sense in which one's Christian initiation is also incomplete without confirmation. Have you been confirmed? Perhaps it's time to inquire now, before you have to make that dreaded phone call!

An Initiation Class is also provided for older children who have not yet received their First Reconciliation or First Communion. We also encourage families who have children with special needs to come and discuss possible options for your child's growth in the faith and reception of sacraments.
