OF HUMOR AND HOLINESS:



St. Philip Neri

Heaven has been described as a banquet. If that celestial feast is, in any way, like other banquets, I want to be seated next to St. Philip Neri. I have actually said that from the pulpit! Why St. Philip Neri? Serious hagiographers may stress his ecstasies and visions, his miracles and ability to "read minds." But, Philip Neri, the founder of the Congregation of the Oratory and confidant of popes, cardinals, kings as well as commoners, is best loved and remembered for his sense of humor. While humor is not expected in a holy person, wasn't it St. Teresa of Avila (a contemporary of St. Philip) who said: "God save us from sullen saints"?

St. Philip Neri lived from 1515-1595. He was a "post-Renaissance man" - - not only brilliant and gifted in a variety of ways, but charming. A Florentine, by birth, he spent most of his life in Rome. The Rome he discovered was the same Rome that had so angered and scandalized a pious pilgrim named Martin Luther. Corruption and worldliness were only part of the Roman **malaise**. Those who hadn't given up on the Church were bored by it. There, amid the spiritual "ruins of Rome," a young Philip Neri began a great apostolate. As a child he had been called "Philip the Good." After a mystical experience, he embarked on his path to real holiness. First, he tutored the sons of a wealthy Florentine and lived as a virtual recluse. After studying philosophy and

theology, he broke away from his academic isolation. He preached on street corners and in marketplaces! His magnetic personality attracted attention, at first, and then scores of converts. His confessor advised him to start a lay confraternity to minister to pilgrims and to spread the Forty Hours devotion. With the encouragement of his confessor, he was also ordained a priest in 1551.

St. Philip Neri had a remarkable charism. Not only did he attract converts, but other priests to aid him in his increasingly popular ministry. Some of these priests would be part of a community of priests who would be known as "Oratorians." St. Philip founded the Oratorians in 1564. They were formally approved in 1575 by Pope St. Gregory XIII. The pope gave the new group a rundown Church, Santa Maria in Vallicella. It was later demolished. A new Church, known as the **Chiesa Nuova**, was built and became the center of the Oratorian ministry.

St. Philip's approach to ministry was creatively innovative. A regular feature of the "Oratory" was a daily afternoon service of four informal talks with vernacular hymns and prayers. The great polyphonic composer, Palestrina, was a follower of St. Philip Neri and wrote music for the services. The clergy and laity both had important roles - something controversial at that time.

But let us return to the **humor** of St. Philip. He had a mischievous way of deflating overinflated egos. He often did so with a joke. St. Philip loved jokes. He once shaved off half his beard to make a point. He had a small dog that once belonged to a cardinal. The dog either followed him home or was "filched" by Philip. Whenever some pompous young nobleman imposed on Philip for counsel, Philip would give him something important to do - - walk the dog!

I don't think anyone ever paid tribute to St. Philip Neri better than poet Phyllis McGinley. Her "life" best describes **why** I would like to meet him at the Heavenly Banquet.

*When Philip Neri walked abroad
Beside the Tiber, praising God,
They say he was attended home
By half the younger set of Rome.*

*Knight, novice, scholar, boisterous boy
They followed after him with joy.
To nurse his poor and break his bread
And hear the funny things he said.*

*For Philip Neri (by his birth
A Florentine) believed in mirth
Holding that virtue took no harm
Which went with laughter arm-in-arm.*

*Two books he read with most affection - -
The Gospels and a joke collection;
And sang hosannas set to fiddles
And fed the sick on soup and riddles.*

*So when the grave rebuke the merry,
Let them remember Philip Neri
(Fifteen-fifteen to ninety-five),
Who was the merriest man alive,
Then, dying at eighty or a bit,
Became a saint by Holy Wit.*


PENTECOST/CELEBRATION WEEKEND

RE NEWS

•Families who have a tuition balance or sacrament fee for the current RE year (2013-2014) are asked to make payment by this Friday, May 30th. If you have a financial concern, please call the RE Office, 847/966-1180, by Friday to discuss options. No one is denied religious education due to financial difficulties. Thank you!

•Registration for the **2014-2015 RE Program for Kindergarten through Confirmation Year II (Gr. 8 and older) has begun!** Families are strongly encouraged to have their children come each year as no one year suffices in providing what is important for a strong faith foundation. Students preparing for sacraments must attend for the two immediate years prior to receiving each sacrament. If families have children with special needs or who have not received their sacraments, we would be happy to meet with you and discuss options. There is a tuition, book fees and sacrament fees (as applicable). **Families with financial concerns are encouraged to talk with us as no child is denied religious education because of finances. All are welcome!**

•Families currently in the RE Program should register by June 15. Forms were mailed but can also be picked up at the RE Office. After that date you are still welcome but there will be a \$25 late fee. **Don't put off this important task!**

•New families are welcome to register now as well. There is a family form, and a form for each child, to fill out. We also ask that you bring a letter/report from the RE Program or Catholic School they attended before coming to our parish, as well as a copy of each child's baptismal certificate (and other sacrament dates as applicable).

•The Kindergarten class meets on Sundays, 10:30-11:30 a.m. All other classes meet on Mondays, 6:45-8:00 p.m. We begin in late August and finish in mid-May. An Initiation Class is also provided for older children who have not yet received their First Reconciliation or First Communion.

We celebrate Father's Day during June. Many fathers feel a deep loss and sadness due to the abortion of their child. At the Women's Center, we reduce the number of abortions by approximately 1,000 babies saved each year. We are able to do this because of our counseling, and the spiritual and material help which you enable us to provide our mothers and fathers.

We need a strong Thursday Furniture Room volunteer(s) from 10 a.m. until 1 p.m. or 1 p.m. until 4 p.m. to help distribute baby furniture and to act as a lobby/front desk substitute. A volunteer is needed on Saturday who speaks Spanish to help make return phone calls in our Counseling Office. We also have an excellent opportunity for individuals or friends to work together. Volunteers are needed to clean baby bottles for reuse in our "spare change" fundraising, anytime Monday thru Friday between 10 a.m. and 5 p.m. These are all at our Chicago office.

Baby diapers in sizes 1, 4, 5 and 6, good condition maternity clothing and baby and children's clothing up to size 14 are needed for our Resource Room. These must be delivered to us unless accompanied by baby furniture. **To volunteer your help or donate**, call Jackie at 773-794-8807 or email jkeenan@womens-center.org.

We are happy to pass on your used baby equipment to mothers who cannot afford to buy it. We have a need for 4 infant/toddler car seats, 3 fixed side cribs, 3 crib mattresses, 4 toddler beds, 2 high chairs, 4 strollers, 2 double strollers, 4 bouncers, 5 pack n plays, 3 swings, 2 changing tables and 3 walkers. Mercy Home for Boys & Girls: Summer Openings in our Residential Programs!

As many of our young people successfully graduate from our programs at the end of the school year, this creates a unique opportunity for a new group of young people to enter our residential programs to get the therapeutic, academic and daily support needed to succeed in life. Specifically, **we have openings for youth (junior high - girls and boys) between ages of 11-14.**

Mercy Home for Boys & Girls has 14 specialized residential program to serve the needs of youth between the ages of 11 to 21. Each child is placed in one of these residential programs based on their age and level of emotional and developmental needs. Because it is a voluntary placement, each youth must be motivated to live at Mercy Home and attend a community school. However, parental support throughout a young person's stay is critical for her or his successes. We care for youth 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, in a facility that is not locked-down. We help each child develop an individualized success plan that will guide their progress through our continuum-of-care. As they make progress against their success plans by meeting the goals and objectives we help them create, youth continue to advance through our residential program.

For youth under eighteen years of age, a parent or legal guardian must make the referral. Youth 18+ can call us on their own.


