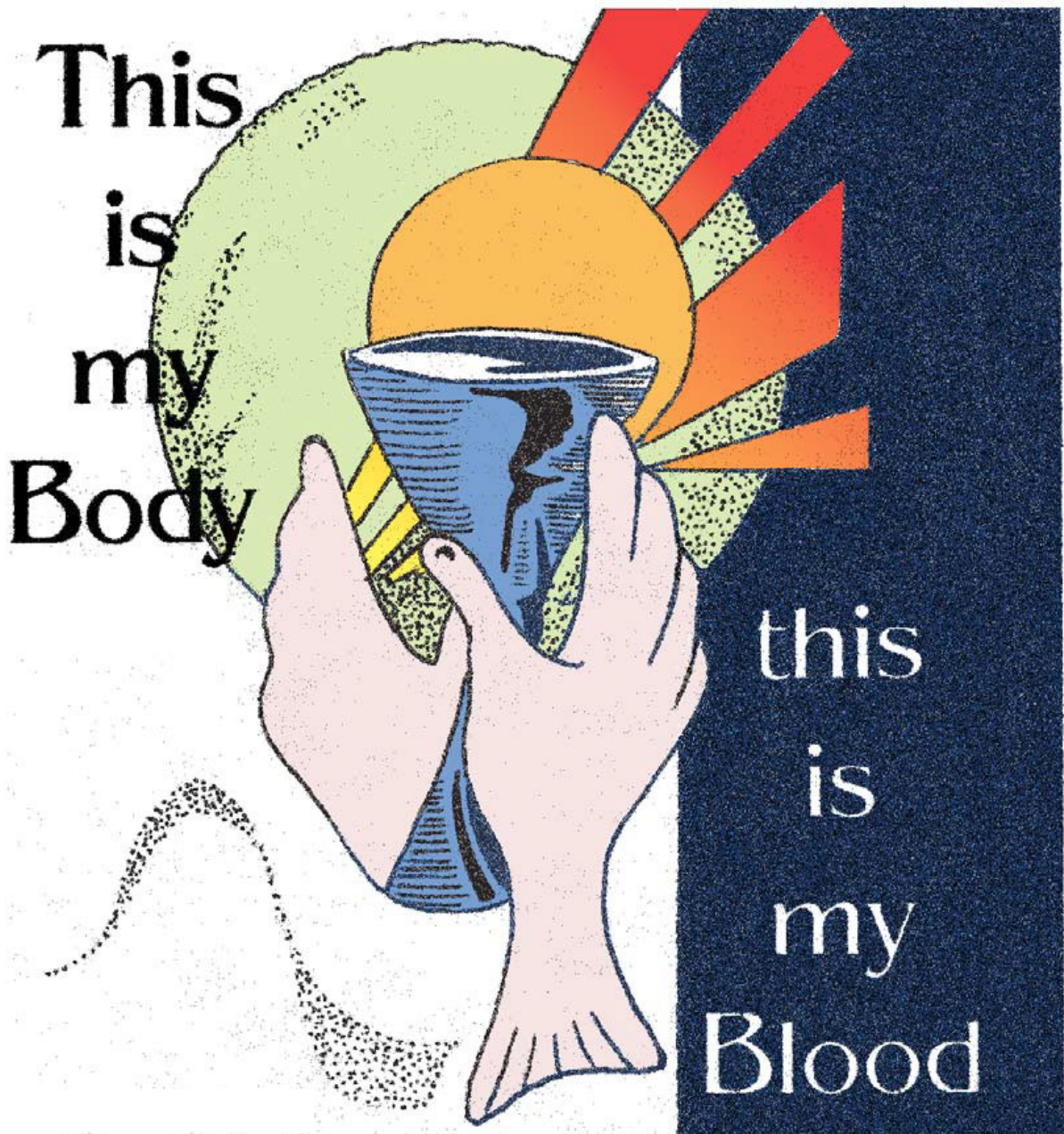

“O SACRUM CONVIVIUM”:

A CORPUS CHRISTI REFLECTION



The Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ (**Corpus Christi**) is a magnificent feast. St. John Paul II cited one important reason. He noted that the Church

“does not only celebrate the Eucharist but solemnly bears it in procession, publicly proclaiming that the sacrifice of Christ is for the salvation of the whole world.”

The procession on **Corpus Christi** quite literally “stops traffic.” It boldly breaks into the secular. It is a pageant for the ages, the harbinger of heaven on earth! Our age needs the witness of the faithful, who see beyond the material, technologically driven distractions that compete with the spirit. When I see a **Corpus Christi** procession, it reminds me of the Hebrews walking dry-shod through the parted Red Sea! What is a procession but a “demonstration” of faith to attract the attention of the hostile, the ignorant or the indifferent?

Apart from the pageantry of the **Corpus Christi**, there is a deep religious significance. St. Thomas Aquinas, one of the greatest doctors of the Church, composed the propers of the Mass and the divine office. If St. Thomas himself were to be asked to sum up the meaning of **Corpus Christi**, I believe he could do no better than to quote himself. The Antiphon before the **Magnificat**, the **O Sacrum Convivium**, is the five line masterpiece - concise and comprehensive:

O Sacrum Convivium O Sacred Banquet

*in quo Christus
sumitur*

in which Christ is
received

*recolitur memoria
passionis ejus*

in which the memory
of His Passion is
renewed

mens impletur gratia

the soul is filled with
grace

*et future gloriae nobis
pignus datur.*

and a pledge of future
glory is given to us.

The translations of the **Corpus Christi** propers can be, especially in the case of the Sequence, the **Lauda Sion**, awkward - like an interlinear translation of Horace! Despite the faults, the substance, the meaning, survives. St. Thomas is hard to dilute or “dumb down.” At times, we have a “treasure in the earthen vessels,” but a “treasure” nonetheless.

I have lived long enough to have memories of having to sing some of the worst Catholic hymns! When I was a nine year-old choir boy I had my first solo at a First Communion. It was a saccharine, sentimental number, “Little White Guest.” After Vatican II, I sang with a Guitar Group. The repertoire included awful attempts at relevance composed by Ray Repp and Carey Landry. They were the vernacular at its most vulgar!

As Catholics, we have a rich heritage - beautiful hymns and great music of different idioms.

Corpus Christi and other great feasts can bring us back to the harmony of orthodox theology and real art! It still exists. It is a “treasure” worth the search.

CORPUS CHRISTI PROCESSION TODAY

The **Corpus Christi Procession** (outside, weather permitting) will begin at the end of the **Noon Mass TODAY!** Scripture readings, hymns and prayers will be offered in four languages in addition to English, along with Benediction. Joining us for this special celebration will be members of our sharing parish, Maternity BVM, and our neighboring church, St. Mary Knanaya Church in Morton Grove. Once the procession begins, you will not be able to move your car from our parking lot until the procession has safely moved to the first altar. Ushers will be in the parking lot to facilitate movement. Please follow their direction. If the weather does not cooperate, we will have the procession inside with the altars set up in the Holy Family Room. Lunch will follow in the Holy Family Room following the procession. Come be part of this event to share Christ's Eucharistic Presence and blessing to all the world!

He is presently helping the parishes of St. Kevin and Precious Blood in the Archdiocese of Los Angeles while fulfilling his assignment as Director of Missions of the Missionaries of Jesus.

The **Missionaries of Jesus** is an international and multicultural religious missionary community. It was founded in the Philippines on 12 June 2002 by a group of **forty-one men** called and **inspired by the mission and humanity of Jesus**, who calls us to "make disciples of all nations". We call ourselves, "**friends and disciples**." It is our desire to gather more friends and co-disciples.

Our **objective** is the promotion of the universality of the Christian message through presence, proclamation, and prayer.

Our **mission** is to unveil the real face of Jesus hidden in our brothers and sisters in any mountain and plain; forest and city we work and live – as we gather Jesus' friends and disciples.

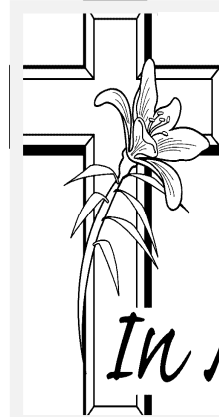


