Reflections from Fr. Dennis

Dear Friends and Fellow Parishioners:

When we leave our home or a friend, we often say, "I'll be back" or "I'll be right back." That gives reassurance that our loved ones will see us again. Even at the end of the day, we say good night before we go to bed. We all need to know that tomorrow will come, and we will all be together. Jesus leaves us with a promise. Even today, He is telling us that, that He will always be with us through life's rough spots and will return again.

The feast of the Ascension as described in Matthew, Mark, and Luke's Gospels tells us that after the Resurrection and many appearances, Jesus is taken up to heaven. There is no hint of exactly when this happens. It could have been as early as Easter evening. But the Acts of the Apostles provides more concrete information. Appearances of Jesus occurred over 40 days. Psalm 47 gets us into the spirit of our feast: "God mounts his throne with shouts of joy." Today is a feast not of WHERE Jesus is but of WHAT He is: the King of the world and the entire universe. Luke's Gospel leads us right into our reading from Acts. The ending of the Gospel and the beginning of Acts marks the transition from Jesus' earthly ministry into the early Christian movement that extends that ministry into space and time.

The Ascension is not about a chronology of events. It is about the reign of God and Jesus as Lord. We begin to understand the many references in the Gospels to Jesus' preaching about the kingdom. "He sent them to proclaim the Kingdom of God." "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me." We have often underplayed this aspect of Jesus' victory. By his death and Resurrection, Jesus called into being a new creation freed from slavery to sin. Jesus created a new humanity on Easter morning when He "breathed" on his disciples. Just as God breathed on Adam in the Book of Genesis, Jesus begins a new creation through his death and Resurrection.

Our old selves die when we are baptized into new life in Christ. Baptism transforms us as the Spirit enlivens and enables us to allow Christ to live in us. We are empowered to do good and to reject evil. We were formerly slaves to sin, but now we are united in Christ. Jesus is with us. He mounts his throne with shouts of joy and is clothed in majesty.

Today, we watch with the disciples. The angels tell us also to stop staring at the sky and look down and see his presence in each other. Jesus wants us to stop dreaming about the possibilities of discipleship and start the mission. We are his witnesses. We look forward, not backward. We are now the arms and heart of Christ. Although we might prefer to stand on the hill and gaze at the sky, we must get off the hill and act on what we have seen. Jesus lives in us, through us, and with us!

Church renovation update

Many have been asking "what's going on?" We've been working in the background to finalize details with the architect and contractor along with the help of our Archdiocesan Facilities Project Managers. Contract review with general contractors and sub-contractors is on-going.

Following are some of the high-level finalized details:

- * Asbestos abatement is required to eliminate contaminants under the carpet, under the pews.
- * The stone wall where the old baptismal font is will be removed.
- * New flooring is being installed throughout which will be a combination of carpeting in the aisles and hard surface materials under the pews and in the sanctuary.
- * The stained glass windows on the tabernacle wall of the church will be uncovered again to add symmetry to the church.
- * The radiator covers on the north side of the church will be removed since they are no longer needed and the walls will be patched. All drywall will be repaired/replaced where necessary. The entire church is receiving a badly needed fresh coat of paint.
- * The pews are being removed, repaired and refinished. We will not have/need cushions. The kneelers will remain.

Following is a project still in discussion:

- * The bathroom in the narthex has been an issue for some time and it no longer meets Americans Disability Act (ADA) requirements and needs to change. We are looking at a few options of how to best serve the parish in the long-term and eliminate the noise and distraction caused by usage during masses & events. The architect & contractor are working on plans and costs for our review.

Next steps:

- * Movers will be on-site May23-24. Over 400 chairs, file cabinets, boxes, musical instruments, altar furniture, stations of the cross, ambry, vigil lights, statues, paintings, etc. need to be moved.
- * The Holy Family Room will become "church."
- * Pews will be removed later that week or early the week of May 30th.
- * Asbestos abatement is tentatively scheduled to begin June 1st and could take 2-3 weeks for carpet removal, remediation and air-quality approval from the State of Illinois.
- * Demolition/renovations will commence upon asbestos abatement completion.
- * Flooring materials and paint are being ordered
- * Securing required permits with Village of Niles and Cook County

We believe the project could take 5-6 months depending on material availability and shipping time. Final drawings & renderings will be shared when available. We will provide periodic project updates along the way.

WELCOME TO OUR TEMPORARY CHURCH

As we begin Masses in the Holy Family Room, which will be our worship space from now through early to mid Fall, we hope this information will assist you.

+Please park in spaces. If you have good movement, kindly park farther away from the door so that those with movement concerns can park closer to door #12, the door to enter to come to the Holy Family Room. There are a few parking spots for those with disability placards near the front of the school. There is also a small ramp there if you need to bring someone in that way and then go park your car.

+Please make sure your cell phones and other devices are turned off before our worship begins.

+Take a hymnal from the Usher or the cart so you can participate in prayer and song during Mass.

+Please go to the middle and far side of HFR first. Kindly fill in the middle seats so others do not have to go past you to get to a seat.

+Please arrive a few minutes before Mass is to begin to get your seat and to take a moment for prayer and preparation for worship. Ushers will not seat people during the procession, readings or homily, so as not to distract the minister. They will seat you once the procession has moved to the center aisle, during the psalm and during the Alleluia.

+We will stand for the Eucharistic Prayer. If you are not able to stand for long, please be seated.

+There will be four Communion stations. Eucharistic Ministers will wear masks as they distribute Holy Communion and will sanitize their hands before they begin to do so. Please follow the direction of the Ushers. We ask your understanding and patience as per Archdiocesan policy Eucharistic Ministers sanitize their hands after giving someone Communion on their tongue.


+Ushers will distribute bulletins as you leave. Copies of the Senior Connection and Chicago Catholic, as well as special collection envelopes will be found on the small tables on either side of door #12.

+The only restrooms available are outside of the Holy Family Room in the school. The first set of doors on the right is the men's room and the second set is the ladies. The downstairs Hall and bathrooms are for storage and renovation needs at this time.


+Should the fire alarm go off, please follow the direction of the Ushers to the front door of the school or door #12 or the door across from door #12. No matter what door you exit, please then move away from the building toward either Golf Road or the fence by the condos so to leave access to the fire department and their vehicles. We will re-enter the building only when given an "all clear" signal.

+Should tornado sirens go off, please follow the direction of the Ushers to downstairs or to the school hallway (but away from doors with windows) or to the end of the school hallway to the bathrooms on the right and left (no windows in these bathrooms). Again we will assemble in HFR once an "all clear" is given.

+If you need assistance or have a question, please ask an Usher (wearing usher badge) or one of the ministers of the Mass. We are happy you are here to offer praise and thanks to the Lord!
