Corpus Christi

“An Invitation to Adoration”

“The Bread of Angels has become the Bread of human beings.”

- Panis Angelicus

Corpus Christi, the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, is an invitation to Adoration. **The Catechism of the Catholic Church** teaches

Adoration is the first act of the virtue of religion. To adore God is to acknowledge Him as Creator, Savior, the Lord and Master of everything that exists, as infinite and merciful love. (#2096)

It is crucial that we, the Church, recognize that we are the **PEOPLE OF GOD**. The Second Vatican Council uses that title not only to emphasize the universal call to service, but as the universal call to holiness. Holiness puts God first. Adoration accepts God as our origin, our center, and our destiny. Our interior life, our experience of the community, our sense of mission in the world should be drawn to Him as a nail is to a magnet. **Corpus Christi** began with the vision of Bl. Juliana of Mount Cornillon in 1208. She was convinced that, in the Church Year, a feast was missing-- one that stressed the majestic glory of the Lord in the Eucharist. While Holy Thursday's focus was the Passion, the new feast would reflect the glory of heaven on earth! **Corpus Christi** with its procession of the Holy Eucharist, is both worship and witness. Blessed John Paul II recognized this when he said that the feast “does not only celebrate the Eucharist but solemnly bears it in procession, publicly proclaiming the sacrifice of Christ is for the salvation of the whole world.”

Corpus Christi processions have been revived in recent years because of the growing popularity of Eucharistic Adoration. Holy hours, Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament, and Perpetual Adoration have once more become part of the mainstream Catholicism. On this day, Pope Francis will preside over a Holy Hour of Eucharistic Adoration. He has invited the whole world to join him. United in prayer before the Blessed Sacrament, we place ourselves in God's hands. We offer Him thanks and praise. Like the Blessed Virgin, our “souls magnify the Lord.” While our parish will celebrate the full solemnity of **Corpus Christi** publicly, we encourage the faithful to join the Holy Father in his “hour” spiritually.

One of my favorite reflections on **Corpus Christi** is from a homily of St. Josemaria Escriva. St. Josemaria describes the mystery of Eucharistic love:

Love has been waiting for us for almost two thousand years. That's a long time and it's not, for when you are in love time flies. I remember a lovely poem, one of the songs collected by Alfonso X the Wise. It's a legend about a simple monk who begged our Lady to let him see heaven. Our Lady granted him his wish and the good monk found himself in paradise. When he returned, he could not recognize the monastery-- his prayer, which he had thought very short, lasted three centuries. Three centuries are nothing to a person in love. That's how I explain Christ waiting in the Eucharist. It is God waiting for us. God who loves man, who searches us out, who loves us just as we are-- limited, selfish, inconstant, but capable of discovering his infinite affection and of giving ourselves fully to Him.

St. Josemaria's thoughts on love are, for me, an essential part of **Corpus Christi's** “invitation” to adoration. Join us for the Solemn Mass and Eucharistic Procession. Unite with the pope in his Eucharistic Holy Hour. Set this day apart to acknowledge the majesty of God and our need for God. Let it be a landmark in your life. God has been waiting for you!

INAUGURATION AND BLESSING OF THE NEW PARISH PASTORAL COUNCIL

Sunday, June 9th at the 9:00 a.m. Mass

Re-forming a Pastoral Council has been an important parish goal. In fact, it has been a priority for more than a year. A Pastoral Council is advisory to the pastor. It is an invaluable resource. It provides the pastor "with the wisdom of the laity for the good of the parish." Since February of 2012, parishioners have responded to a "call" to serve on a new Pastoral Council. That "call" came from the pastor, but it was **not** an appointment. Only after prayerful discernment and preparation would each decide to serve or not to serve. For that reason, their identities were not disclosed until now.

Since July 16, 2012, in nine sessions, the formation of prospective council members has carefully followed Archdiocesan guidelines. In September of 2012, three members attended a "Train the Trainers" Pastoral Council Orientation program. Each returned with useful information to share. The ongoing preparation of the group was further enhanced by the 2013 Archdiocesan Parish Leadership Day. Seven members participated in 20 workshops on that day. That experience brought into clearer focus the essentials covered in formation meetings - working with Commissions & committees, arriving at consensus, and developing skills to carry out the parish's spiritual mission. I am very proud of how the group has grown. I am confident in their ability to share responsibility.

The Catholic **Book of Blessings** tells us

Because of the importance of their role it is appropriate that members of the council receive God's blessing as they begin their term of office.

Therefore, at the 9:00 a.m. Mass next Sunday (June 9), our new Pastoral Council members will be introduced formally and receive a special blessing. Their pictures and short biographies will be in the June 9 Sunday Bulletin. Please extend your greetings and good wishes to them after Mass.

Religious Education



Registration for the 2013-2014 Religious Education Program for Kindergarten through Confirmation Year II has begun! Families currently in the RE Program should register by June 15. After that date you are still welcome, but there will be a \$25 late fee. New families are asked to call the RE Office to come in and fill out registration forms. You will also need to bring a copy of each child's baptismal certificate if they were not baptized here at St. Isaac Jogues.

Kindergarten classes meet on Sundays, 10:30-11:30 a.m. and Grs. 1 – Confirmation Year II meet on Mondays, 6:45-8:00 p.m. Families are strongly encouraged to have their children come each year as no one year suffices in providing what is important for a strong faith foundation. Students preparing for sacraments must attend for the two immediate years prior to receiving each sacrament. If families have children with special needs or who have not received their sacraments, we would be happy to meet with you and discuss options. There is tuition and book & sacrament fees (as applicable). Families with financial concerns are encouraged to talk with us as **no child is denied religious education because of finances.** All are welcome!

JUNE 9 CHICAGO-WIDE ECUMENICAL SUNDAY



FIRST FRIDAY





Invoke

Just before the priest pronounces the words of consecration over the bread and wine, he invokes the transforming power of the Holy Spirit to come upon the gifts. "Make holy, therefore, these gifts, we pray, by sending down your Spirit upon them like the dewfall."

This invocation envisions the Spirit transforming the gifts of bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Christ. At the same time, because we bring ourselves to Mass to give ourselves over to the Lord in our self-gift, the prayer also invokes the Holy Spirit to come upon us and transform us as well into the Body of Christ.

The double invocation of the Holy Spirit on bread and wine and on us and the double transformation of both into the Body of Christ show us the power of God at work in our worship. Far from a common gathering of like-minded people or friends, our celebration of Mass is an extraordinary experience. Here we know and taste the transforming power of God's Holy Spirit—invoked on the gifts of bread and wine and the gift of ourselves.



TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

We owe today's beautiful feast to a valiant woman who suffered a great deal to establish a feast out of her love for the Eucharist. Juliana was a nun in Belgium in the thirteenth century. She served in a hospital for lepers. She became convinced through her prayer that the liturgical year was incomplete because it had no feast for the Eucharist. Her efforts were not welcome, and a supervising priest sought to punish her for promoting a feast that "nobody wanted." He even had her accused of financial mismanagement and banished her from her convent.

Shortly after she was exiled, the bishop approved the feast. It quickly spread through Europe. In those days, people very seldom received Holy Communion, and so the processions through the streets with the eucharistic bread not only led to an awareness of Christ's hunger to be with us, but prepared the way for a deeper desire to receive Christ's Body and Blood in more frequent Communion. The feast grew rapidly, but Juliana disappeared into poverty and a hidden life. She ended her days as an " anchoress," a woman living in seclusion in a room attached to a parish church. Imagine her delight at seeing us gathered at the table of the Lord on this day, aware of Christ's presence in our midst, sharing fully in Christ's Body and Blood. Our celebration today invests her struggle and sorrows with dignity and meaning.




