## CATHOLIC TRADITIONS, LOST AND FOUND

*The Corpus Christi Procession*



The Eucharistic Procession on the Solemnity of Corpus Christi has been a cherished part of Catholic worship since the 13th Century. I have always thought it odd that the parishes of my childhood and early adult years never offered a Eucharistic Procession on the festival that celebrates the Real Presence. After Vatican II, when Eucharistic Adoration seemed to be on the wane, I was told “If you want that sort of thing, go to an ethnic parish!” That attitude gave one the impression that public devotion “on parade” was triumphalistic and even “un American.” Of course that was nonsense! I have mentioned, more than once, that it was a real irony that the first Corpus Christi procession I ever experienced was at an Episcopal Church in 1965. While it was truly beautiful, with candlelight, clouds of incense, and marvelous hymns, I began to question whether the church I was in was an Anglican Church. From my study of the Reformation, I knew that Archbishop Cranmer’s **Book of Common Prayer** contained “39 Articles of Religion.” Article 28 prescribes:

*The Sacrament of the Lord’s Supper was not by Christ’s ordinance reserved, carried about, lifted up or worshipped.*

This offered another irony. It was breaking Cranmer’s “rules.” Through the centuries many Anglicans have had scant regard for the “39 Articles.” While still an Anglican, Blessed John Henry Newman referred to them as “Forty lashes save one”! The Church of England’s history displays some be-guiling incongruities. There was a theological “tug of war” that often produces opposing attitudes toward belief and practice.

The emphasis shifts back and forth from Catholic to Protestant. Inevitably, after Roundheads and Cavaliers, the Restoration of the Stuarts and the ascendancy of the Hanoverian kings, the Anglican Church could be described as “High, Low, or Broad.” Theology and styles of worship were greatly influenced by whether one stressed authority, the Bible, or liberal philosophies. The old, and humorous party breakdown was “High and crazy, Low and lazy, Broad and hazy.” The Oxford Movement in the 19th Century and later the Anglo-Catholic Revival viewed the Anglican Church as essentially “Catholic.” Newman was an important part of the Oxford Movement and identified the Church of England as the “**Via Media.**” While Newman would become a Roman Catholic, other Anglicans remained to celebrate the Liturgy in a “Catholic manner” and restore the devotional and sacramental life to their Church. Anglo-Catholicism has been a magnificent example of “**Catholic Tradition, Lost and Found.**”

My experience of Corpus Christi 50 years ago led me to value my own Catholic traditions. I am indebted to “High Church” Anglicans for their holy zeal in preserving the beauty of Catholic worship. I am grateful for their example and a final irony -- Anglo-Catholicism has made me more “Roman.”

What a glorious thing it is to celebrate Corpus Christi as a Catholic! Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI offers this insight into the procession:

*“Once a year it gives demonstrative expression to the triumphal joy in Christ’s victory, as we accompany the Victor on His triumphal procession through the streets.”*

Weather permitting, St. Isaac Jogues Parish will have an outdoor procession and stational Benediction this weekend. Come, celebrate a great Catholic tradition and affirm your essential Faith in the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist!

## TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

It has been said that the Church breathes with two lungs, East and West. Some of our family treasures are in the East, and it is interesting to consider how liturgical families developed around differing customs. Centuries before Christ, after the young girl was given to her husband by her father, the spouses were crowned. Christians retained that custom, keeping the wedding in the home, and sometimes inviting a visiting priest or bishop to put the crowns on their heads. By the fourth century, the crowns were seen not as royal crowns, but as the crowns of victory worn by martyrs. The crowns have nothing to do with being "king and queen for a day," but rather speak of the sacrifice of love poured out fully. There are no vows exchanged at all, but the crowning is followed by a joyful dance by the priest and couple around the Gospel book. Unlike Roman law, which saw the wedding rites as optional, Eastern practice did not recognize a marriage that had not been blessed.






